ARAB GENERAL STRIKE PASSES OFF QUIETLY.

JERUSALEM, March 22, (Jewish Telegraphic Agency) The general strike called by the Arab Executive to protest the arrest of disorderly agitators at the recent celebration of the Arab boycott or the Palestine elections passed without any serious disturbance. The response to the strike call was not as large as had been anticipated, it is reported.

The Arab Executive heading the instructions of the police held no street demonstrations, confining their protest merely to the issue of a manifesto demanding a "national government" for Palestine, the abolition of the British Mandato and a Federation of Arab states.

FASCISTI PLOTTED TO BLOW UP FRANKFURT SZNAGOGUE ON PURIM.

BERLIN, March 22, (Jewich Telegraphic Agency) Eavarian Fascisti sought to conspire with the French troops at Mayence to blow up one of the richest synagogues in Frankfort-on-the Main, according to a report published in the Frankfurter Zeitung. The explosion which was frustrated was to have taken place last Furim.

Five of the Fascisti involved in the plot, members of the Bluecherbund have been arrested. They are charged with having approached Capt. Pemarade of the French forces at Hayence and to have asked that the French provide them with automobiles and hand grenades to execute the plot. They declared that the blowing up of the synagogue would give a signal for a general uprising against the German government. Capt. Promenade is said to have referred the conspirators to a special French agent and the entire matter was finally referred to the Mayence headquarters.

The French later, according to the Frankfurter Zeitung, decided not to share in the conspiracy and also forbade the Germans to execute it. Meanwhile, news of the conspiracy leaked out and a number of the ringleaders are in jail. The arrested men are: Alfons Bau Walter, Eberhardt, Adolph Metzer, Jacob Bullmann and Gustav Hielle.

27,000 JEWS ENTERED PALESTINE SINCE 1918.

LONDON, March 21, (Jewish Telegraphic Agency) A total of 27,000 Jewish immigrants have entered Palestine since 1918. according to a statement by Ormsby Gore, of the Goloniaal Office, in the House of Commons today.

Ormsby Gore was asked whether he was informed about the "attack on the peaceful Arab demonstration in Jerusalem last week, when several Arabs were wounded?"

He replied that a few Arabs were wounded when they interfered with the police who were attempting to arrest certain individuals shouting provocative and abusing language at the Jews and singing pro-Turkish songs. Order has since prevailed throughout the country. Mr. Gore added.

EAST SIDE SYNAGOGUE ROBBED.

NEW YORK, March 21, (Jewish Correspondence Eureau) The safe at the First Warschauer Synagogue on the East Side was robbed of \$200, and six charity boxes looted by vandals who broke into the synagogue. Silver valued at \$500 was left behind for the reason that bells were attached.

ROUMANIAN JEWISH STUDENTS KEPT OUT OF CLASSES.

EUCHAREST, March 22. (Jewish Telegraphic Agency) The recent series of outbreaks against Jewish students in Roumania has resulted in their virtual absence for the time being from all classes.

All of the departments of the various Roumanian universities are functioning as before the disturbances, except that no Jews are to be seen in the classes. The anti-Semitic students in the law departments have given notice that they will continue to press their demands for the introduction of the "numerus clausus".

AMERICAN MISSIONARIES OPERATE IN RUSSIA, IS CHARGE.

MOSGOW, March 22, (Jewish Telegraphic Agency) Charges that an organization known as the American Christian Relief Organization which is concentrating its efforts in the Ukraine is really a missionary organization camoufleged as a relief agency and that its representative in Moscow Herman Gentz is a missionary are being openly made here. The organization is said to have its headquarters in Philadelphia or New York.

The American Red Cross, the Quakers relief service operating here as well as the Soviet government are said to be ignorant of the society's true purpose, but its expulsion from the Russian field is certain if the government discovers that it is a missionary enterprise.

A group of missionaries from London were expelled by the Russian government recently for attempting to carry on missionary work in the Ukraine.

527 JEWISH APOSTATES IN VIENNA FROM JANUARY TO MARCH.

VIENNA, March 22, (Jewish Telegraphic Agency) Official figures of the number of apostates for the period of January 1 to March 7 show 327 Jews abandoned their faith for Christianity. During the same period 12,096 Roman Catholics deserted their fold. The total number of apostates during the period was 13,000. Most of the Jewish apostates professed themselves "confessionslos" or without religion at the time of their baptism.

JEWISH BANKER LEAVES BEQUESTS FOR MANY CHARITIES AND EMPLOYEES.

