SAYS ANTI-SEMITES RETARD HUNGARY'S PROGRESS.

BUDAPEST, July 5, (Jewish Telegraphic Agency) Former Premier Karl Huszarr who was bitterly attacked at a meeting of the Chamber by the anti-Semitic deputy Melchiorkiss, vigorously assailed the anti-Semites in his reply.

M. Huszarr, who is vice-president of the Chamber, was attacked for becoming president of a Hungarian bank which was founded by American Jewish citizens hailing from Hungary. His connection with the bank was "unworthy" of a vice-president of the Chamber of "Christian Hungary", his critic charged.

M. Huszarr angrily replied that Hungary would never receive recognition of its rights, if those fighting for Hungarian cause abroad are made scapegoats merely because they are Jews.

"When I visited America" Huszarr exclaimed "I saw these Jewish bank directors raising funds to repatriate Hungarian war prisoners in Siberia. They raised \$835,000 for the benefit of these Hungarians.

"I was attacked in America because of your sins", said Huszarr pointing at the anti-Semitic group. "I have suffered enough because of you, but I am not disposed to remain silent or appear your ally any longer."

LODZ JEWS PROTEST "TREFA" FEEDING.

WARSAW, July 5, (Jewish Telegraphic Agency) Considerable excitement has been created in Lodz as a result of the indiscriminate feeding of children of a summer colony of 2,000 where approximately 70 Jewish children were entertained and were fed ham.

The Jewish children, with the exception of one lad, refused to partake and abruptly left the colony. Orthodox Jewish leaders have protested the act of the managers of the colony.

ANTI-SEMITIC MURDER LIST IS FOUND BY VIEWNA POLICE.

Fourteen Terrorists Arrested.

VIENNA, July 5, (Jewish Telegraphic agency) Fourteen anti-Semites involved in a wholesale murder plot have been arrested as the result of the discovery by the police of a "murder list" prepared by a group of terrorists of Hakenkreuzler affiliations. The murder list contained the names of a number of Jews and liberals generally whom the anti-Semites planned to do away with.

The discovery of the list was made as the result of police investigations of the slaying recently in a forest near Vienna of Konrad Karger.

Karger and his assassin were both members of the anti-Semitic National Socialists. The murderer told the police that Karger was a "traitor to the cause".

The terrorist band is said to number seventy members.

MANY JERS KILLED IN TRAIN COLLISION.

VIENNA. July 5, (Jewish Telegraphic Agency) According to a radioreceived here, a large number of Jews were among the killed and injured in a collision of two trains on the way between Bucharest and Jassy. The Jews constitute the majority of the thirty dead and fifty injured.

SNOWDEN INQUIRES AS TO JEWS IN PALESTINE ADMINISTRATION.

LONDON, July 5, (Jawish Telegraphic Agency) Of the thirty-five leading positions in the present administration of Falestine, only two, exclusive of the High Commissioner's position, are held by Jews.

There are two other held by individuals of Jewish descent, but who nominally at least are not Jews.

This statement was made by Ormsby Gore in Parliament, in reply to a query by Philip Snowden, the labor leader. Mr. Gore pointed out that he had already given an answer to the same question on a previous date, but Snowden desired not only to know the members of the administration who were full fledged Jews but those of Jewish origin professed to be otherwise.

GORKY WRITES SCENARIO ON RUSSIAN JEWS.

BERLIN, July 5, (Jewish Telegraphic Agency) The Russian writer, Maxim Gorky, who is now living in Berlin has completed a scenario titled "The Life of the Russian Jews". This is the first distinctively Jewish work ever written by Gorky.

JEWISH LABOR READY TO TURN TO SYNAGOGUE, ADLER SAYS.

World Court Is Commended by Rabbinical Assembly.

LONG BEANCH, N.J., July 5, (Jewish Telegraphic Agency) Never before in recent history has there been such an opportunity for the synagogue to bring to its side the forces of Jewish labor, Dr. Cyrus Adler told the convention of the Rabbinical Seminary in meeting here vesterday.

Dr. Adler declared that the reason for this sympathetic attitude of labor is to be found in the resentment felt by Jewish labor against the Bolshevist persecution of the Jewish religion in Russia. Labor has now swung to the side of the synagogue and it is the duty of the rabbis to take advantage of this drift, Dr. Adler told the rabbis.

The rabbinical convention also urged the participation of the United States in the "World Court already established or in such other association of the States in the civilized world as shall tend to substitute arbitration and justice for force in settlement of differences between states".

Branding the practice of holding college examinations on Saturday and holidays as un-American the convention in a resolution call upon the Boards of Education and the Boards of Examiners of states and national institutions to arrange examinations and other public excercises on such days as not to compel Jews to violate religious principles.

The convention resolved to draw up a set of principles based on Jewish tradition to guide rabbis in their attitude toward industrial problems and to cooperate with other religious bodies to further social justice. A code of ethics for the relations of rabbis among themselves is also to be formulated.

ARABS THREATEN MON-COOPERATION WITH ENGLAND.

JERUSALEM, July 5, (Jewish Telegraphic Agency) The Arabs will have nothing to do with Great Britain if England does not agree to Arab proposals on the Husseln-British treaty. A statement to this effect was made by the Arab Executive to the J.T.A. representative here.

Unless England agrees, the statement says, to changes in the treaty proposed by Hussein respecting Palestine, the Arabs of Hejjaz, Mesopotamia, Transjordania and Palestine will cease cooperation with England.
