JERUSALEM. July 24. (Jewish Telegraphic Agency) The "Histadroth Haovdim", the Jewish werkers Federation has named a committee of two to visit Russia. They will represent Palestine labor at the international exposition of agricultural products opening in Moscow August 15, at which Palestine products will be on exposition in a special department.

David Ben Gurion and P. Rotberg are the delegates chosen for the Russian visit.

POLISH POLICE CHIEF EMBRACES JUDAISM.

WARSAW, July 23, 'Jewish Telegraphic Agency) Two prominent Poles in the town of Braslovo in the Vilna district, have embraced Judaism. One is Jaszzewski, chief of police of Braslovo, and the other is an army officer named Adamski.

Both are adopting the Jewish faith in order to marry Jewesses.

PALESTINE BUDGET CUT A MILLION DOLLARS.

JERUSALEM, July 24, (Jewish Telegraphic Agency) Palestine Administration is going in very strongly for a reduction in its expenditures and as a result of the retrenchment move, many of the less needed employees have been removed from the Government's payroll.

All departments have been instructed to cut their expenditures to the bone, and the revised annual budget which has been prepared provides for a cut of a quarter of a million pounds or over a million dollars.

VATICAN DESIGNATES OBSERVER FOR THE EAST.

ROME, July 24, (Jewish Telegraphic Agency) Vatican interests in the Holy Land, particularly the holy places, will be looked after by a special emissary, announcement having been made here today that Monsignor Filippi, former Papal nuncio to Mexico has been designated special observer in the middle east.

Monsignor Filippi is charged with conducting a through investigation of the countries to which he is assigned and to report to the Holy See, which will use his findings a a basis for action in those places.

M. Jordanski has been received by the foreign office as the new representative in Italy of the Soviet Government.

LASKER WINS CHESS TOURNEY; MAY CHALLENGE CAPABLANCA.

PRAGUE, July 23, (Jewish Telegraphic Agency) Emmanuel Lasker was crowned victor in the European chess tournament which has just cleased at Mahrisch-Ostrau.

It is predicted that Lasker will now issue a challenge to Capablanca, who won the world championship from Lasker at the Havanna meet.

BAPTISTS AS WELL AS JEWS PERSECUTED IN ROUMANIA.

Geprgia Congressman Plans Move Against Oppression.

STOCKHOLM. July 24, (Jewish Telegraphic Agency) Baptists as well as Jews are being persecuted in Roumania, according to reports made at the world Baptist convention in session here.

Greek orthodox natives persecute Baptists and Jews in the class of unbelievers, raid their meetings, maltreat women and attack men, it was charged.

Congressman William D. Upshaw of Georgia announced, following today's disclosures, that he would initiate a movement to have the Roumanian Government call a halt to these practices.

HUNGARY PAYING FOR NUMERUS CLASUS.

BU...PEST, July 10, (J.T.A. Correspondence) Writing on the subject of the "numerus clausus", "Vilag", a local newspaper, says the number of university students who have emigrated because of the numerus clausus may without exaggeration be estimated at 5,000, possibly 6,000.

The cost of maintenance of these young students abroad must amount on the average to about 130,000 Hungarian Kronen per month. In one year that amounts to 1,300,000 Hungarian Kronen per student. For 5,000 students it amounts to 6½ milliard Kronen. This huge sum, if not more; is lost to Hungary every year because of the numerus clausue.

During the three years in which the numerus clausus has been in operation, Hungary lost in this way about 20 milliard Kronen, the paper asserts.

CLERGY CONTROLS LITHUANIA, SAYS INTELLIGENCE OFFICER.

NEW YORK, July 24, (Jewish Telegrachic Agency) That Lithuania is now "the most oppressed country in the world" and that "it is ruled by the Christian Democratic Party, headed by the Roman Catholic clergy and therefore pro-Polish, reactionary and anti-Semitic" is the charge made in the New York World by Casimir Pilenas, former director of Political Intelligence in Lithuania.

Kowno, he declares, is in the hands of "Jews and

officials".
