FIGHTING RENEWED IN BUCHAREST; EIGHT JEWS MALTREATED. .

Bucarest, May 22. (Jewish Telegraphic Agency). Serious fighting broke out anew on the campus of the Bucharest University yesterday when anti-Semitic students of the Commercial, Chemical and Eineralogical Departments hurled stink-bombs at Jews in classes. Eight Jewish students were so badly beaten as to require hospital treatment and are still under physicians' care.

KLAUSENBURG TEACHERS JOIN STUDENTS' STRIKE.

Bucharest, May 22. (J.T.A.) Sixty assistant professors and instructors joined the striking anti-Jewish students, declaring that since only Jews attended the lectures, they saw no purpose in continuing to teach. Appeals by the Jewish student body to the Instructors to disregard the anti-Semitic boycott proved unavailing.

AUSTRIAN OFFICIALS BAR JEWS FROM HEALTH RESORTS.

Vienna, May 22. (Jevish Telegraphic Agency). Resolutions declaring Jews as inadmissable were adopted by the municipalities of Spitanadonau and Krensmuenster, two well-known Austrian health Tabuts. Appeals against this decision, which is in violation of the constitution, have been lodged with the officials of the districts in which the resorts are situated. Failing satisfaction in the figurator, Jewish leaders declars they will start proceedings in the higher courts against both the municipalities and the district officials.

UKRAINIAN JEWS DECIDE TO CONTINUE AID.

NEW YORK, May 22, (Jewish unres, pondence Darone) Continence of and for the nearly three million strictors Fing to the Unreint was strongly urged, and propagands tending to the the targinop and passed as arongly demonstered, by all spaces to the Chira shaul convention of the National Federation of Unreinted Jews, Leeday, in the Hotel McAlpin.

The speakers included to Benjamin Entertly, Paradent of the Federation, who presided, Captain Person Aibles, a revessentative of the Mannes Ballef Bission, and Dr. Leo Mortski of Lavis, Chairman of the Jewish World Relief Conference.

Sixty delegates, including representable of lear Potroit, thicago, Philadelphia, New Rayon and many other cities, were in attendance at the section, beginning wise a disper Sabura y evening.

Reporting the Federation was instrumented to forwarding

Reporting the Federation was instrument in the terminal to the Ukraine food and clothing drafts amounting to 3750,000.00, Ur. Dubowsky amounced that following the suspension of the draft service by Secretary Hoover's Countibes, the Inderstor of Ukrainian Jews decided on April 23rd last to avail itself of the Horson Polief Mission for the forwarding of food and elothing to the Horson Polief Dr. Dubowsky indicated also that "for various reasons the Jewish Joint Distribution Committee will secret or later discontinue its activities in Russia and in the Ukraine." "Since the measurty of helping the Jews in the Ukraine will continue for many years to come, we must be prepared to assume at least a part of the coordina relief work for our brethern", Dr. Eubowsky added.

That the Jews of the United States gave half of the relief that went from this country to Russia, the Jew giving an average of fourteen dollars to the 76 cents contributed by the Christian member, was asserted by Captain Hibben.

Mr. Rashkas, a mamber of the Emecutive Committee, of the All-Russian Jewish Relief Committee (Yidgescom) reported his Committee was carring for 170,000 Jewish children and harded the continued support of the Federation in the Laintenance of children's homes in Soviet Russia and the Ukrains. Dr. Motekin declared there were two false impressions that had to be dispelled if intensification of the relief effort in behalf of Russia was to be made possible. He said Herbart Hoover was responsible for the impression that the need passed with the famine. The other impression he said was the Jews in this country were weary of giving.

Dr. Motzkin invited the Federation to send representatives to a conference of Jewish Relief workers in Europe and urged the establishment of at least one large children's kitchen in some city in the Ukraine, in addition to founding of institutions to care for 50,000 homeless children. The visitor cited figures showing an appallent low birth rate obtaining among the Ukrainian population, sessecially the Jews.

Dr. Motzkin declared scientists found the famine sufferers were smaller of stature and that their head and breast measurements have been considerably diminished. He insisted further relief without sanitation was impossible.

Speakers at the dinner included Joseph Barondes, Dr. Joseph Krimsky, a former President of the Federation, John L. Bernstein, President of the Hias, Wm. Edlin, Editor of the DAY, and Dr. A. Coralnik, the Federation's Secretary. Mr. Dubowsky was elected for a second term. Dr. L. Smirnoff of Briegeport, Conn., was elected honorary secretary and Frank Krevoruk, vice-president.

PROMINENT JEWISH SOCIAL WORKERS AT NATIONAL CONFERENCE.

WASHINGTON, May 22, (Jewish correspondence Bureau) Seven Jews figure prominently on the program of the National Conference of Social Workers which has been attracting nationwide attention, and has been addressed by Secretaries Hughes and Hoover. The most prominent of these is Dr. Alice Solomon, director of the Berlin School of Social Work, one of the six specially invited foreign visitors to the Conference. She made a great impression by her address the other day.

The others are Lee K. Frankel, of the Metropolitan Life Insurance Company, who has been nominated for first vice-president of the Conference, George J. Hecht, editor of BETTER TIMES, New York, Dr. Bernard Glueck, noted psychopathic expert, Dr. Sidney E. Goldstein, Director of Social Service, New York Free Synagogue, Mrs. Henry Moskowitz, Public Relations Councillor, New York, and Alfred Bettman, prominent Cincinnati attorney, who was formerly connected with the Department of Justice.

It is also a source of interest at the Conference that Ruth Mary Wolff, age 2 years and two months, whose father is a director of the Jewish Big Brothers Club of Pittsburgh, has the distinction of being the youngest member of the Conference, having been registered by her parents.
