## SAMUEL IN LONDON, DECLINES STATEMENT, SEES COLONIAL SECRETARY.

LONDON, June 27. (Jewish Telegraphic Agency) Sir Herbert Samuel, British High Commissioner for Palestine, arrived in London last night. He refused to make any statement, successfully evading the questions fired at him at the station.

He called at the Colonial Office this morning, where it is understood he interviewed the Colonial Secretary, the Duke of Devonshire. There is reason to believe the subject of discussion between the High Commissioner and the Secretary was the situation that has arisen in Palestine in consequence of the resignation of the Arab members of the Advisory Council.

## SAYS SAMUEL SHOULD RESIGN.

LONDON, June 27 (Jewish Telegraphic Agency) The "Daily Mail" today publishes a leading article calling upon Sir Herbert Samuel to resign his post in Palestine. Alterations of the policy pursued by Great Britain in Palestine is also demanded in the same article.

Mr. Jeffries, formerly special Palestine correspondent of the "Daily Mail", alleges elsewhere in the same issue that King Hussein objected to the treaty with Britain because he is unwilling to recognize the National Home in Palestine.

The treaty, he says, was forced upon him by the pro-Zionist member of the Government, Ormsby-Gore, who wants to embroil the Arabs against Hussein.

## PHILO-SEMITIC PRINCE ELECTED TO ROUMANIAN SENATE.

BUCHAREST, June 27, (Jewish Telegraphic Agency) Prince Contacuzina, Professor of Jurisprudence at the Jassy University, has been elected to the Roumanian Senate, representing the Jassy Institution. Eleven anti-Semitic professors voted against him, while nine abstained from voting.

**RATHENAU LIBELER WITHDRAWS CHARGE.**

BERLIN, June 27, (Jewish Telegraphic Agency) Captain Mueller von Heusen, publisher of the notorious "Protocols", has consented to publish a declaration that his charge that the frieze on the Rathenau villa representing decapitated monarchs was deliberately placed there to symbolize the overthrow of monarchism, was unfounded.

Mueller is being sued for libel by Mme. Emil Rathenau and it is up to her to withdraw the persecution. The case has been adjourned until Mme. Rathenau's wishes in the matter are consulted.

What caused Mueller to withdraw the charge is that Professor Naager, architect of the house of Emil Rathenau, Father of the assassinated Walter Rathenau, stated the frieze on the house is not Rathenau's invention but was borrowed from a building in Venice.

Capt. Mueller had made much of this offensive frieze, exclaiming pathetically during his trial, "How often the unsuspecting Kaiser entered this house!".

**BRITISH OFFICER'S ARAB MURDERER CAPTURED, KILLED.**

JERUSALEM, June 27, (Jewish Telegraphic Agency) The story of the capture and killing of Abdul Kadir, murderer of Lieutenant Swann, British paymaster, has now been made public and throws light on the circumstances which enabled Kadir to evade his searchers for more than a week.

After murdering Swann, Abdul Kadir hid in a cave near the village of Gimzo. He was in hiding there for a week until Saturday last when he came out of the cave to inquire of the shepherds whether any police are about. He then returned to his cave. The shepherds informed the mukhtar of the village who reported to Capt. Miller, Governor of Ramleh.

With a company of British gendarmes and local police, Capt. Miller surrounded and bombed the cave, Kadir throwing a bomb which did not explode. Miller then shot Abdul Kadir in the neck, and the Arab police dragged the dying man through Ramleh and Ludd until he expired.

**IMMIGRANTS TO PALESTINE COME IN FAMILIES.**

JERUSALEM, June 27, (Jewish Telegraphic Agency) That two-thirds of the Jewish immigrants entering Palestine come in family groups was reported at the conference of immigration workers and representatives of organizations interested in immigration, held here yesterday.

One of the resolutions declares that the immigration is not to be diminished and that its present character as a family immigration be encouraged.

## HAHAM GASTER SAYS ROUMANIA "DISLIKES" REFERENCES TO TREATY.

## Jewish Children in Beirut Taught In 4 Languages.

LONDON. June 27, (Jewish Telegraphic Agency) Speaking at the Anglo-Jewish Association meeting Sunday, Haham Gaster declared facts had shown that he was right in the attitude he had taken on the question of nationality for the Jews of Roumania. He had always insisted, he said, that it was unwise to refer to the minority clauses in approaching the Government. Roumania does not like it, he said.

