## HUNGARIAN LOAN A FAILURE; PERSECUTION OF JEWS BLAMED.

BUDAPEST, May 25, (Jewish Telegraphic Agency) Your correspondent learns that the loan which Hungary is trying to float is in serious danger of failure because of the Jewish situation in Hungary. Count Bethlen, the Premier, has returned to Budapest empty-handed. Despite the cordial reception he has received at the hands of the representatives of Rothschilds and the Paris representatives of Kuhn, Loeb and Co. towards the loan, nothing definite has been accomplished.

Hungarian officials are now trying to get the Jews to put in a good word for Hungary. Minister of Foreign Affairs Doruvarly has addressed himself to representatives of the Jewish Committee of Hungary with a request that they issue a declaration that the Jews of Hungary enjoy the rights guaranteed them by the Peace Treaty.

This request was debated at a meeting of the Kehillah, which resulted in the adoption of a rather diplomatically worded resolution, stating that the Jews of Hungary trust that the stabilization of Hungary will bring about an improvement in the political conditions of the Jews.

The Hungarian authorities are not satisfied with this statement and demand a more definite declaration in order to influence favorably the bankers to whom application for the loan has been made.

## FASCISM INVADES ROUMANIAN HIGH SCHOOLS.

BUCHAREST, May 25, (Jewish Telegraphic Agency) Student Fascism, which has been ragging in Roumanian Universities, has recently penetrated into secondary schools, as well, and the younger students are rapidly following in the footsteps of the elder ones. Temesvar, with its 40,000 organized Fascisti, has become the center of the chauvinistic movement.

The Fascisti of Czernowitz have demanded of the University heads that "numerus clausus" be put into effect at once, providing for the exclusion of "aliens" in general and Jews in particular. The officials have decided to close the Czernowitz University, following the attack made on Jewish law students yesterday, when the students were mercilessly beaten.

**SAMUEL REASSURES PALESTINE JEWS.**

JERUSALEM, May 24. (Jewish Telegraphic Agency) Sir Herbert Samuel today assured representatives of the National Council of Palestine Jews that no change is contemplated in the Government policy because of the treaty with King Hussein of the Hejaz. Only economic cooperation with the proposed Arab Government is contemplated, the High Commissioner stated.

It is learned further that during his visit to Palestine in December, Dr. Weizmann had conversations with the High Commissioner about the probable effect of the Arab-Gulf treaty on the British Government's Zionist policy.

An official statement declaring that no change in the political status of Palestine by the treaty with King Hussein will be issued in a few days, the Government announced.

**MOVE TO SUPPRESS STUDENT VIOLENCE IN ROMANIA.**

BUCAREST, May 24. (Jewish Telegraphic Agency) An official regulation has been published in the ROMANIAN, that new students upon entering the University will be obliged to sign a pledge to observe order. The first violation of the pledge will be followed by warning and reprimand. More serious infractions, and especially disorderly conduct will be punished by expulsion from all Romanian universities.

The Students Union will be prohibited in the future to engage only in cultural activities and sports, the law is empowered to control the activities of the Union, and it will be dissolved on the slightest hint of subversion.

In consequence of the continued disorders, the University of Jassy remains closed until the fall.

**HALF REFUGEE CHILDREN TUBERCULAR AND TRACHOMA.**

BERLIN, May 25. (Jewish Telegraphic Agency) Detailed figures have been published by the OSE, an organization for the improvement of health of the Jewish population in Poland, regarding the health conditions of Jewish refugees and their children in the various immigration camps.

The investigators show that in some camps half of the children are afflicted with tuberculosis, and some as many as four from trachoma. At the immigration camp in Koenig, 26% of the children are consumptive, the report states. Intemperance ran cent of the children of Brest Litovsk camp are tubercular, while the inroads trachoma has made among children in the Koenig camp amounts to 65%.

The health condition of the parents is not much better than that of the children, 53% of the adults being said to be afflicted with one disease or another. Mortality in the refugee camps reaches 9%.

A Warsaw report states a third of the pupils attending the Jewish People's Schools are threatened with tuberculosis.

**"HAKOAH" FOOTBALLERS UNVANQUISHED BY BRITISH.**

VIENNA. May 25, (Jewish Telegraphic Agency) Fifty thousand spectators, including almost the entire diplomatic corps and the whole of the English colony, witnessed the football match between a selected team of the "West Ham United", one of England's leading football teams, who played here against the Jewish team of the Hakoah Sport Club. The game ended in a draw, each of the teams making a goal.

The match attracted city wide attention because it is the first time in ten years that English footballers came to Vienna.

**RESENT VISIT TO RABBI SONNENFELD.**

JERUSALEM, May 25. (Jewish Telegraphic Agency) Resentment felt in Jewish circles over the visit Col. Kisch paid to Rabbi Sonnenfeld, leader of the intransigent orthodoxy, found expression at the meeting yesterday of the Vaad Leumi.

Dr. Ben-Zion Mosessohn questioned the Colonel, who is acting as the political representative in Palestine of the World Zionist Organization and of the Jewish Agency, about his visit, particularly as the Zionist emissary was accompanied by Prof. Israel deHaan, an avowed opponent of the Zionist Organization. The Colonel replied that his visit was unofficial and prompted by his personal desire to acquaint himself with all parts of the Jewish population.

**PALESTINE JEWISH PHYSICIANS UNITED IN MALARIA WAR.**

JERUSALEM, May 24, (Jewish Telegraphic Agency) The conference of Jewish physicians for the combatting of malaria opened in Haifa yesterday. Delegates include representatives of the Workers' Sick Benefit Association, of the Hadassah and of the Jewish Physicians' Association.

**ARAB AGITATORS SET FREE.**

JERUSALEM, May 24, (Jewish Telegraphic Agency) Of the four Arab notables of Nablus tried for resorting to terroristic measures to hinder the election of members to the Legislative Council, three have been acquitted and one sentenced to pay a fine of £25. The Arab Executive made much capital of the trial, organizing a national defense.

**FISHEL AT OPENING OF RABBINICAL HOME IN JERUSALEM.**

JERUSALEM, May 25, (Jewish Telegraphic Agency) Harry Fishel, well-known New York communal worker, has arrived here and will be present at the ceremonies attending the official opening of Rabbinical home, which he had built for Rabbi Kuk.

While here, Mr. Fishel, it is said, will conduct, in behalf of the "Brandeis Group", which he represents, an investigation on the possibilities for further house building credits.
