HALLER SUCCEEDS PILSUDSKI; KORFANTY MAY BE WAR MINISTER.

MARSAW, June il, (Jewish Telegraphic Agency) General Stanislaus Haller has been named chief of the Polish military staff, succeeding Marshall Joseph Pilsudski who resigned when M. Witos assumed the Premiership.

General Haller who recruited the Polish volunteers in America is notoriously anti-Semitic. Such practices as the hurling of Jewish passengers from fast moving trains and the cutting of Jews' beards were inaugurated by his recruits.

Korfanty, a Silesian leader, also an anti Semite, is insistently mentioned as the likelicat candidate for the War Ministry.

JEWISH AGENCY TO BE "RESPONSIBLE".

BERLIN, June 11. (Jewish Telegraphic Agency) The movement for "democratizing" of the Jewish agency for Palestine won a victory Sunday when a resolution was adopted by the Zionist Actions Committee providing that the Agency shall be responsible for its actions to a body representative of other Jewish organizations besides the Zionists.

. The resolution provides also that the Zionists may now start negotiations with other Jewish bodies for their participation in the Jewish agency. Nahum Sokolow in a speech before the Committee pledged himself to see to it that the "democratizing" principle was fully carried out.

This satisfied Deputy Gruenbaum whose resolution Friday calling for a "responsible" agency to be constituted by a world Jewish congress was rejected by Mr. Sokolow on behalf of the Zionist Executive as showing lack of confidence in the leaders.

CHARGE INTERFERENCE WITH JEWISH WORSHIP ON TRAINS.

WARSAW. June 9, (Jewish Telegraphic Agency) Charging that Jewish passengers traveling in railroad coaches in the early morning hours are not permitted to don the praying shawl and phylactery, the Jewish deputies in an interpellation submitted today urge revokation of the order, which they allege interferes with the freedom of worship.

GERMAN ANTI-SEMITIC PROFESSOR RESIGNS.

BERLIN, June 8, (Jewish Telegraphic Agency) Professor Leonard, winner of the Nobel prize for physics has tendered his resignation to the University of Heidleberg with which he was connected.

While no reason is given, it is believed to be due to the fact that Leonard was recently disciplined by the University Administration for his continuance of his college classes during the funeral of pr. Walter Rathenau. With the exception of Prof. Leonard's classes, all collegiate instruction was suspended during the funeral.

Prof. Leonard has been one of the leaders of the anti-Semitic agitation. Recently he received much publicity by his appeal to the Nobel Prize Commission to rescind the Nobel prize it has awarded to Professor Einstein on the ground that Prof. Einstein "did not sufficiently represent the German spirit."

PERCENTAGE NORM TO BE CONTINUED IN ROUMANIAN UNIVERSITIES.

BUCHAREST. June 8, (Jewish Telegraphic Agency) Replying to a delegation of Jewish students, M. Anghelescu, Roumanian Minister of Education today denied their plea for the removal of the limitations of Jewish students at the universities. He declraed that for the present this could not be done.

He declared also that the restriction regulations for the present would also apply to the recently acquired Roumanian provinces of Bessarabia and Klausenburg.

BRITAIN SOUGHT TO STOP DENIKIN'S EXCESSES.

LONDON. June 8. (Jewish Telegraphic Agency) The British Government, while it supplied the White Russian leader and pogromist. Denikin, with ammunition did not countenance his attitude towards the Jews and sought to prevent his excesses against them. Assistant Secretary of Foreign Affairs, McNeil, made this statement today in answer to a puery by Noel Buxton, member of Parliament, as to whether any protests had been lodged against Denikin's Jew-batting.

The British representatives were instructed to exert all their efforts in behalf of the Jews there and the High Commissioner Sir H. MacKinder upon his departure for Russia at the time was given specific instructions to investigate and report all excesses. McNeil said.

MORE JEWISH CORPSES DEMANDED FOR DISSECTION.

WARSAW, June 8, (Jewish Telegraphic Agency) A delegation of Jewish students of the Polish universities appeared before the Warsaw Rabbinical Council complaining that their practice in dissection work at medical schools was endangered owing to the lack of Jewish corpses.

The rabbinate is now meeting in conference to consider the problem.

DUEL WITH JEWISH DEPUTY POSTPONED.

Anti-Semitic Deputy Must Recuperate First.

