## BULAKIEWITCH, POGROMIST AND INSURRECTIONERY, KILLED BY HIS COUNTRYMEN.

WARSAW, June 14, (Jewish Telegraphic Agency) General Bulak Bulakewitch, well known anti-Bolshevist insurrectionary leader of White Russia, and for some time a fugitive in Poland from Soviet justice, has been found murdered in the vicinity of the Bialowierz Woods, advices to local newspapers say. His assassins are believed to be White Russians who ambushed the bandit leader as he was traveling through the forest. They are said to have executed him as a "national traitor".

The murder of this ruthless insurrectionary and counter revolutionary leader brings an end to the career of a bloodthirsty pogromist. Among the first to organize anti Bolshevist forces against the Soviet Power, he had planned the establishment of an independent White Russian State, with Minsk for its capital. In August 1919 he predicted the fall of Petrograd before October of that year.

At the head of a force said to have numbered 12,000 Cossack and other troops he operated in the vicinity of, and in October 1920 succeeded in capturing the city of Gomel. Emboldened by this victory he proceeded to move his forces from Minsk, which had occupied marching on Kiev.

During these operations, in which he had the cooperation of that other insurrectionary, General Wrangel, he was especially ruthless in his treatment of the Jewish population. In the beginning of February 1921 it was reported by the Federation of Ukrainian Jews that more than 1000 Jews in Minsk and Gomel were killed by his men.

A fugitive from Soviet Russia, the Ukrainian, Jewish and White Russian deputies in the Polish Assembly repeatedly demanded that the Polish government try the bandit leader before a court martial as one of those responsible for the wholesale massacres in White Russia and the Ukraine.

The Jewish students are carrying on accunter agitation, contending that anti-Semitic students are continually upbraiding them for their failure to furnish Jewish corpses.

**HAKENKREUZLER EDITOR "UNFIT TO ASSOCIATE WITH HUMAN BEINGS".**

VIENNA, June 14, (Jewish Telegraphic Agency) Count Kiferst, the editor of the Hakenkreuzler organ "Milel" who was recently removed from his position because of of the police notoriety ne has received lately, has been given a trial by the Hakenkreuzler organization itself.

The anti-Semitic editor was involved in several affairs of the most disreputable nature. The Hakenkreuzler tried their editor and reached a verdict declaring him "unfit for association with human society."

**SEEK DIRECT RELIEF AGREEMENT WITH SOVIET.**

BERLIN, June 15, (Jewish Telegraphic Agency) The Jewish World Relief Conference at its meeting here beginning June 17, will seek to effect a direct agreement with the Soviet government relative to its relief activities among the Jews of Russia.

Hitherto the JWRC has worked through the Nansen Relief Mission in Russia. At present the organization is understood to be negotiating with two large international agencies for the future conduct of its work in Russia and the Ukraine.

**BRITISH CLOSING NET ABOW. BANDITS WHO KILLED GENDARMES.**

JERUSALEM, June 15, (Jewish Telegraphic Agency) The English troops are fast on the heels of the bandits who several days ago killed five of the gendarmes accompanying Sir Herbet Samuel, according to reports received here from Lebanon.

The name of the tribe to which the bandits belonged is not known. Several of the bandits believed to have been involved in the murderous deed have been arrested. One was seriously wounded in his attempt to get away from the British soldiers.

The bandits involved in the slaying of the five gendarmes are believed to belong to a group which has been praying on the villages roundabout for some time, killing many people and bringing about general destruction of property.

**THOUSANDS ATTEND LAST RITES OF DR. KRAUSKOPF.****Wanted "No Signs Of Sorrow".**

PHILADELPHIA, June 15, (Jewish Telegraphic Agency) In accordance with the will of Dr. Krauskopf, whose funeral was held today from the Temple Keneseth Israel, that "there be no signs of sorrow" the ceremony at the obsequies was markedly brief.

The temple was crowded and hundreds of friends and admirers of the noted rabbi unable to obtain seats, stood outside. Only a brief eulogy was delivered. No flowers or draperies adorned the temple.

Dr. Krauskopf's widow, ill at Atlantic City was unable to be present. Among those who attended the obsequies were Mayor Moore of Philadelphia and the representatives of the clergy of virtually all denominations.

Following the rendering of the funeral march, an "ethical will" composed by Rabbi Krauskopf five years ago in which he bade a final farewell to his friends was read.

In the "ethical will" Dr. Krauskopf pleaded for cooperative effort for the welfare of all. He commended especially to their best efforts of his friends the National Farm School, which he founded and which he considered his greatest work. At his express request also Dr. Krauskopf's body was cremated.

**DR. WISE'S SON MAKES UNEXPECTED VOYAGE.**

NEW YORK, June 15, (Jewish Telegraphic Agency) James Wise, the twenty-year old son of Dr. Stephen S. Wise, took an unexpected trip to France, it was revealed here today.

Young Wise, according to Mrs. Wise, boarded the Paris to see some friends off. Entering his friend's cabin, he was overcome by the heat, and slumbered off; awakening after the ship left the port.

Dr. Wise was notified by radio, and arrangements were made by radio authorization of the State Department for the issue of a temporary passport to the young man and for an advance of funds by the ship purser. Young Wise is expected to spend only a few days in Paris, before returning home.

**DR. ROWE ENTERTAINED BY PRESIDENT BERNARDES.**

NEW YORK, June 15, (Jewish Telegraphic Agency) Word has been received here that Dr. Leo S. Rowe, Director General of the Pan American Union has sailed for New York from Rio de Janeiro, where he spent two weeks and was entertained by President Bernardes and also received honors from the Academy of Letters and the University of Rio de Janeiro.
