4000 JEWISH REFUGEES ARRESTED IN BESSARABIA.

PARIS, Sept. 28, (Jewish Telegraphic Agency) An appeal has been lodged with the League of Nations against the expulsion of several thousand Jews from Bessarabia, across the Dniestr to Russia.

The Committee of Jewish Delegations, a body representing organizations in various countries banded together for the safeguarding of Jewish rights, has submitted to the League of Nations that the expulsion of the Jews who are refugees from the Ukraine and Russia is in contravention of the Bucharest Government's order, staying the expulsion pending arrangements for the voluntary departure of the refugees under the auspices of Dr. Nansen's Russian Refugee Committee and appropriate Jewish organizations.

Deportation of the refugees across the river to Russia began on Yom Kippur when four thousand unsuspecting refugees were seized and held by the authorities. Since that day hundreds of refugees are being sent across the frontier daily.

ATTACK PASSENGERS WHO LOOK JEWISH.

BUCHAREST, Sept. 28, (Jewish Telegraphic Agency) A train traveling between Jassy and Pascani was stopped by Fascisti and all passengers of Jewish appearance were brutally beaten. The train crew made no attempt to shield the passengers.

Among those attacked was an English Jew who has taken the matter up with the English Embassy here.

MUSSOLINI REMOVES JEWISH APPOINTEE TO PLACATE POPE.

ROME, Sept. 28, (Jewish Telegraphic Agency) Ludoviki Mortara, president of the Central Court of Justice has resigned in favor of Commadore Damelio Mariano, a Catholic appointee of Premier Mussolini.

According to newspaper comments, Mussolini took this step in order to obtain a reconciliation with papacy.

STUDENTS TO STRIKE IF JEWISH PROFESSOR IS NAMED.

PRAGUE, Sept. 27, (Jewish Telegraphic Agency) Protesting against the possible appointment of Dr. Kisch who is a candidate for professorship, the students of the German University here are threatening to strike.

They announce that they are opposed to studying under non-German teachers and they demand that all such teachers be expelled.

In the event the University senate refuses to meet their demands, they declare they will interpret that as indicating the Senate prefers the non-German professors to the German students.

They warn the University authorities too that in the event of any disturbances the university authorities will be held responsible for their refusal to satisfy the students' demands.

TOLD TO GO TO "SCHULE", YOUNG MAN SHOOTS BROTHERS.

LONDON, Sept. 27. (Jewish Telegraphic Agency) Yom Kippur provoked one of the most sensational quarrels that has ever taken place in Manchester Jewry, a young man shooting two of his elder brothers.

Meyer Gordon was shot in the right thigh and the bullet of his brother assailant pierced Benjamin Gordon in the left instep.

Isaac Gordon who did the shooting told the police that his brothers had provoked his wrath by their reproval of him for failing to attend synagogue services on Yom Kippur.

A charge of shooting with the intent to kill was docketed against the young man. The trial has been adjourned.

ARAB LEADER APPEALS TO JEWS TO RETURN TO PRE-WAR STATUS.

JERUSALEM, Sept. 4, (J.T.A. Correspondence) M. Michel Beiruti, member of the former Palestine Advisory Council, and Vice-President of the last Palestine Arab Congress, has published in the important Egyptian daily, "Mokattam", an appeal to the Jews.

Palestine, he writes must be a spiritual home for the Jews, but not a national-political home, which would mean that the Jewish minority in Palestine would rule over the Arab majority. M. Beiruti declares there is a stream of emigration now away from Palestine, which means that millions are being wasted in bringing Jews to Palestine who will not stay. The best course, in his opinion, both for Palestine and the Jews, would be to revert to the conditions prior to 1914.

EMIR "CLEANING HOUSE" AFTER RECENT DISORDERS.

JERUSALEM Sept. 27, (Jewish Telegraphic Agency) Four high officials, one of them an Englishman, have been dismissed from Emir Abdullah's government, and many others banished as a result of the Emir's determination to rid Transjordan of all the suspects connected with the recent disorders there.

Abdullah concentrates his efforts on government circles mainly.

ARABS SEE MILLIONS POURING INTO ZIONIST COFFERS THRU JEWISH AGENCY.

JERUSALEM, Sept. 6, (J.T.A. Correspondence) "Beth el Makdes", after stating that the Jewish Agency will be composed of five Zionist and five non-Zionist members. says:

"Do not let the Palestine population think, on seeing that owing to the crisis in the country numerous Jews leave, that the Zionists are despairing or that their programme is being modified.

