PREDICT HALF MILLION POUND CUT IN PALESTINE BUDGET.

Britain Will Stick To Present Policy, Duke of Devonshire Reports.

LONDON, Oct. 4. (Jewish Telegraphic Agency) The British expenditures in Palestine are being reduced and a cut of a half million pounds is expected in the budget for 1924-25, the Duke of Devonshire reported to the Imperial Conference today.

The report also reaffirms that the British policy in Palestine is based on the Balfour Declaration "without prejudice for the rights of the remainder of the population" and declares that Britain will adhere to its present policy whatever the opposition may do, "although it would be glad if the opposition ended".

The budget for 1923-24 is estimated at a million and a half pounds while for 1924-25 it is expected not to exceed a million pounds. Beyond 1925, the report says, Britain has no definite financial obligations in Palestine.

The economic situation has greatly improved, the report declares adding that it regrets to say that the same cannot be said about the political situation. Although Sir Herbert Samuel has been thoroughly impartial, the Arab opposition continues, it declares. The report instances in this connection the non-participation of Arabs in the Palestine elections.

NOT A SINGLE INSPIRING THOUGHT FROM ZIONISTS, SAYS BISHOP.

LONDON, Oct. 4. (Jewish Telegraphic Agency) Five years have passed since General Allenby's liberation of Jerusalem, yet we are not able to say that the Zionists have given Palestine a single, living inspiring thought.

This statement was made by Bishop McInnes in an address yesterday.

URGES PRAYER AS MEANS TO FIGHT ZIONISM.

JERUSALEM, Oct. 4, (Jewish Telegraphic Agency) The use of prayer to combat the Zionist movement is being urged by the Arab organ "Miraat-el Shark". The Moslems are urged to repeat daily in their prayers specified forms of anti-Zionistic statements. The following sentences should be said seven times daily:

"We do not recognize the Balfour Declaration" "We want full liberty" "We want full freedom without any mandates" "We hate the British" "We hate the Palestine government" "Down with Zionism".

"We do not want Zionism", the paper urges should be given an additional recitation or a total of eight times.

The article concludes as follows: "Say, dear readers, this prayer ten times a day and after this if you had sold your lands to Zionists, if you have acted as Zionist agents or received Zionist pay, if you have made the national question a personal one only, if you have been a Zionist or government spy, if you belong to those who let their good houses to Jews and themselves live in bad houses, say this prayer and we are sure that you will be freed of the taint of Zionism and treachery and will become a good and devoted nationalist."

SAYS JEWS PLAN TO SET UP AN INDEPENDENT STATE IN IRAK.

JERUSALEM, Oct. 3, (Jewish Telegraphic Agency) That the Jews are obtaining the best land, buildings and houses in Mesopotamia and that the Zionist movement is making great headway there is the contention of a writer in the Arab organ "El Carmel".

The writer warns that the Jews in Mesopotamia may intend to set up a state of their own there and urges the Arabs to build up their country with their own resources exclusively.

PROTEST JEWS' ENTRANCE TO HOLY PLACES.

JERUSALEM, Oct. 4, (Jewish Telegraphic Agency) Protest against allowing Jews to visit the Holy Places is voiced by the Bethlehem Arab paper "Sut el Shaab" in a recent issue.

The paper declares that by the terms of the treaty between Moslem rulers and the great powers, Jews were barred from the Holy places. Yet it declares notwithstanding this agreement, the government allows the Jews to enter and even gives them a military escort.

CAPITAL ISSUES LIST OF ADDITIONAL QUAKE SURVIVORS.

WASHINGTON, Oct. 3, (Jewish Telegraphic Agency) The State Department has made public another list of names of American survivors of the Japanese quake.

Among them are Siegfried Berliner, Albert L. Leininger, Ada Streck, Mrs. Samuel Wierman and child, H. Rosin, Max Buzel, Pauline Moyer, Ella Mirriam Stillson.

SWISS-JEWISH COMMITTEE ORGANIZED TO AID KEHILLAS IN GERMANY.

ZURICH, Oct. 3, (Jewish Telegraphic Agency) A Swiss-Jewish committee has been organized here to help relieve the conditions of German Kehillas now in distress.

SENTENCED FOR VIOLATING ANTI-SCHECHITA LAW.

ZURICH, Oct. 3, (Jewish Telegraphic Agency) A local "shochet", Blitz, has been sentenced to ten days imprisonment for violating the anti-Schechita law.

The Jewish community is highly aroused over this action of the court.

DR. BLOCH DIES IN VIENNA.

VIENNA, Oct. 4, (Jewish Telegraphic Agency) Dr. Joseph Bloch, Vienna rabbi, who some years ago was a member of the Austrian Parliament is dead.

Dr. Bloch was particularly well known for the prominent part he played in exposing the ritual blood charges in the celebrated Hilsner case. He was publisher and editor of the Austrian "Wochenschrift" Dr. Bloch visited the United States several years ago. He was born in Galicia in 1850.

UNIVERSITY WILL HAVE NO MORE JEWS ON ITS FACULTY, PRESIDENT SAYS.

VIENNA, Oct. 4, (Jewish Telegraphic Agency) The professorial staff of the local Agricultural University has issued a statement declaring that in the future it will not permit any Jews to occupy any place on the faculty.

The German students are right, the statement adds, in contending that the Jews are obstructing the progress of modern culture and ideals.

The statement is signed by Herr Fischer, president of the University. Jewish university men and teachers are much aroused. Never before has in Vienna such an unashamed anti-Semitic statement been issued by their Christian colleagues.

ROUMANIAN PAPER CONDEMNS TREATMENT OF REFUGEES.

BUCHAREST, Oct. 4, (Jewish Telegraphic Agency) The Roumanian liberal organ "Aurora" vigorously condemns the methods being used by the government in its expulsion of the Jews. The practices of the government, it says, are in total variance with all principles of civilization.

In Bessarabia, in particular, it says, the treatment of the refugees is abhorrent. They are being seized like wild animals, arrested and driven like cattle over the border.
