8,000 REFUGEE JEWS EXPELLED FROM POLAND.

WARSAW, April 11. (Jewish Telegraphic Agency) Hundreds of Jews are being arrested daily, in accordance with an order of the Polish government expelling all Russian Jewish refugees from Poland.

More than 8,000 of these refugees are estimated to have been deported to date. In view of the immigration restrictions in the U.S., the majority are planning to go to Argentine. The Argentine consular office here is, accordingly, being besieged by crowds of these refugees seeking visas.

Premier Sikorski has modified the expulsion order insofar as it affects rabbis and ministerial students, permitting them to remain.

DEMI U.S. AMBASSADOR INTERVENED FOR JEWS.

BERLIN, April 11. (Jewish Telegraphic Agency) The Jewish Telegraphic Agency is informed by the German Minister of Foreign Affairs that he is not aware of any official or unofficial representations made by the American Ambassador to leading German officials looking towards the abandonment of anti-Semitism in Germany.

The report to which the German government takes exception to, was carried by the J.T.A. from Washington and was derived from an apparently reliable source. According to this report, a prominent American recently returned from Berlin, had been informed that the American Ambassador in an informal capacity had sought to intervene in behalf of the Jews.

AMALGAMATED OPENS NEW YORK BANK.

NEW YORK, April 11. (Jewish Correspondence Bureau) The Amalgamated Clothing Workers of America, of which Sidney Hillman is the President, following the recent opening of a bank in Chicago will launch a New York bank on Saturday, April 14.

INCREASE PALESTINE IMMIGRATION.

JERUSALEM, April 11, (Jewish Telegraphic Agency) According to government figures just made public, eleven hundred Jewish immigrants arrived in Palestine during March. The immigrants came principally in families, only about one fourth of the eleven hundred coming alone.

The record of March shows an increase of several hundred over that of March 1922. The average Jewish immigration for this year is a thousand monthly as compared to about half that number last year.

ZIONISTS SHOULD BE PATIENT, SAYS LORD CECIL.

TORONTO, April 11, (Jewish Telegraphic Agency) The building up of the Jewish homeland in Palestine is only a question of time, requiring tact, courage and patience, Lord Robert Cecil who is here as a guest of the Toronto governor declared today. Jews, he declared, should look forward to the future hopefully and not be overconcerned or discouraged if things did not develop as quickly as the Zionists could wish.

DEMAND BEAVERBROOK NAME JEWS WHO URGED ANTI-ZIONIST WAR.

LONDON, April 12, (Jewish Telegraphic Agency) Characterizing as "mere evasion" and "most ridiculous excuse conceivable" the recent statement by Lord Beaverbrook of the DAILY EXPRESS that he declines to divulge the names of the "Committee of British Jews" who, he said, had asked him to oppose Zionism for fear the individuals would be subjected to abuse, the JEWISH WORLD today insists it is imperative that the names be known so that those implicated shall not be left under suspicion.

Lord Beaverbrook's statement about a "Committee of British Jews" who urged him to fight Zionism suggested men like Mr. Henriques Claude, Montefiore, Lionel de Rothschild and other opponents of Zionism, declares the JEWISH WORLD. But, it adds, "we could not believe any of these behaved in the way imputed."

The WORLD fears, however, that although the Board of Jewish Deputies and the Anglo-Jewish Committee are absolved of suspicion, the League of British Jews is not.

The WORLD finally demands that Sir Alfred Mond say what he knows of the matter, because Lord Beaverbrook had said Sir Alfred was once in close alliance with the men responsible.

CLAIMS EINSTEIN THEORY CONFIRMED BEYOND DOUBT.

SAN FRANCISCO, April 12, (Jewish Correspondence Bureau) Results obtained from photographing eclipses taken last September in Australia confirm Professor Einstein's theory of relativity, according to the statement issued today by Professor Campbell, President of the California University and head of the Eclipse Expedition.

The photographs substantiate the theory beyond doubt, and "no further proof is necessary", Professor Campbell asserts.
