THOUSANDS OF CHILDREN ON THE MARCH FOR FOOD.

MOSCOW, Feb. 27, (Jewish Telegraphic Agency) Death by the slow but tortuous hand of starvation is the prospect that lurks before tens of thousands of children of Crimea. It is estimated that no less than 150,000 of these children will be casualties of grim hunger unless relief from outside sources is provided. Twenty-five thousand of these children, in addition to being unable to appease the pangs of hunger are without homes.

A great many of them are orphans. Long processions of the unhappy and wan children are trudging northwards in hope of finding food somewhere. At night the hungry children make the fields and streets their bed.

SOVIET UNIVERSITY TO GIVE JEWISH COURSES.

MOSCOW, Feb. 27, (Jewish Telegraphic Agency) Courses in various branches of Jewish lore will be given at the Central Moscow state university. A faculty to provide instruction in the Yiddish language, literature and history is now being organized.

SAYS SOLOMON KNEW ABOUT AIRPLANES.

LONDON, Feb. 27, (Jewish Telegraphic Agency) The earliest historical reference to aeroplanes appears in an ancient manuscript dealing with King Solomon and the Queen of Sheba, according to Colonel Lockwood Marsh, Secretary of the Royal Aeronautical Society. "King Solomon gave the Queen of Sheba a vessel wherein one could traverse the air (or wind), which Solomon had made by the wisdom that God had given unto him", the manuscript declares.

The manuscript from which the reference to Solomon's airship is taken is called "The Glory of the Kings". Referring to a journey over the Red Sea, the document declares: "each was raised over the Red Sea traveling like an eagle when his body glideth over the wind."

TO WITHDRAW INDIAN UNITS FROM PALESTINE.

LONDON, Feb. 27, (Jewish Telegraphic Agency) Arrangements are being made for the withdrawal in the immediate future of one or two Indian infantry batallions now stationed in Palestine. The Indian Cavalry regiment is also being reduced in strength.

These moves are part of a general plan now being considered by the British government for a comprehensive paring down of the British forces in Palestine. A statement to this effect was made by Premier Bonar Law today in response to a proposal by a member of the House of Commons that the entire British garrison in Palestine be withdrawn in the interests of economy.

The suggestion that Britain evacuate its entire forces from Palestine is impractical, the Premier declared.

DROP NUMERUS CLAUSUS FIGHT IN ROUMANIA.

BUCHAREST, Feb. 27, (Jewish Telegraphic Agency) The fight by the anti-Semitic group of Roumanian University students for the "numerus clausus" or the limitation of Jewish students has been abandoned. The students are now offering to make peace with the government on the Jewish issue. They are persisting in their demand, however, that the leaders of the recent anti-Jewish outbreaks be released.

ENGLISH ANTI-SEMITE IMPRISONED FOR EXTORTION.

BERLIN, Feb. 27, (Jewish Telegraphic Agency) According to a London dispatch, Henry Beamisch, the Englishman who has appeared with Adolph Hitler, leader of the Bavarian Fascisti, at numerous demonstrations has been sentenced by a London court to several years imprisonment for extortion. Some time ago, it was charged, Beamisch was heavily subsidized by Hitler to organize an English anti-Semitic party.

SAMUEL TO VISIT ENGLAND.

LONDON, Feb. 27, (Jewish Telegraphic Agency) Sir Herbert Samuel, High Commissioner of Palestine is expected to visit here in June. The visit will be purely a social one, it is said.

Announcement has also been made here that Governor Stirling of Jaffa has resigned to accept the post of advisor to the Albanian government.

THON CALLED TO WARSAW RABBINICAL POST.

WARSAW, Feb. 27, (Jewish Telegraphic Agency) Senator Joshua Thon has been invited to occupy the rabbinical post vacated by the death of Dr. S. Poznanski.

ANTI-SEMITES URGE EXPULSION OF JEWS FROM POLAND.

WARSAW, Feb. 27, (Jewish Telegraphic Agency) A demand that Jews be expelled from Poland was made at an anti-Semitic rally here addressed by Dmowski, leader of the Rozwoj. The Warsaw "Gazeta Warszawska" in a recent issue urged the extension of the "numerus clausus" or limitation of Jewish students to high schools as well as universities.

The anti-Semites are also preparing to introduce a measure for a "percentage norm" for Jews in commerce and industry as well, Deputy Wigadski declared in an address to Jewish merchants of Vilna.

BOMB SENT TO JEWISH EDITOR AND LIBERAL LEADER.

BUDAPEST, Feb. 27, (Jewish Telegraphic Agency) A bomb plot which had for its objective the killing of the liberal Hungarian leader Rassay, and the Jewish editor-in-chief of the liberal paper "Azest" was foiled here by the arousing of the suspicions of two men.

Both received packages, brought by a carrier, but growing suspicious, they called in experts who ascertained the parcels were "loaded".

Deputy Fabian in the Hungarian Assembly charged the ultra-nationalist group with responsibility for the plot.

BRITISH ENGINEER PREPARES REPORT ON JAFFA HARBOR.

JERUSALEM, Feb. 27, (Jewish Telegraphic Agency) The British engineering expert, Palmer, is now engaged in preparing a report on the Jaffa harbor question, and Britain stands ready to build the harbor, if the Jaffa business men procure the necessary capital.

This was announced today by Colonel Solomon, Director of the Department of Commerce and Industry of the Palestinian government. Colonel Solomon, after a service with this bureau in Palestine of three years, has forwarded his resignation and will leave Palestine in the near future.

ARAB VOTE BOYCOTT FAILS IN THREE CITIES.

JERUSALEM Feb. 27, (Jewish Telegraphic Agency) The Arabs boycotted the elections for the Legislative Council in Jerusalem, Jaffa, Haifa, Tulkeram, Nablus, Beisan and Semak, but participated in the voting in Beer Sheba Gaza and Bethlehem, according to an announcement by the Executive Committee of the Moslem-Christian Union.

ANTI-SEMITES RAVAGE JEWISH GRAVES.

BERLIN, Feb. 26, (Jewish Telegraphic Agency) Even the dead are not permitted their rest by anti-Semites. A group of vandals invaded the Jewish cemetery at Schneemann and demolished the headstones over 54 graves. None of the marauding party has been identified.
