CENTRAL COMMITTEE VOTES TO INTENSIFY RELIEF WORK.

Report \$10,600,000 Raised Since the War.

URGE JDC TO SEVER RELATIONS WITH "YIDGESCOM".

NEW YORK, Jan. 8, (Jewish Correspondence Bureau) Delegates from all parts of the country meeting Sunday in a conference of the Central Relief Committee at the Central Jewish Institute, 125 E. 85th Street to discuss plans for continued relief to Jewish war sufferers heard from Leon Kamaiky, general Chairman of the Committee, that this body has collected \$10,600,000 which has been distributed in Europe and Palestine.

Rabbi Meyer Berlin, who presided, suggested that residents of this country form "Landemanschaft" groups to relieve the distress of Jews in the areas from which they came.

\* Some of the speakers charged that the Soviet Government placed obstacles in the way of the Central Committee's work. The conference voted to organize a permanent committee of 100 members to carry on the work of reconstruction in Europe. It was also voted to send representatives to Russia to investigate the cause of friction between officials and the relief workers and to report on conditions generally. Other resolutions adopted call for the raising of a \$600,000 fund for educational work in Eastern Europe.

A resolution recommending that the Joint Distribution Committee sever all relations with the "Yidgescom" in Russia was adopted, and handed to a Committee with full power to act as it sees fit.

DR. EMIL G. HIRSCH DIES IN CHICAGO.

CHICAGO, Jan. 8, (Jewish Correspondence Bureau) Dr. Emil G. Hirsch, noted Jewish scholar, educator and rabbi, and pastor of Sinai Congregation here since 1880, died today at the age of 71. Dr. Hirsch became a rabbi in 1877, and in 1880 came to the Chicago Congregation where he had preached ever since. He was also a professor of rabbinical literature and philosophy at the University of Chicago since 1892.

**SAYS LEAGUE MUST FIND REFUGE FOR JEWS.**

BERLIN, Jan. 7, (Jewish Telegraphic Agency) The political and economic conditions in Eastern Europe are such as to compel East-European Jews to immigrate to Germany, and it is impossible to prevent this immigration, Minister of the Interior Severing of Prussia declared in a memorandum he submitted to the German Minister of Foreign Affairs concerning East-European migration. Herr Severing declares the Jewish question has assumed international proportions, a fact which has been confirmed in the Palestine Mandate. The League of Nations must accordingly regulate this question, and find new roads if this migration is to be diverted from Central Europe.

**IF POGROMMED, JEWS MUST PAY DAMAGES.**

BERLIN, Jan. 7, (Jewish Telegraphic Agency) In renting an apartment or house in Munich, Jews are required to sign an agreement that in the event of a pogrom they will make good all damage to property occupied by them, says a Munich report.

Guarantees required of Jewish tenants cover the furniture and fixtures in the house they lease. No provision is made for recovery of damage to the property of the Jewish tenants in case of pogroms.

**ROUMANIAN STUDENTS THREATEN GENERAL STRIKE.**

BUCHAREST, Jan. 6, (Jewish Telegraphic Agency) Representatives of the anti-Semitic sections of the student body throughout Roumania have handed the Minister of Education Angheliescu an ultimatum threatening a general walkout in the universities in the event the Government fails to immediately enforce the percentage norm against Jewish students.

A secret circular urging open warfare against Labor and Jews, distributed broadcast by the Roumanian Fascisti, is published by the AURORA, one of the liberal Bucharest dailies. Two things particularly urged in this circular are:

That all arrivals in Roumania since the year 1916 be immediately expelled from the country; that native Roumanians seize all industry and commerce, a large proportion of which is alleged to be in the hands of Jews.

**THOUSANDS RUSSIAN JEWS IN RIGA ON WAY TO U.S.**

RIGA, Jan. 6, (Jewish Correspondence Bureau) Several thousand of Jewish emigrants from Russia and the Ukraine are now gathered in Riga awaiting passage to America, permission to leave Russia having been obtained for them by the steamship companies from the Soviet Government.