NEW YORK. March 22, (Jewish Correspondence Bureau) A large number of Jewish and general charitable institutions are the beneficiaries of the will of Henry Philip Goldschmidt, head of the banking house of H.P. Goldschmidt & Co. who died March 16.

Essides bequests to his widow, family and fourteen employees, \$25,000 is left for the Montefiore Hospital for Chronic Invalids, \$25,000 and the Mount Sinai Hospital, and the Charity Organizations Society, New York Association for the Improvement of the Poor, Henry Street Settlement, Presbyterian Hospital, Lenox Hill Hospital, Flower Hospital, Broad Street Hospital, Post-Graduate Hospital, Sloane Hospital for Women, Rosevelt Hospital and Monmouth Memorial Hospital at Long Branch, N.J. are each left \$5,000.

A clause of the will provides that "in the event any employee was in the service of the U.S. government or in the U.S. Army during the World War, the time served in the army by such employee should be counted. as if he had been continuously in the service of H.P. Goldschmidt & Co."

HONOR VETERAN JEWISH EDITOR ON TOTH BIRTHDAY.

CHICAGO, March 22, (Jewish Telegraphic Agency) The seventieth birthday of Dr. Nerehmiah Mossesschn, editor of the Jewish Tribune and Hebrew Standard was celebrated with a dinner held in his honor at Chalif's, 163 W. 57th Street Wednesday evening. The veteran editor was presented with silverware and a life size portrait of himself.

Dr. Mossessohn has been engaged in the Jewish journalistic world for half a century. Frior to coming to New York, he was rabbi and editor of a Jewish periodical in Portland, Oregon.

Among those who spoke at the dinner were Nathan Strauss, Rev. F. DeSola Mendes, David A. Brown, Professor Richard Jottheil, Rabbi Elias Solomon, Mrs. Richard Gottheil and Rev. Dr. Bernard N. Kaplan. Rabbi Nathan Kraus was toastmaster.

ITALY STARTS BRANCH OF COUNCIL OF JEWISH WOMEN.

NEW YORK, March 22, (Jewish Correspondence Bureau) A branch of the Council of Jewish Women has been started in Trieste, Italy, it is learned.

INVESTIGATE ANTI-JEWISH POSTERS AT N.Y. UNIVERSITY.

Menorah President Charges Discrimination Openly Practiced.

NEW YORK, March 22, (Jewish Correspondence Eureau) The authorities of the New York University are anxious to determine who was responsible for the placing some time Monday night of posters about the dormitory and other parts of the campus calling upon Jewish students to get out.

"Strictly Koshers are not wanted up here" was the wording on the posters. They were discovered early in the morning and were immediately torn down. Reference to them was made by Dean Archibald L. Bouton of the College of Arts and Sciences at the chapel services the same day who condemned them as "contrary to all the aims and principles of our institutions".

Chancellor Brown refused to make any statement on the matter to the the J.C.B. representative, but university authorities said that the placing of the posters was particularly surprising at this time as feeling between Christian and Jewish students at the university had recently shown signs of improvement.

Recently, Mitchell S. Fisher, a Phi Betta Kappa Senior and president of the N.Y.U. Menorah sent a letter to the N.Y.U. Daily News in which he charged that social discrimination on a large scale is being practiced at the university. Fisher charged among other things that only Christians are allowed to attend the annual junior promenade.

CHRISTIAN BEQUEST FOR ASBURY PARK SYNAGOGUE.

NEW YORK, March 22, (Jewish Correspondence Bureau) The Jewish synagogue at Asbury Park is left the sum of \$6,512 in the will of James A. Bradley, a New Jersey philanthropist and founder of Asbury Park and Bradley Beach.

Bradley, who was a non-Jew, in his will left bequests to the churches of all dominations, Protestant, Catholic and Jewish. His entire estate is appraised at over a million. He was 91 years old at the time of his death on June 6, 1921.

JEWISH WOMEN'S URGE DISARMAMENT.

NEW YORK, March 22. (Jewish Correspondence Bureau) A resolutioon "to bring about the cooperation of the nations of the world for the reduction of armament" was adopted at the third annual conference of the Federation of Jewish Women's Organizations held at the Hotel Astor Wednesday.

Miss Fannie Hurst, Rabbi Samuel Schulman, Mrs. Hathan Glauber of the National Federation of Temple Sisterhoods, Mrs. Wm. D. Sporborg of the Council of Jewish Women, Mrs. Max S. Spiegel of the United Synagogue were among the speakers.

The Federation represents sixty affiliated societies with a combined membership of thirty thousand.
