SAMUEL ISSUES REPORT ON ELECTIONS.

Citizenship Qualifications Defined; Arab Agitators Blamed.

JERUSALEM, June 14, (Jewish Telegraphic Agency) No property qualification will be required for the exercise of suffrage in Palestine, Sir Herbert Samuel, the High Commissioner of Palestine, declares in his report today, on the recent Legislative Council elections.

Palestinian citizens are defined as those who were habitually resident of Palestine before September 1, 1922. Those not coming within this category must in applying for naturalization declare their intention to reside permanently in Palestine.

During the recent elections to the Legislative Council Jews participated to the extent of 50% of their numbers, Moslems, 18% and Christians 5%.

ALL ARAB MEMBERS OF LEGISLATIVE COUNCIL RESIGN.

JERUSALEM, June 14, (Jewish Telegraphic Agency) All of the Arab members of the Palestine Legislative Council today advised Sir Herbert Samuel that they will resign if the government does not publish a statement, announcing that the establishment of the Council does not imply the acknowledgement of the Balfour Declaration.

LONDON, June 14, (Jewish Telegraphic Agency) Newspapers here report that all of the Arab members of the Palestine Legislative Council have resigned.

BRITISH CAVALRY ARRIVE O HUNT BANDITS.

JERUSALEM, June 14, (Jewish Telegraphic Agency) British cavalry has arrived in Mettulah to hunt the bandits who ambushed and killed five of the British gendarmes escorting Sir Herbert Samuel. One village in the bandit district has been burned already and more will meet the same fate until the bandits surrender, it is believed.

SCORES DIE IN ARAB FEUDS.

JERUSALEM, June 12, (Jewish Telegraphic Agency) A seemingly endless series of feuds is raging between Arab tribes located between the provinces of Aleppo and Hama, in French Syria. Scores of villages are reported to have been virtually wiped out. Approximately 100 Arabs are reported to have been slain in recent clashes.

DEMAND ACTION AGAINST SLAYERS OF JEWS.

WARSAW, June 14, (Jewish Telegraphic Agency) The Jews of Wegrow are mourning today the death of Isaac Pagura and Lazar Lass, who were murdered by a Polish captain and his four soldiers as they were innocently riding in an omnibus from Sokolow to Wegrow.

The Jewish residents of the town have called a mass meeting to protest the indifference of the government to the deed and to demand that the murderers be held to account for their act.

300 JEWS ARRESTED FOR STAYING IN DANZIG.

DANZIG, June 14, (Jewish Telegraphic Agency) Government agents swooped down upon the Jewish quarter yesterday and arrested 300 Jewish immigrants charged with illegally residence in Danzig.

Attempts have been made to have the arrested released on bail until their court hearing, but thus far they have been unsuccessful and the 300 are still in the custody of the Free City officials.

PALESTINE GOVERNMENT REFUSES TO DEFER KING'S FETE.**Jews Do Not Participate.**

JERUSALEM, June 3, (Jewish Telegraphic Agency) On Saturday, June 2nd, the birthday of King George V was officially celebrated here. As the King's birthday (June 2) was on Sunday, the Jewish population made representations to the government asking that the celebration be postponed to Monday so that the Jews should be able to participate.

Last year the King's birthday coincided with the Jewish festival of Pentecost, and the Government postponed the celebration till Monday, June 5th, in order to allow the Jewish community to join in the celebration. The Palestine Arabs protested against the postponement, declaring that it was an indication of the extent of Zionist power in Palestine.

This year the Government refused to postpone the celebration and the Jews have consequently not participated. The Arab press is jubilant over the affront to the Jews.

ZANGWILL COMES TO ADDRESS JEWISH CONGRESS SESSION.

NEW YORK, June 14, (Jewish Telegraphic Agency) Nathan Straus, President of American Jewish Congress announces that Israel Zangwill, the noted English Jewish novelist, playwright and essayist, has accepted an invitation to deliver the chief address before the next session of the Congress which will be held on October 14th and delegates to which are now being elected in different communities of the country.

The invitation was extended to Mr. Zangwill in behalf of the Executive Committee by its Chairman, Dr. Stephen S. Wise, after a meeting of the same was held at the offices of Mr. Straus on May 13th.

Mr. Zangwill will come to the United States, which he had not visited for twelve years, for the exclusive purpose of delivering this address and he will return to his home in England where he is engaged in pressing literary work after a stay of only a few days.

It was indicated yesterday by officers of the American Jewish Congress that Mr. Zangwill's address will be in a large measure similar in scope to the memorable reviews of the Jewish situation which the late Dr. Max Nordau presented before different Zionist Congresses, and much gratitude was expressed that the foremost Jewish writer in the world will head the next session of the American Jewish Congress.

VARIED GROUP FROM HERE TO SETTLE IN PALESTINE.

NEW YORK, June 14, (Jewish Telegraphic Agency) A number of business men, farmers, one nurse and representatives of several other professions, are leaving aboard the SS Asia today for Palestine, where they plan to settle.

The group includes Jacob Maze of New York, a farm scientist who will join the agricultural station of the Zionist Executive; S. Kastle, of Toledo, a business man, J. Baruchman and daughter, Miss Pearl Baruchman, a nurse of Memphis, Tenn., Max Gallin, a merchant of Cleveland, O. who takes his family with him.

The steamer also carries a shipment of 150 leg horn chickens and hens, the gift of the Jewish farmers of New Jersey to the Palestine Experiment Station at Tel-Aviv, for breeding purposes.

The furniture and personal effects of Dr. Israel Friedlander of the Jewish Theological Seminary, who was murdered in the Ukraine in 1920 were also aboard the steamer for shipment to Palestine for Dr. Friedlander's widow, a sister of Colonel Norman Bentwich, Legal Secretary of the Palestine government.

The steamer also carries a Sefer Torah to be used in the dedication by the American Zion Commonwealth of the colony "Balfouria". The entire cargo and most of the Palestine travelers were booked by the Palestine and Oriental Shipping Service.
