JASSY SYNAGOGUES DAMAGED BY STUDENT RIOTERS

Rucharest, August 29 (Jewish Telegraphic Agency). The synagogues of Jassy were damaged and plundered during the attack by students in the Jewish quarter, say reports from Jassy supplementing those previously received. The synagogues shared the fate of the Jewish residences which were pillaged.

The initiator of the excesses, it is learned, is Professor Careanu who has been arrested. Minister of Education Anghelescu today returned to Bucharest and announced steps would be taken to punish the rioters.

JEWISH ARCHITECT'S HAIFA PLAN WINS PRIZE

Berlin, August 29 (Jewish Telegraphic Agency). Herr mendelsohn, the architect who built the famous Einstein observation tower at Potsdam, has been informed that the Prize Court established to examine phans for the business section of Haifa has awarded him the first prize for his design of the commercial district of this harbor city.

CABINET REFUSES MORE POWER TO SAMUEL

London, August 29, (Jewish Telegraphic agency). The request of Sir Herbert Samuel that wider powers be conferred upon him and the Administration in Palestine has been declined, according to the Cairo correspondent of the DAILY EXPRESS. The correspondent asserts that the Areb Delegation has ascertained in official quarters that the British High Commissioner while on leave in London had asked the Government to give him greater lee-way, but that the Cabinet refused.

BAGDAD-HAIFA DESERT ROUTE OPEN

Jerusalem. August 29 (J. T.A.). Mail from London reaches Bassdad in ten days since the inauguration of a motercar service from Haifa to Bassdad. London letters are brought by steamers to Haifa whence they are despatched over the new motorcar route across the desert to ancient Babylonia.

MALARIA EPIDEMIC IN WHITE RUSSIA.

J.D.C. Rushes Car-load of Quinine.

WARSAW. Aug. 28. (Jewish Telegraphic Agency) A carload of quinine was dispatched today from the stores of the Joint Distribution Committee here to the Committee's offices in Minsk, following the receipt of telegraphic requests for a large consignment of the drug to fight the malaria epidemic which is rapidly spreading throughout White Russia.

GERMAN TERRORIST TO DIE FOR PAL'S MURDER.

MUNICH, Aug. 28. (Jewish Telegraphic Agency) The People's Court here today imposed the death sentence upon the young nationalist Zwengauer who was tried and found guilty of the murder of Baur, a young student.

The murderer, according to evidence, was a member of a terrorist gang led by Ruge, a notorious anti Semite. At a meeting on February 13, Ruge extorted the eighty members present to make it their mission to each assassinate at least one prominent German Jew. Baur, it was disclosed during the trial, was for some reason suspected of wavering in his purpose and Zwengauer was ordered by Ruge to execute the student.

Ruge, who was also tried, was acquitted of the murder charge because of lack of evidence, but was sentenced to one year's imprisonment on the charge of having instigated the murder of Jews.

SOCIALIST STUDENTS PROTEST NUMERUS CLAUSUS.

EERLIN, Aug. 28, (Jewish Telegraphic Agency) The proposed percentage norm legislation aiming to limit, almost to the point of exclusion, the admittance of Jewish students in the universities of some of the European countries, is denounced in a resolution adopted today at the Conference of Socialist student societies being held in Neurenburg.

Socialist societies of thirteen European countries are participating in the meeting. The motion to protest against the numerus clausus agitation was made by a delegate belonging to the Socialist Zionist Party.

HEARS HUSBAND MARRYING ANOTHER WOMAN, WIFE KILLS SELF.

WARSAW. Aug. 29, (Jewish Telegraphic Agency) Sarah Rivka Sand, 28, who arrived here from New York the beginning of 1925, committed suicide by hurling herself out of a fourth story window, on hearing that her husband in New York intended marrying another woman in her absence.

TITHUANIA'S PREMIER URGES HARMONY.

KOWNO, Aug. 28. (Jewish Telegraphic Agency) Speaking at the opening on Sunday of the agricultural Exhibit, Frlme Minister Galvanowekis made a bid for the friendship of all minority nationa lities in Lithuania. "The cornerstone of Lithuania's internal policy is the social harmony of all nationalities composing the Lithuanian state", the Premier declared.