The meeting approved grants in aid for Jewish schools in Bombay, Beirut and Damascus, as well as for the Evelina de Rothschild School in Jerusalem.

Reports submitted show the Bombay school had 450 pupils. As to the Beirut school which is supported by the Alliance Israelite, by the French government and by parents' fees, besides the Anglo-Jewish Association, the directorate of the school is mixed and the languages of instructions are French, Arabic, Hebrew and English.

Two schools are maintained in Damascus, one for boys and one for girls, the latter having 401 pupils.

## SAY GREAT RELIEF ORGANIZATIONS INTERFERE WITH ORT.

WANZIG, June 27, (Jewish Telegraphic Agency) After hearing reports from representatives of Ort associations in Poland, Lithuania, Roumania, Bessarabia, England, France, Latvia and Germany, the Ort Conference which opened here Sunday, decided to launch more intensive campaigns in the various countries.

Dr. Ch. Zhitlowski and M. Bashein, representing the American association, informed the Conference of the plans under way in America for a campaign in the Fall. The American delegates declared it was absolutely necessary in order to raise funds for the Ort, "to remove the obstacles placed by the great old relief organizations."

The Conference was opened by Leo Bramson. Vladimir Tionkin presided over the second session.

## FEISUL AND ABDULLAH, SONS OF HUSSEIN, KEEN RIVALS.

CAIRO, June 27, (Jewish Telegraphic Agency) The old spirit of rivalry between King Feisul and his elder brother Abdullah is manifesting itself again, according to a writer in SAYASA, an Egyptian paper, who declares that the two brothers had not met since their separation during the war. Abdullah is angry because Feisul had secured the throne of Irak.

Hussein, the father, hates Feisul, and if it had been in his power he would never have agreed to Feisul's kingship over Mesopotamia, the writer states.

As to Feisul this paper declares, he would a thousand times prefer the "British yoke" to being at the mercy of his elder brother and father.

## U.S. MINISTER TALKS TO DANISH JEWS ON JUDAH P BENJAMIN

Philadelphia, June 26 (Jewish Telegraphic Agency). Dr. John Dymeley Prince, American Minister to Denmark, delivered a lecture in Copenhagen before the Jewish Literary Society on the life and public services of Judah P. Benjamin, according to information received by Dr. Cyrus Adler, President of Dropsie College here. There were about 200 persons present including Dr. Simonson, whose jubilee had been recently celebrated. Dr. Simonson later presented to Professor Prince a copy of the Festkrift issued on that occasion.

Professor Prince was for many years a member of the Columbia University Faculty and has written important works in the field of oriental and philological science.

## ITALIAN LAWYER EMBRACES JUDAISM

New York, June 27 (J. T.A.). Abraham ben Abraham was the Jewish name given to Lewis Aldino, an Italian, who has been admitted to the Jewish faith. The operation took place at the East New York and Brownsville Hospital. In applying for admittance to the Jewish faith, Mr. Aldino, who is a lawyer, said he was engaged to marry a Jewish girl whose parents insisted on his becoming a Jew. He stated also that he had been raised among Jews from childhood and felt akin to the Jewish people and religion.

## PALESTINE DEVELOPMENT COUNCIL ORGANIZING IN NEW ENGLAND

Boston, June 27 (J. T.A.). A temporary central committee of the Palestine Development Council with B. H. Waldstein of Boston as Chairman, and Adolph Hubbard as secretary, was organized following the Council's meeting here at the Mlyseum Club, Boston, on June 24. Justice Louis D. Brandeis delivered an address. Robert Szold and Jacob deHaas also spoke. Those present included Rabbis Levi and Abrams of Boston, Rabbi Shohet of Providence, Rabbi Jurman of Waterbury, Judge D. Lourie, Boston, Edward Chase, Manchester, N. H., and Max L. Grant of Providence, R. I., as well as Rabbi Borochoff of Malden and Mr. Louis Feingold of Worcester.
