ROUMANIA TO LIMIT JEWISH UNIVERSITY ADMISSIONS.

Bucharest, April 20 (Jewish Telegraphic Agency). Declaring that the government was considering a measure providing for the limitation of Jewish students in the universities, Minister of Education Angheliescu appealed to the anti-Semitic student-body to keep the peace. The Minister assured the students of an early ordinance being promulgated regulating Jewish admissions. Students belonging to the association headed by the Anti-Semitic Professor Kuza agreed to cause no disturbances, pending the enforcement of the order. In the meantime, they proclaimed a "peaceful boycott" on Jewish students, demanding separate seats for them in the class-rooms and lecture halls.

JEWISH STUDENTS SEVERELY ATTACKED IN UNIVERSITY RIOT.

Bucharest, April 20 (Jewish Telegraphic Agency). Many Jewish students were seriously wounded in an attack made upon them by Roumanian students in the university of Bucharest. A crowd of Roumanian students in the Juridical, Chemical and Engineering Departments of the University fell upon Jewish students, beat them up and threw them down the stairs. The Praesidium of the University called the police who cleared the halls of the rioting students.

A strong cordon of police is guarding the university and will attend the lectures if the excesses will be repeated.

JEWS WOUNDED IN CZERNOWITZ STUDENT RIOT.

Czernowitz, April 20 (J. T. A.). Professor Zadri, Jewish soloist at a concert here, has sustained several serious head wounds and a number of Jews received lighter injuries, during an attack on the audience by anti-Semitic students who came from Jassy for the purpose. Police arrived too late to prevent any of the damage, later arresting members of the Jewish self-defence corps. Kolnik, a Jewish painter who visited America in the company of Rubin, another artist, is among those taken into custody.

DEMAND RELEASE OF ANTI-JEWISH RIOTERS

Bucharest, April 20 (Jewish Telegraphic Agency). Anti-Semitic students at the universities of Bucharest, Klausenburg and Temesvar struck today demanding from the Government the release of the students who were arrested for participating in anti-Jewish riots.

SAYS JEWS VICTIMS OF HUNGARIAN COMMUNISM

Budapest, April 20 (Jewish Telegraphic Agency). Jews of Hungary suffered a proportionately greater loss during Bela Kun's communist regime than any part of the Hungarian population according to statistics published today by Albert Vary, a high Jewish official. Although there is a tendency to identify Jews with communism, M. Vary points out that figures show that of the 590 executions by communists there were 44 Jews, a percentage of 7.4 whereas the percentage of Jews towards the total population is 4:6.

DR MOTZKIN ASKED TO RETAIN POST.

Berlin, April 20 (Jewish Telegraphic Agency). Dr. Leo Motzkin, who resigned as Chairman of the World Jewish Relief Conference, has been requested in a resolution adopted at the last session of the meeting of this body to return to his office. Dr. Motzkin, who resigned as a protest against the demand made on behalf of IGA for a majority control of the refugee relief work in Poland, was absent from the last session. Dr. Tiomkin is Acting Chairman.

ROUMANIA EXTENDS RUSSIAN JEWS' STAY

Bucharest, April 20 (Jewish Telegraphic Agency): Russian Jewish refugees in Bessarabia will be permitted to remain until September 1, in accordance with a decision of the Ministerial Council announced today. The announcement further declares that at the expiration of the period of grace, Jewish refugees arriving on Roumanian soil after October 1920, will be obliged to seek an asylum elsewhere.

ITALIAN JEWS "NOT INTERESTED" IN COMBATTING ANTISEMITISM

Rome, April 20 (Je T. A.). The news agency "Italika" reports that the Italian Council of Jewish Communities has declined an invitation to join an inter-territorial Jewish council for combatting anti-Semitism, declaring that it is not interested in such measures, because Italian Jews enjoy full rights.

ARABS PROMISE PEACE FOR CHIEF'S FREEDOM

JERUSALEM, April 20 (J. T. A.) A delegation of Arab sheiks from the vicinity of Petach Tikvah has again petitioned Sir Herbert Samuel to release Abu Kish, an Arab chieftain serving a fifteen-year sentence for leading the mob which sacked the Jewish colony in June 1921. The Arabs assured the High Commissioner they were maintaining friendly relations with their Jewish neighbors and undertook to continue to live in peace with them.

SAYS PALESTINE JEWS ARMED

London, April 20 (J. C. B.). Every Jew in Palestine is armed to the teeth, Shibley Jemal, Secretary of the Arab Delegation, declares in the course of a correspondence to the MORNING POST. The chaluzim are communists and atheists, Jemal further charges, and the most influential Jew in Palestine, he says, is Ben Zion, a labor leader.

BLACKLIST WARSAW SHOPKEEPERS FOR STRIKING

Warsaw, April 20 (Jewish Telegraphic Agency). Jewish shopkeepers who closed their places of business during the general strike April 17 to protest the recent disturbances are prominently listed in two of the local anti-Semitic papers, "Rzeczpospolita" and "Dwa Grosze". Poles are urged by these publications to make more effective the boycott against ~~these~~ these Jewish shopkeepers.

DR. GEORG HALPERIN SAILS FOR AMERICA

London, April 29 (Jewish Telegraphic Agency). Dr. Georg Halperin, managing director of the Jewish Colonial Trust, is leaving tomorrow for the United States.

Dr. Halperin is the Treasurer of the Zionist Organization, and chief advisor on financial matters. He is coming in response to a cabled request from Dr. Weizmann. It is understood that his advice is required in the matter of a financial institution for Palestine which is being considered by a number of prominent American Jews, among them Mr. Louis Marshall, Hon. Oscar Straus, and others.