Leaders of the minority nationalities are disposed to interpret this as meaning that the Catholic Party, which is now in power, is anxious to bridge over the differences separating it from the non-Lithuanian minorities in Parliament.

ENGLISH CATHOLICS SEE DUTY IN PALESTINE.

No Jews Allowed in Partition

IONDON, Aug. 14, (J.T.A. Correspondence) The duty of English Catholics towards Palestine was stressed at the National Congress of the Catholic Women's League held at Birmingham in connection with the Catholic Congress now in session. The Countess of Denbigh presided.

Lady Mark Sykes, President of the League, said it would be an absolute disgrace if they left Palestine. They had to show that there were English Catholics who realized it as their business to spread the Faith. The responsibility of governing Palestine had been allotted to Britain. Many of the soldiers who fought and died were Catholics. We must not forget that; it puts another obligation upon us.

It was because we had this mandate, because the government was English and our language had become a need to the inhabitants, that English-speaking Catholies mus go forward to the Holy Land, as the Crusaders did in the past.

Dom Bede Camm, speaking of his imprressions of Palestine, said that Bethlehem was the least disappointing centre in the Holy Land. It presented an agreable contrast to Jerusalem, which was full of people averse to them as Catholics, and a dirty and impossible city.

No Jew is allowed into Bethlehom — at least no Jew is allowed to spend a night there. The population of 10,000 comprised 6,000 Catholios and 4,000 Orthodox Christians of the Greek Schism. One felt that Bethlehom had the true Catholic atmosphere.

90,000 JEWS IN CREDIT SOCIETIES OF POLAND.

PARIS. Aug. 19, (J.T.A. Correspondence) According to the latest report of the Ica, the Association supports two hundred and thirty-five Jewish credit societies in Foland, with a membership or ninety thousand. Three milliard marks have been placed at the disposal of these institutions.

In the provinces of Vilna and Gredno the Ica also advanced leans to Jewish agricultural laborers to acquire land.

DR. FRIEDLAND ENDS LIFE IN HIS OFFICE

New York, August 29 (J. T.A.). Suffering from nervous troubles Dr. Martin Friedland, 50 years old, a dentist specialist, committed suicide by inhaling anaesthetic gas in his office, 4 was discovered yesterday by his wife after had been missing from his summer home in Sea Gate for twenty-four hours.

Dr. Friedland was born in Russia and graduated from the University of Pennsylvania Dental School in 1894. He practiced for more than twenty years in Harlem. Recently he suffered from nervous troubles and had been under a doctor's treatment.

EHNERAL OF DR. LEON LOURIA

New York, August 29 (J. T. A.). Services for Dr. Leon Louria, dean of Jewish physicians in Brooklyn, waseheld this afternoon. The funeral procession, starting from the residence, 149 New York Avenue was led by a police escort. A detachment of internes from the Jewish Hospital followed the hearse. The honorary pallbearers included Judges Edward Lazansky and Harry E.Lewis, Nathan S. Jonas and Dr. Frank D.Jemings. At the Training School for Nurses at the Jewish Hospital services were conducted by Rabbi Louis D. Gross, Judge Lazansky and Nathan S. Jonas delivered eulogies.

SHOCHTEM TO STRIKE FOR WAGE INCREASE AND LESS HOURS

New York, August 29 (J. T.A.). Rabbis from all parts of the city met last night at the hall of the Kosher Food Law Board at 66 West 114th Street in an effort to prevent the walkout of RENKIX 300 shochtim. Rabbi Ben Zhon Peurl was appointed Chairman of a committee which he will name and which will try to arbitrate the dispute today.

According to Jacob Rothman, their organizer, ammans the men demand a \$5 increase which would bring their wages up to \$60 a week and a reduction of four hours in work, giving them a forty-eighthour week. Rothman said the dealers had agreed to recognize the shochtim organization, but wanted to make an agreement with them similar to that in force during the last year. If the demands are not met, Rothman declared, there will be no kosher poultry killed after today.

HEBREW CONGREGATIONS UNION TO TAX SYNAGOGUES

New York, August 29 (J. T.A.). To eliminate annual drives for funds and to shift the financial responsibility from wealthy individuals to the congregations, the Budget Appropriation Committee of the Union of American Hebrew Congregations at a meeting yesterday in the Harmony Club formulated a plan whereby the congregations shall contribute a percentage of their total annual income to support of the Union.
