EINSTEIN TO LECTURE ON RELATIVITY IN JERUSALEM.

JERUSALEM, Feb. 6, (Jewish Telegraphic Agency) Professor Albert Einstein will lecture on the theory of relativity before a mixed audience here tomorrow (Wednesday). The Professor and his wife are staying at the Government House as Sir Herbert Samuel's guests.

The author of the theory of relativity, who is interested in the projected Hebrew University of Jerusalem, was welcomed Monday at a joint meeting of the Zionist Executive and National Council of Palestine Jews. Replying to the greetings delivered by Mr. Ussishkin and David Yellin, who expressed the hope the Professor would settle in Palestine to labor in the interests of science and the Jewish cause, Professor Einstein voiced his admiration of the Jewish work done in Palestine. He was convinced, he said, only Zionism "can heal the sick Jewish soul". On his return to Europe, he declared, he would bring this message to the whole Jewish world.

Professor Einstein will visit Tel-Aviv, the Jewish municipality near Jaffa, Thursday.

GERMAN COLONISTS PROSPERING IN PALESTINE

BERLIN, Feb. 5 (Jewish Correspondence Bureau) The German colonists in Palestine are gradually being restored to the economic position they held at the outbreak of the war, it is reported. Although many have abandoned agriculture and vine-culture because it pays less, the Germans find dairying profitable and are doing a great deal to develop it. These colonists for the main part are members or descendants of members of the Templars who had settled in and around Haifa some forty years ago.

ORDERED TO SALUTE OFFICERS.

LEMBERG, Feb. 6, (Jewish Correspondence Bureau) the Military Commander of the town of Chodcov, has issued an order that all Jews in the town must salute officers when they meet them in the streets. A deputation of local Jews has interviewed General Jendrzejewski to ask him to withdraw this order.

FAMINE, COLD, UNEMPLOYMENT, COMPLETE PICTURE OF UKRAINE MISERY.

MOSCOW, Feb. 5, (Jewish Telegraphic Agency) Two million children are reported in advices from Charkov to be facing the danger of famine. The situation while universally bad, is particularly acute in the sixteen southern "Ouyezds" or provinces. Reports are also to the effect that 300,000 children are receiving aid in various forms. Of these 80,000 are cared for in homes. It is estimated that 40,000 children are living in railway stations, sleeping on the streets and occupying ruins of houses. The number of starving in the province and city of Cherson has increased to 127,000 within the last few weeks. Add to the immediate danger of starvation the poor prospects for the future, and the picture of Ukraine misery is complete.

Only 10% of land available for agriculture had been planted, and accordingly the crops even if successful cannot yield more than 10% of the population's needs. Unemployment is on the increase and the present winter is a terribly severe one.

NEW YORK LAWYERS URGE ROSEN BERG FOR FEDERAL JUDGE.

WASHINGTON, Feb. 5, (Jewish Telegraphic Agency) Prominent members of the New York Bar are behind the request to President Harding to appoint James N. Rosenberg to fill the vacated Federal Judgeship in the U.S. District Court for the Seventh District of New York. This District comprises the Borough of Manhattan, where Mr. Rosenberg lives and is known for his public-spirited activities, principally in behalf of the Jewish War sufferers.

REPORT RABBI SILVER RESIGNED FROM "P.D.L."

CLEVELAND, Feb. 5, (Jewish Correspondence Bureau) Rabbi Abba Hillel Silver declines to confirm or deny the report of his resignation as Chairman of the Palestine Development League. He admits, however, of differences of opinion between himself and other officials of the League with regard to organization questions and methods, because of his insistence on broadening the scope of the Palestine work fostered by the Brandeis-Mack group.

Rabbi Silver's dissatisfaction is said to date back to the Pittsburgh conference when he opposed leaving the Zionist Organization, demanding that the former Administration leaders remain in the ranks of the Zionist Organization until they become the majority again. Rabbi Silver states that he is still adhering to his view.

Rabbi Silver declined the renomination as Chairman of the Palestine Development League, in a letter he addressed to the officers at the last annual meeting, Mr. Jacob deHaas, Secretary, stated to the Jewish Correspondence Bureau.

GOD TRIED AND FOUND GUILTY.

BERLIN, Feb. 5, (Jewish Telegraphic Agency) Despatches from Moscow say that at the Garrison Club on January 27 a mock trial took place in which God figured as the accused. The trial was witnessed by 3,000 Red Army officers and soldiers, Leon Trotzky and Secretary Lunatsharsky participating.

Evidence was presented for and against God, as a counter-revolutionary power, and speeches delivered by the "defense" and the "prosecution". A verdict of "guilty" was announced at the end of the proceedings.

PROTEST REJECTION OF JEWISH VOLUNTEER.

LODZ, Feb. 5, (Jewish Telegraphic Agency) Military circles here are excited over the rejection of Wolf Gruenstein who volunteered as a private in the Polish army. The authorities responsible for this will be taken to task, it is learned.

JEWS MUST SUPPLY CORPSES.

CRACOW, Feb. 5, (Jewish Correspondence Bureau) In consequence of the students' threat that Jews will be barred from classes unless arrangements are made for the delivery of Jewish corpses for dissection, the Jewish authorities have arranged to supply one Jewish corpse for every ten, the first corpse to be delivered February 10.

PLAN TO STAY UKRAINE EXPULSION.

WARSAW, Feb. 5, (Jewish Telegraphic Agency) Prolongation is contemplated until September 1 of the residence of Jewish refugees from Russia and the Ukraine holding serial numbers entitling them to American visas. All others are doomed to be expelled April 15, it is learned.

The authorities are already proceeding with the registration of "aliens", the term being applied also to Jews who have lived here for decades.

APPEAL TO STUDENTS TO HALT JEW-BAITING.

HAGUE, (Jewish Telegraphic Agency) A memorandum has been received by the officers of the International Students' Union in session here, protesting against the percentage norm as applied to Jewish admissions in universities, and deploring the anti-Jewish agitation throughout Eastern and Central Europe in which students are taking an active part. The memorandum comes from the World Union of Zionist Students' Societies.
