NEW ARAB PARTY FORMULATES PROGRAM.

JERUSALEM, Oct. 2, (Jewish Telegraphic Agency) A new Arab party has been formed here and has published its program. It announces that it will cooperate with the government, if the government shows any disposition to accept in part its demands.

Its program calls for the absolute rejection of the Balfour Declaration and the present Palestine Constitution. A new constitution is demanded which should include provisions for a Palestine Parliament and compulsory elementary education. The party is also opposed to the "asher" (tax).

CHASSIDIM ATTACK JEWISH WORKERS FOR VIOLATING HOLIDAYS.

WARSAW, Oct. 2, (Jewish Telegraphic Agency) The Jewish Workers' club of Otwock, near Warsaw, was the scene of fighting when Chasidim attacked the members of the club.

The assailants were indignant because the club carried on as usual paying no attention to the Jewish holidays. Ten chassidim and one workman were seriously wounded. They were removed to a Warsaw hospital.

BERLIN JEWS RECEIVE THREATENING LETTERS.

BERLIN, Oct. 2, (Jewish Telegraphic Agency) A large number of Jews of Berlin's west side have received letters threatening them with death if they do not leave Germany within 14 days. The letters are capped with a drawing of a skeleton and bear the inscription "Propaganda Bund". The police are investigating.

GIVES 250,000 FRANCS TO PARIS UNIVERSITY.

PARIS, Oct. 1, (Jewish Telegraphic Agency) The University of Paris has announced the receipt of 250,000 francs from George Blumenthal, of New York.

The money is to be used for scientific research.

JEWES LEAVING GERMANY IN MASSES.**Emigration From Bavaria Particularly Large.**

BERLIN, Oct. 2, (Jewish Telegraphic Agency) Large numbers of Jews, especially those from Russia, are departing in masses for other parts of Europe on account of the steadily growing pressure of anti-Semitism and the difficult economic conditions induced by the fall of the mark.

The majority are heading for Austria and France where living is now cheaper than in Berlin.

A considerable number, too, are seeking to return to Russia, believing that the new economic policy of the Soviet will make it possible for them to earn a living there. Dr. Fridjhof Nansen is negotiating with the Soviet authorities in an effort to facilitate the return of these.

The exodus of Jews from Germany is particularly large in Bavaria on account of the intense anti-Semitism there.

CUZAISTS AND ANTIS QUARREL AT PROFESSOR CONGRESS.

BUCHAREST, Oct 2, (Jewish Telegraphic Agency) Spirited fighting broke out at the All-Roumanian Congress of University professors which met to consider the question of reopening the universities and the numerus clausus.

The fighting occurred between the adherents of the anti-Semitic leader, Professor Cuza and those opposing Cuza. The latter were in the majority. Police were called in to restore order and one police commissioner was injured. A number of students were arrested.

VIENNA JEWS ISSUE JOINT ELECTION APPEAL.

VIENNA, Oct. 2, (Jewish Telegraphic Agency) Jews of all groups have united for the forthcoming elections in October.

Leaders of the various factions have joined in the issue of an election manifesto appealing to the Jews to make their solidarity count at the balloting.

The groups which have joined hands include such divergent elements as the Agudath Israel, the Zionists and the assimilationist "Israelite Union".

The Vienna Jews hope by this unity to obtain the election of two deputies in Parliament, 5 members of the Vienna common council and 10 members in Viennese district councils.

ABDULLAH CONFERS WITH SAMUEL.

JERUSALEM, Oct. 2, (Jewish Telegraphic Agency) The Emir Abdullah, ruler of Transjordan, today paid a brief visit to Jerusalem where he conferred with the High Commissioner on political matters. The details of the conference were not announced.

"ANEPI" SAYS OTTO KAHN DEMANDED ALLEVIATION OF JEWISH FLIGHT.

BUDAPEST, Oct. 1, (Jewish Telegraphic Agency) The "Anep", organ of the "Awakening Magyars" publishes a story to the effect that Otto Kahn, of the Kuhn, Loeb and Co. told the Hungarian authorities that his banking firm would not join in any loan to Hungary unless the Government took steps toward the suppression of the discrimination against the Jews.

The paper concludes its article by warning that if as the result of any failure to obtain a loan, Hungary is crushed, not one Jew will remain alive.

ANTI-SEMITIC PUBLISHER GETS FOUR MONTHS SENTENCE.

Quotes Ford Unsuccessfully in Defense.

LEIPSIG, Oct. 1, (Jewish Telegraphic Agency) A sentence of four months imprisonment was meted out by the Supreme Court of Leipzig to Fritsch, the publisher of the anti-Semitic "Hammer".

The charge against him was for contempt of court in attacking the decision of the court in the Rathenau murder case.

In his defense, Fritsch quoted from Ford's edition of the "Protocols of Elders" and contended that his attacks on Jews were justified and that the Jews were responsible for the devaluation of the mark.

The court, however, decided it would be best for the publisher to think over his charges at greater length in the solitude of four months confinement.

FREE CLINICS FOR DELIQUENTS STARTED.

NEW YORK, Oct. 2, (Jewish Telegraphic Agency) Four free clinics for medical, neurological, psychiatric and physiological examinations and treatment were opened yesterday by the Jewish Board of Guardians, supported by the Federation for the Support of Jewish Philanthropic Societies.

Conducted on most modern scientific lines, the clinics are open to all men and women under the supervision of the Jewish Board of Guardians.

Those eligible to attend the clinics include juvenile delinquent or pre-delinquent cases, girls on probation, and all Jewish men and women on parole from penal or correctional institutions of the city and State.

REPORT TILLINGER IN BUKOWINA.

LONDON, Oct. 2, (Jewish Telegraphic Agency) A report from Czernowitz declares that Elfenbein-Tillinger, the former Bronx Rabbi who was ousted after sensational charges, made his appearance at Contesti, Bukowina, and performed a marriage ceremony in that town.

This report seems hard of credence in view of the fact that only several days ago, according to telegraphic dispatches Tillinger was still in New Orleans, where he was reported as preparing to return to New York.