**HARDEN SCORES HIS ASSASSINS' TRIAL.**

BERLIN, Jan. 5, (Jewish Correspondence Bureau) Before an audience which overflowed one of the largest theatres here, Max Harden delivered an address concerning the trial of his would-be assassins. Herr Harden scored the procedure and denounced the trial as a mockery of German Justice. He often referred to the Court as anti-Semitic, remarking ironically that it was not surprising perhaps that the judge, himself a baptized Jew, should have imitated "impartiality" to the extent of provoking the unjust verdict.

**RUSSIAN JEWS TAKE TO AGRICULTURE.**

CHARKOV, Jan. 5, (Jewish Correspondence Bureau) An appreciable "back to the Land" movement is to be noticed among Jews in the small towns in the provinces of Odessa, Kiev and Podolia, M. Soloveitchick, a former agricultural expert of the "ICA" told your correspondent.

This movement is handicapped, however, because no credits are available, and the Jews are prevented from forming cooperatives. While the Soviets are willing to grant land, no agricultural Committee appears to be ready or able to furnish credits for machinery and live stock.

It is estimated that the results of the Autumn sowing already finished, plus the results of the Spring sowing if completed, would make all Jewish colonies in the Ukraine independent for years to come.

**APPROVES NARUTOWICZ MURDER; ARRESTED.**

WARSAW, Jan. 7, (Jewish Telegraphic Agency) The MYSL NARODOWA has been closed, and Adolf Nowaczynski arrested, for an article the latter wrote approving the assassination of President Narutowicz.

Nowaczynski is a baptised Jew, and the paper in which he published his article is the weekly publication of the "Endek", or "National Democratic Party".

Agitation urging complete economic boycott of the Jews is assuming alarming proportions, the Rozwoj party having established a special office from which to conduct the propaganda.

Reports from Bialystock state the Jews are apprehensive of disorders in consequence of the boycott agitation.

**JUDGE SULZBERGER TO DISCUSS ANCIENT JEWISH LABOR PROBLEMS.**

PHILADELPHIA, (Jewish Correspondence Bureau) An interesting event in Jewish scholarly circles will be the presentation of four lectures prepared by Judge Sulzberger on "The Status of Labor in Ancient Israel" before the Dropsie College.

Judge Sulzberger has been for quite a number of years engaged in researches into the political and legal institutions of ancient Israel. These studies have resulted in such publications as "The Am Ha-Aretz: The Ancient Hebrew Parliament", "The policy of the Ancient Hebrews", and "The Ancient Hebrew Law of Homicide".

The present lectures have to do with labor problem as it presented itself in Biblical times.

The lectures will be presented by Dr. Solomon Solis Cohen at the Woppsie College on Sunday, Jan. 14, Tuesday, Jan. 16, Tuesday, Jan. 23, and Sunday, Feb. 4, 1923, at 8.30 PM.

#### NANSEN TO COOPERATE WITH RUSSIAN AND UKRAINE RED CROSS.

PARIS, (Jewish Correspondence Bureau) A Committee for Health and Medical Work in Russia and the Ukraine has just been constituted by the Nansen Organization, the Russian Red Cross, the Ukrainian Red Cross and the Russian Commissariat for Public Health. The representative in Russia of the Epidemics Commission of the League of Nations is collaborating with this committee.

The Committee has just purchased 50 clinics, each sufficient to deal with a thousand cases for three months, and has despatched these clinics into the regions affected by famine and by epidemics.

The Committee has ordered 50 additional clinics, together with laboratory instruments and microscopes.

An effort is being made from Geneva to enlist public sympathy in order that help may be brought to the medical institutions which are at present struggling against epidemics.

#### HOBOKEN POLITICIAN RAISES "FORD FOR PRESIDENT" CRY.

DETROIT, Jan. 8, (Jewish Correspondence Bureau) A writer in the Detroit Free Press declares that a party to be known as the "Golden Rule Party" with Henry Ford as chieftan is to be planted in the living rooms of the White House at Washington on March 4, 1925. Behind Henry Ford, the Free Press writer says, is the entire town of Hoboken N.J. The writer adds "as goes Hoboken politically, so goes the nation, as has been so often said".

The occasion for the article is the visit to Detroit of George Russell, Hoboken politician. The aim of the Ford boosters is to lable the automobile manufacturer and whoever chosen as his running mate for the Vice Presidency as the "Golden Rule Twins".
