ARAB MEMBERS REENTER ADVISORY COUNCIL

Jerusalem, August 1 (Jewish Telegraphic Agency). The probability of cooperation between Jew and Arab, and between the Arab spokesmen and the Government now loom larger than ever before, following the withdrawal of their resignations by the six Arab members of the Advisory Council.

The Arabs' declination to serve on the Council was part of the political sabotage inaugurated by the Arab Executive immediately following the cancellation of the Legislative Council. Since then, Sir Gilbert Clayton, the Civil Secretary and Acting High Commissioner, has been urging the Arab members to reconsider their decision. The Jewish members, too, joined in the successful effort to prevail on their Arab colleagues to serve.

SAMUEL SEES ARABS WHO WAIT TO SEE DEVONSHIRE

HIGH Commissioner To Spend Rest of Vacation In Italy.

London, August 1 (J. T. A.) Sir Herbert Samuel, High Commissioner for Palestine on leave here since early June, yesterday received a delegation of spokesmen for the Palestine Arabs who are waiting here to see the Colonial Secretary, the Duke of Devonshire, to lodge another protest against the Zionist policy.

Sir Herbert left for Italy where he will spend the rest of his vacation. He will be gone, it is expected, until the middle of September when he will return to his post in Jerusalem.

TWELVE ROBBERS EXECUTED IN TRANSJORDANIA

London, August 1 (J. T. A.). Executive of twelve bandits at Ammon, the capital of Transjordan, is reported in a despatch to the DAILY EXPRESS. They were convicted of having ambushed and killed four Arab railwaymen recently. Their sentence was confirmed by Emir Abdullah, the Transjordanian ruler.

TRAVIATA IN HEBREW A GREAT SUCCESS

Jerusalem, August 1 (J. T. A.). A brilliant performance of Traviata, Verdi's famous opera, was given a Hebrew rendering here last night. There was a gala attendance and the many Englishmen, Americans, consuls and high government officials who were part of the audience proclaimed it a great success.

This opera, translated for the first time into ancient Hebrew was presented first at Tel Aviv, under the direction of M. Galinken of Odessa. The cast included Mme. Must of Moscow, and Messrs. Kund and Harmelach.

PALESTINE-SYRIAN FRONTIER PACT

London, August 1 (Jewish Telegraphic Agency). The agreement between Great Britain and France respecting the boundaries between Syria and Palestine is published today by the Colonial Office as a White Paper. The agreement was signed February 3, 1922, by a special commission representing the two governments. It was ratified by both Powers in March 1923. Under this agreement the northern boundary of Palestine extends beyond the Hulah marshes.

CHOLERA IN BESSARIA CLAIMS TEN VICTIMS

Bucharest, August 1 (Jewish Telegraphic Agency). Ten persons have been claimed by the cholera epidemic raging in Bessarabia, an official report here today states. The report adds that panic reigns among the population of eastern Bessarabia in consequence of the large number of sick, dying and dead.

EINSTEIN SORRY HE QUIT LEAGUE INTELLECTUALS

Berlin, July 31 (J.T.A.). Professor Albert Einstein of "Theory of Relativity" fame, speaking at a dinner in honor of the visiting British and French pacifists, said he regarded as ~~unfortunate~~ unfortunate his resignation from the Intellectual Commission of the League of Nations.

Although the League is far from perfect, it has none the less the "most valuable possibilities", Professor Einstein said. The majority of the League leaders, he said, no longer held hopes of realizing to the full the original League ideal. He gave credit to a minority within the League which, he said, was earnestly striving for the improvement of international relations. In conclusion, he urged that Germany must enter the League.

WILLS LIBRARY TO JERUSALEM: ASKS REMOVAL OF BODY THERE ALSO

Warsaw, July 31 (J.T.A.). Leib Davidsohn, prominent orthodox Zionist of Warsaw and for many years a member of the Executive of the Warsaw Kehillah died here at the age of 72. The funeral took place Monday.

Davidsohn bequeathed his large private library to the Hebrew Library of Jerusalem. He also left his estate in Rehoboth, Palestine, to his son on the condition that his son settle there. Davidsohn's son is married to a daughter of the Russian General Rudizki.

