SAY LATVIA WOULD VIOLATE MINORITY PACT.

GENEVA, Jan. 9, (Jewish Telegraphic Agency) The Latvian Government has filed a statement for the consideration of the Council of the League of Nations, setting forth reasons for its failure to sign the declaration guaranteeing the rights of minority nationalities. Several of the paragraphs of this declaration are said to be contradictory to the Latvian constitution.

A counter memorandum disclosing the real reason for Latvia's attitude has been presented by the Committee of Jewish Delegations of Paris. The reason, the Committee asserts, is Latvia's disinclination to honor the minority pact.

J.D.C. SPENT \$5,271,000 IN 1922, EXCLUSIVE OF RUSSIA.

VIENNA, Jan. 9, (Jewish Telegraphic Agency) The Joint Distribution Committee of America has expended \$5,271,000 during 1922 in European countries, exclusive of Russia, the Central Office of the Committee's European Executive Committee announces. A total of \$1,025,000 was spent for reconstruction in various parts of Europe, \$704,000 in behalf of Jewish refugees, \$575,000 for medical aid and supplies, \$552,000 for children's aid, and \$125,000 for educational work.

ROUMANIA MOVES TO SUPPRESS RIOTS.

BUCHAREST, Jan. 9, (Jewish Telegraphic Agency) The police prefects and the commanders of the gendarmerie have been instructed to sternly suppress all riots, and to arrest the gang leaders, regardless of person or position, in order to make an end to the continued violations against Jews, Minister of Interior Vaitoiano today informed Parliament.

It is learned all leaders of the recent riots at Barlad, Moldavia, are already in prison awaiting trial.

GOVERNOR OF JERUSALEM COMING HERE.

JERUSALEM, Jan. 9, (Jewish Telegraphic Agency) General Ronald Storrs, Governor of Jerusalem since the British occupation of Palestine will visit the United States after spending a few weeks in England, whither he is proceeding on a holiday.

Governor Storrs, often referred to as the modern Pontius Pilate, is founder and Chairman of the pro-Jerusalem Society, a non-sectarian body of leading citizens interested in preserving and enhancing the beauty of the Holy City.

He will endeavor to interest Americans in this Society.

JEWS 25% OF POLISH UNIVERSITY STUDENT BODY.

WARSAW, Jan. 9, (Jewish Telegraphic Agency) Of the 33,752 students in all Polish Universities and Colleges, 8,426 or 25% are Jews, according to official figures just made public.

JEWS 85% OF POLISH EMIGRANTS.

WARSAW, Jan. 9, (Jewish Telegraphic Agency) Jews constituted an overwhelming majority of the emigrants from Poland in the year 1922, 86,000 Jews having left Poland out of a total of 109,000 persons.

ZIONISTS ACCLAIM CONGRESSMAN FISH.

NEW YORK, Jan. 9, (Jewish Correspondence Bureau) A few hundred active Zionists gathered at the Vienna Monday evening, to pay tribute to Representative Hamilton Fish Jr., of New York, author of the Zionist resolution which he successfully sponsored, passing the House June 30, 1922.

The dinner was arranged by the National Executive Committee of the Zionist Organization. Speeches were delivered by Representative La Guardia, Mrs. Richard Gottheil, Representative Chas. G. Bond, Hon. Francis M. Hugo, former Secretary of the State of New York, Judge Wm. Lewis of Philadelphia, Dr. Joseph Silverman, Abraham Goldberg of the Zionist Administration and Bernard A. Rosenblatt, member of the Palestine Zionist Executive. Louis Lipsky, Chairman of the National Executive Committee presided. There were greetings from Professor Richard Gottheil, Dr. Stephen S. Wise and Louis Wiley, Manager of the New York Times. Other guests included Representative Nathan D. Pearlman, Congressman Ansorge, Congressman Lester D. Volk, Hon. Albert D. Rossdale, Congressman Isaac Siegel and Abraham S. Schomer, of the Order Sons of Zion.

The conviction that American Jews would rally to the support of the Holy Land which would be a factor for peace in the Near East was voiced by Congressman Fish in an address which was very warmly received.
