JEWISH IMMIGRANTS PROSPER IN MEXICO, B'NAI B'RITH REPORT SAYS.

800 Who Planned To Cross Border Into U.S. Now Contented There.

CHICAGO, March 29, (Jewish Telegraphic Agency) Large numbers of Jews who entered Mexico with intention of crossing into the States from there are now prospering in Mexico and entirely contented to remain there. A report to this effect has been received by the Independent Order B'nai Brith from Rabbi Martin Zielonka of El Paso who conducted an investigation for the Order.

In the last two years more than 800 of these Jewish immigrants have landed in Mexico, Rabbi Zielonka hears. "The only problem seems to be that all the young men want to get married and from all conversations with them they want wives of their own nationality," writes Ed. Saunders of El Paso who has met the young men.

"The earliest immigrants, the report declares, all gathered on the border planning to cross into this country, but when they found they could not easily do this the B'nai Brith took a hand in the matter.

"A definite program was adopted. The immigrant must leave the border and return to the more populous interior and there try to earn a living since he could not cross into the United States for two years. The enforcement of this order was the cause of many letters to the Yiddish and general press detailing suffering and starvation. Since the problem was one of permanent welfare of the immigrants, the B'nai Brith remained firm, almost fearless in its enforcement, and as a result comparatively few remained on the border, the others receiving transportation and cash for return to the interior.

The results have been most gratifying, continues Rabbi Zielonka. "Comparatively few are now seeking admission to the U.S. The majority of the men turn to peddling merchandise and are doing exceptionally well. Their relations with the Mexican merchants too leaves little to be desired."

"The work of the B'nai Brith should convince the most sceptical that Mexico offers opportunity to immigrants willing to work, to suffer some privation and to settle in a strange environment. The opportunities are especially good for those whose relatives can give them a sufficient fund to start their business."

GOVERNOR AND SOLONS SEEK TO PREVENT BOY'S DEPORTATION.

ALBANY, March 29, (Jewish Correspondence Bureau) Both the New York legislature and Governor Smith have used their efforts in an attempt to prevent the deportation of Sammy Goldman, who was declared by Ellis Island Immigration officials to be 3 per cent below normal in the intelligence tests.

Governor Smith today wired the President asking that he intervene in the case. A resolution asking that the boy be allowed to remain with his parents here was also passed by the State senate and lower house.

School teachers and physicians who have examined Sammy lately, according to Senator Fearson of Syracuse who is interesting himself in the case, have found the boy to be well above normal and attribute his failure to pass the Ellis Island tests to suffering from starvation and torture in Russia.

LATVIAN ANTI-SEMITES WANT JEWS BOYCOTTED.

RIGA, March 29, (Jewish Telegraphic Agency) A huge anti-Semitic rally was held by the Latvian National Club in the streets of Riga at which speakers urged that an economic boycott be started against the Jews. Preceding the meeting automobiles filled with agitators rode through the streets distributing appeals for the boycott.

Representatives of the Jewish community waited on the President and the Minister of Interior asking that steps be taken against the proposed boycott. They were unsuccessful, however.

COINS WITH HAKENKREUZLER EMBLEMS DECLARED VALUELESS.

PRAGUE, March 29, (Jewish Telegraphic Agency) Many in Prague will have to pay dearly for their anti-Semitism. Lately the Hakenkreuzlers had become addicted to the fad of cutting the Swastika sign (emblem of the anti-Semites) into their coins. The government has now announced that all coins bearing the Swastika emblem will lose their currency. As a result, many of the anti-Semites are now possessed of money of value equivalent to their speeches.

RESIGNATION OF JEWISH RECTOR NOT ACCEPTED.

PRAGUE, March 29, (Jewish Telegraphic Agency) The Minister of Education has refused to accept the resignation of Dr. Samuel Steinhertzt. against whose appointment recently to the rectorship of the German University of Prague, a strike was organized by the anti-Semitic students.

The press is commenting extensively on the fact that while Steinhertzt refused to budge while the movement against him was at its height, he has now of his own free will after the agitation has died out, tendered his resignation.

HALF A TRILLION ROUBLES FOR MATZOS FOR POOR.

MOSCOW, March 28, (Jewish Telegraphic Agency) A fund of a half a trillion roubles has been collected by the Jewish Religious Soviet with which to buy Matzos for the poor. This sum, it is estimated will buy more Matzos than all the Russian bakeries, with their present comparatively limited facilities can bake.

RAID HOMES OF SUSPECTED ZIONISTS.

MOSCOW, March 28, (Jewish Telegraphic Agency) Soviet agents raided the homes of seven Jews here suspected of activity in behalf of the Zionist movement. Nothing incriminating however was found. A copy of Rabbi Mase's memoirs of the war was confiscated in one of the residences by the searching party.

SAMUEL CONDITIONS PARDON ON ARAB PEACE.

JERUSALEM, March 28, (Jewish Telegraphic Agency) Sir Herbert Samuel will grant a pardon and release to Abu Kish, the organizer of the attack on the Jews of Petach-Tikvah in June 1921, if the Arabs will guarantee to maintain peace with their Jewish neighbors in the future. Sir Herbert gave this promise to a delegation of Sheiks who petitioned him to release their leader.

Abu Kish is serving a fifteen year sentence for his activities in connection with the Petach-Tikvah disorders.

AMERICAN WOMEN, ENGLISH LANGUAGE, NEED KLAN PROTECTION.

CLEVELAND, OHIO, March 28, (Jewish Telegraphic Agency) Foreign languages and newspapers printed in foreign languages should be suppressed and American womanhood must be protected against foreigners, a Klan speaker, Dr. Sherman of New York, declared in an address before a large Klux rally in a Cleveland church.

The pastor of the church following the address, expressed regret that his English birth made him ineligible for membership in the Klan, but he stated he entirely acquiesced in their views and in the closing prayer invoked the blessing of God on "the Ku Klux Klan and its high ideals".

HEBREW POET EXPECTED TO LIVE.

JERUSALEM, March 28, (Jewish Telegraphic Agency) Rimon, the Hebrew poet who attempted suicide last week is on the road to recovery, according to his physicians.

Several months ago Rimon was castrated by an Arab gang. His attempt at suicide was attributed to the depression that set in following this outrage.
