SAYS "BOLSHEVIK GOLD" BEHIND GERMAN ANTISEMITISM.

BERLIN, Feb. 8, (Jewish Telegraphic Agency) The astounding assertion that "Bolshevik gold" has been flowing freely into the coffers of the leaders of the anti-Semitic movement in Germany, is made by Arnold Rechberg, a student of political affairs with pronounced leaning toward the Right. Herr Rechberg says that he has abundant proof in support of his assertion, although he is precluded from giving its source.

Other theories as to the source of nationalist and reactionary support are not wanting. Thus the POST of Munich and the BERLINER TAGESBLATT assert they believe the French are financing the National Socialist movement. They say this has been "proven". Further "evidence" is supplied by the Munich correspondent of the TAGESBLATT, who reports the French Ambassador confirmed in a private conversation, that he sympathized with the aims of the nationalists.

It is reported here that one of the leaders of Hitler's storm troops has been arrested. A large sum of money in American dollars and French francs is said to have been found on his person. It is declared he received the money from a French source.

KEMAL WOULD EMBRACE FAITHFUL JEWS.

CONSTANTINOPLE, Feb. 8, (Jewish Correspondence Bureau) Kemal Pasha, Turkish Nationalist leader, declared at a dinner tendered him by the Jews of Kebakli that as long as the Jews remain faithful to the New Turkey, they will always have a "place in the nation's bosom".

The Angora leader was presented with a pair of white doves.

TO ABOLISH BLUE SUNDAY LAW IN POLAND.

WARSAW, Feb. 6, (Jewish Telegraphic Agency) The abolition of compulsory Sunday rest is contemplated by the Ministry of Labor, it is learned, the plan being to leave only a few Catholic holidays as legal days of rest to be observed by all.

ARRESTS FOLLOW ROUMANIAN KING'S ORDER TO SUPPRESS VIOLENCE.

BUCHAREST, Feb. 7, (Jewish Telegraphic Agency) The King has directed the authorities to suppress the actions of the anti-Semitic student body, following the receipt of petitions presented to him by Jewish leaders, and a stormy debate in the Senate. The Council of Ministers, accordingly, has caused the arrest of 14 ring leaders including the Chairmen of student societies of the philosophic and legal departments. "Coventual", a rabid students' publication, has been suppressed.

Discussion of the Jewish questions was continued in the Chamber Tuesday, Deputies Stern, Lupu and Machalack demanding actual protection for the Jewish citizens, declaring the Government's "phrases" had failed to restore the Jews' sense of security. A number of Deputies, among them such as are known to be more or less liberal, defended the disturbances on the ground that part of the blame rested with the Jews who, they alleged, overrun the universities, thus provoking the nativists.

The Union of Roumanian Jews has issued a proclamation to the leaders of different parties, threatening to withdraw from the parties unless their leaders joined in the protest against the attacks on the Jews. The party leaders are also called upon to join in the petition to the King and to the ecclesiastical authorities to calm the Christian population.

ASKED TO EXPLAIN ATTACKS ON JEWS.

Senator Sanielvici has submitted a number of questions to the Government with reference to the recent wave of anti-Jewish violence sweeping over the country. The Senator's questions were directed primarily to the Ministers of Interior and Public Instruction.

The first question to be put was whether the Government had any knowledge that "excesses" had taken place throughout the country; if so why no steps were taken looking to their prevention. The Senator asked also why the police did nothing to defend the Jewish students and what measures the Government was taking against these disturbances lasting several months and still continuing. The Government has not yet replied.

A meeting to protest the frequent attacks on Jews called for February 4 was prohibited by the local authorities. The Jews met in the Great Synagogue, where it was decided to petition the King for an audience in order to bring to his attention the complaints against the violence. Simultaneously Jewish organizations are addressing a memorandum to Parliament.

No abatement of the anti-Semitic students' activities is to be noticed. New and more sweeping demands have been presented by them asking not only for the rigid enforcement of the percentage norm, and that Jewish students dissect Jewish corpses exclusively, but also for the introduction of restrictions in the naturalization law, as far as Jews are concerned, and prohibiting the settlement of foreign Jews on Roumanian soil.

NEXT ZIONIST CONGRESS IN DANZIG.

DANZIG, Feb. 7, (Jewish Correspondence Bureau) Nahum Sokolow of the Zionist Executive stopping here on the way to Warsaw, where he has gone to help in the Keren Hayesod campaign, told the J.C.B. that he has visited the Schuetzenhaus, which he found eminently suited for the next Zionist Congress, and that it will undoubtedly be held there.

Mr. Sokolow was cordially received here at a dinner following his reception at the railway station. One million Polish marks were collected for the Keren Hayesod. It was decided also to inscribe Mr. Sokolow's name in the Golden Book of the Jewish National Fund.

GHALUZIM TRAVEL TROUGH ROUMANIA.

LONDON, Feb. 8, (Jewish Correspondence Bureau) The Immigration Department of the Zionist Organization announces that it has concluded an agreement with the Roumanian Government whereby the bulk of the Jewish immigration to Palestine will be directed through Roumania. Use of the Galatz port will result in considerable reduction in the cost of travel, it is stated. Galatz has always been a favorite with Palestine travelers, most of the "Bilu" in 1880 having passed through that port on their way from Russia to Palestine.

"BUND" TO FIGHT "ZIONISM OF ALL SHADES".

BUCHAREST, Feb. 7, (Jewish Telegraphic Agency) The organization of an all-Roumanian Bund took place here recently, the program including the "struggle for full national and social emancipation of the Jewish working masses and unequivocal resistance to Zionism of all shades."

SOVIETS WOULD KEEP CHILDREN IN RUSSIA.

LONDON, Feb. 7, (Jewish Telegraphic Agency) Returning from the Ukraine, where he spent several months as the representative of the Federation of Ukrainian Jews in London, Mr. Ochberg confirms previous reports that the value of food parcels purchased through the ARA is in some places not above \$5. Mr. Ochberg advises relatives and friends to send money and clothing, particularly the latter. Because the Soviets hope children remaining in Russia will grow up as supporters of Communism, Mr. Ochberg states the authorities refused to allow him to transport a number of Jewish orphans to South Africa.

SAYS ABRAHAM WAS A LETT; ALSO LOT.

RIGA, Feb. 6, (Jewish Correspondence Bureau) The patriarch Abraham was really a Lett, and so was Lot, according to Pastor Steik, who lectured here yesterday on the origin of the Latvian nation.