Davidsohn requests his friend Podlischewski to use his efforts towards eventually removing his body also to Palestine.

FRANCE HONORS BERGSON, BERNSTEIN

FORD STILL HOLDS "THE JEWS" AND "INTERNATIONAL FINANCIERS" ARE
SYNONYMOUS

"Jews Ordained By God To Clean Up Things That Are Ready To Dis-
appear", He Says.

PRESIDENCY NOT HIS "KIND OF JOB" BUT DOESN 'T KNOW WHAT HE WOULD
DO IN 1926

New York, August 1 (Jewish Telegraphic Agency). Henry Ford,
in an authorized interview reported by Charles W. Wood in COLLIERS
for August 4, declared the presidency is not his "kind of a job"
and that "it is as silly to talk of drafting him as it is to try
to make him volunteer.

Mr. Wood sums up his impression of the hours spent with
Henry Ford at Dearborn while piecing together the interview, that
Mr. Ford's present position on the presidency is "more than a
declination to become a candidate". "Declinations may be over-
ruled by public clamor, but a straight statement of truth cannot.
So long as politics is what it is, Henry Ford simply cannot hold
a political position. He is not a Democrat. He is not a Repub-
lican.. And he has no notion whatever of creating another polit-
ical party in order to do things that political parties cannot
do".

Ford, however, did not explicitly exclude the possibility of
his being a candidate. He did say in answer to a question what
he would do if he were president, "How does any living person know
in 1923, what he would do in 1926 or 1927. If I were president in
1927, what I would do would depend on 1927.

Declaring "no interview with Henry Ford is complete" without
a reference to the Jews, Mr. Wood ~~xxx~~ devotes considerable space
to the question which he tried to "side-step entirely", but Ford
would not let him. What follows is a verbatim reproduction of
what appears to have been said by the interviewer and interviewed
on the subject of the Jews:-

That is the one subject upon which I found it most difficult
to get his point of view; and, naturally, I wanted to side-step it
entire. It really can't be done. References to "the Jews" were
sprinkled quite generously throughout our entire talk.

"Mr. Ford laughed at the newspaper dispatch which announced
that he, through agents in New York, had tried to 'make peace with
the Jews'. He says he has never made war against them; and I, at
least, could never discover any of the ordinary varieties of anti-
Semitism in his attitude. While his position has been very hard
for one to understand, I am sure that it does not suggest either
hatred or fear.

"When the Jews take hold of anything, it goes down', was one
of his commonest observations.

"What do you mean by Jews?' I asked
"The international financiers', he said.

"Then why not say international financiers'? I asked 'Sometimes, after that, he did, but just as often he didn't. 'The Jews', he told me, 'are ordained by God to clean up the things that are ready to disappear'. Then, as though he were merely repeating himself: 'These Jew financiers are not building anything. They wait until things begin to decay; then they get into them'.

"I spent hours with Henry Ford, not arguing his question, but trying to get his point of view. All at once it dawned on me. Perhaps he didn't say anything that he hadn't said before, but he used terms which I could understand.

"Any business," he said, 'which is doing a necessary social service ought to be able, as a general thing, to finance itself, just as any man who is working steadily ought to be able to keep out of debt. Unless there is some laziness - unless somebody is lying down on the job - an industry is not apt to get into a fix where it needs help. But the minute it does slow down, or tries to expand abnormally, the Jews sense it. They are keen-scented watchdogs in this respect. Any institution which has ceased to progress belongs by rights to them and they prepare to take it over. Pretty soon you will find them injecting their wonderful embalming fluid into it which they call 'finance'.

"You probably think the labor unions were organized by labor, but they weren't. They were organized by these Jew financiers. The labor union is a great scheme to interrupt work. It speeds up the loafing. It's a great thing for the Jew to have on hand when he comes around to get his clutches on an industry. Look at the coal business if you want to see the way that the labor unions work with the financiers to paralyze an industry."

URGE RELIGIOUS EDUCATION FOR JEWISH CHILDREN