"Their endeavors at the recent Congress in Carlsbad to introduce into the Jewish Agency non-Zionists is to be considered as strong support of their programme, for instead of the Zionist Executives receiving thousands of pounds from its followers, it is now going to receive millions of pounds from the Jews of the world. And as money is, after all, the chief factor in this world, the Jewish Agency will do with the increased funds more than the Zionist Executive was ever able to do."

The article concludes: "To unite the will of all Jews is to organize a World Congress in order to lay the foundation of assistance and union. In reality, we, the Arabs, need such a Congress badly. And if we wish to remedy the evil threatening us, the leaders of our national movement must try to convoke such a Congress here, which would take measures to arrange an opposition movement that will protect our interests and that will be able to face our strong enemy".

BAPTIZED JEWS AMONG HIGHER EVANGELIST CLERGY.

LEIPZIG, Sept. 3, (J.T.A. Correspondence) The anti-Semitic weekly "Der Hammer" deals in its latest issue with the strange friendliness of a section of the Evangelist clergy in Germany towards the Jews, and comes to the conclusion that a large number of priests are actually baptized Jews, who like "wolves in sheeps' clothing" have crept into the Christian fold.

"Der Hammer" publishes a list of baptized Jews occupying high positions in the Prussian Consistory, and among other names mentions Josephson, Simsa (Sonnenburg), Isael (Berlin), and Mendelsohn (Meerfeld).

Among the names of a number of priests of supposedly Jewish origin, the weekly includes Hayka (Posen), Lasson (Berlin), Apfelstadt (Thuringia), Raun (Potsdam) Durchstein (Simeledorf), Magnus (Letschin), Mehlrose (Berlin) and Arnold (Lichtenrade).

STUDENTS' ORGANIZATION SUPPRESSED FOR ANTI-JEWISH ATTACK.

BUCHAREST, Sept. 16, (J.T.A. Correspondence) Professor Caludereanu, the Vice-Rector of the Klausenburg University, has suppressed the students' organization, Petru Major, which organized the disturbances at the University last week against the Jewish students.

The authorities declare that they were determined to put a stop to these disturbances, which are holding up the work in the university.

JACOB FISHMAN RETURNS FROM CARLSBAD.

NEW YORK, Sept. 28, (Jewish Telegraphic Agency) Jacob Fishman, managing editor of the Jewish Morning Journal, has returned from an extensive trip throughout Europe.

A delegate to the Zionist Congress in Carlsbad, Mr. Fishman was one of the few Americans to be elected on the Actions Committee of the World Zionist Organization. He was the chief of the pressmen at the Carlsbad Congress.

JEWISH SMUGGLER TO HANG FOR THE MURDER OF SIX OTHER JEWS.

Marks Second Jewish Execution in Fourteen Years.

BUCHAREST, Sept. 28, (Jewish Telegraphic Agency) Jacob Reinitz, one of the most disreputable characters in Roumanian Jewry, has been sentenced to hang for the murder of six Jews.

Reinitz, who was generally known as a successful sackerine smuggler had a method of his own for obtaining money. His general plan was to tell the Jews of the great moneys to be made in smuggling and urge them to join him in his enterprise.

When one of these Jews was persuaded, Reinitz would persuade him to take a considerable sum of money along to buy the goods which was to be smuggled in. The two would proceed to the border and Reinitz then would look for his chance first to rob his victim and then to push him down the mountain side. He would then spread a report that the man was caught smuggling and was shot by the frontier guards.

During the war, Reinitz acted as a military spy, making it his speciality to inform the government of Jewish deserters.

The execution of Reinitz will make the second hanging of a Jew to take place in the country. Fourteen years ago, a Jewish driver was hung for chopping to death a fellow Jew.

PALESTINE INVITES "HAKOAH" FOOTBALL TEAM.

VIENNA, Sept. 28, (Jewish Telegraphic Agency) The Jewish "Hakoah" football team which recently scored against one of the leading teams of England has been officially invited by Sir Herbert Samuel to visit Palestine.

The invitation is from both the High Commissioner and Colonel Kisch, the representative of the Zionist Executive in Jerusalem.

HIGH COMMISSIONER DISTRIBUTES SPORT PRIZES.

JERUSALEM, Sept. 28, (Jewish Telegraphic Agency) The High Commissioner, Sir Herbert Samuel, today presided at "All-Palestinian" sports meet and distributed prizes. The principal prize was won by the Maccabee club of Tel Aviv.