BUDAPEST, June 9. (Jewish Telegraphic Agency) The duel which had been arranged aetween Paul Sandor, the Jewish Deputy to the Hunngarian Parlhament and the anti-Semitic Deputy Besnard has been postponed to give Besnard a chance to get in trim once more.

Besnard needs recuperation because of another duel which he fought yesterday with Rassy, a deputy who has been very friendly to the Jewish interests. Besnard's markmanship was on a par with his reasoning on Jewish questions. He was severely wounded.

ZIONISTS HEATEDLY DEBATE AGENCY ISSUE.

BERLIN, June 10, (Jewish Telegraphic Agency) The debate yesterday of the Zionist Actions Committee on the question of the "Jewish Agency" was marked by great vehemence. Greenbaum spoke at length on the proposal that the projected agency be made subordinate to some central and definite group. Sckolow replying contended that the proposition was not feasible. The resolution was defeated.

JEWISH COLONISTS EXHIBIT AT ITALIAN EXPOSITION.

ROME, June 9. (Jewish Telegraphic Agency) One of the features which has attracted great attention at the International Exposition now being held at Padua is an exhibition of the products of the Jewish colonists of Palestine.

The Jewish exhibits have received a great amount of attention not only from Jewish but from the general visitors to the exposition.

CUNO LAUDS AMERICAN JEWISH PRESS.

BERLIN, June 11, (Jewish Telegraphic Agency) Chancellor Cuno today received Jacob Landau, director of the Jewish Telegraphic Agency, in the company of other Jewish journalists and spoke at length on the problems facing Germany, particularly dwelling on the vexing reparations issue.

The Jew nas always been an instrumentality for the promotion of peace, Cuno declared. and the "mighty Jewish press of America" may do much towards the moulding of a sane attitude towards the reparations problem, he concluded.

POSTPONE CONSIDERATION OF THOM'S PROPOSAL.

WARSAW, June 11, (Jewish Telegraphic Agency) The Educational Commission has decided to postpone the consideration of Dr. Thon's proposal relative to the numerus clausus until the government hearing is concluded.

THREE GIVEN RABBI DEGREES BY JEWISH THEOLOGICAL SEMINARY.

Nineteen Receive Teachers Diplomas.

NEW YORK, June 11, (Jewish Telegraphic Agency) The Jewish Theological Seminary conferred the degree of Rabbi on three of its students at the commencement exercises held today. The graduates were Elliot Maurice Burstein, Cleveland; Louis Moses Levitsky (with merit) of Montreal and Jacob Moses Roth (Ph.D.) Elizabeth, N.J.

Nineteen were graduated from the Teachers' Institute of the Seminary and diplomas in the extension department were awarded to eight others.

An additional endowment of \$2,000,000 is needed for the Seminary, Dr. Cyrus Adler declared in his address at the exercises. He announced that the acquisition by the Seminary's Library of the Elkan N. Adler collection gave the Seminary's library the distinction of being the greatest Jewish library in the world.

Dr. Adler also announced that Dr. Jacob Hoschander had been appointed to the Sabato Morrais professorship of Biblical Literature and Exegesis. Lenry A. Dix, the philanthropist, was chosen a life member of the Board of Directors.

Rabbi Max Drob who delivered the address to the graduates urged them to "preach Judaism and not to act as advance agents for the latest plays".

"You will often find", he said, "that your adherence to tradition will be called fantasticism and narrow-mindness. You may even be censored by enterprising boards of trustees because you conceive it to be the mission of the rabbi to preach Judaism and not to act as the advance agent of latest plays. You will be told that the less religion and the more topics of the day you present from your pulpit, the greater will be your success as a rabbi. If you are not weak-kneed you will refuse to prostitute the pulpit and remain loyal to the highest traditions of the rabbinate."

 $\,$ $\,$ The graduates were urged by Dr. Herman M. Cohan to seek pulpits in the south and west.

LASKER RESIGNS FROM SHIPPING BOARD.

WASHINGTON, June 11, (Jewish Telegraphic Agency) Albert D. Lasker, Chairman of the United States Shipping Board today tendered his reignation effective June 12.

The resignation was expected as Lasker on his appointment in 1921 by President Harding had agreed to take the position for a period of two years only. Lasker is generally regarded as one of the most intimate and confidential friends of the President.

PALESTINE POTTERY EXHIBIT IN LONDON.

LONDON. June 9, (Jewish Telegraphic Agency) The coming week will see the opening in London of a Palestine pottery exhibit. The exhibition is being staged under the auspices or the pro-Jerusalem Society.
