TWENTY WOUNDED WHEN MILITIA STAGE ATTACK.

BERLIN, Oct. 9, (Jewish Telegraphic Agency) Twenty Jews were seriously wounded as a result of a pogrom staged by 600 anti-Semitic militia in Bauthen, the capital of Upper Silesia.

The militia barricaded the Bahnhofstrasse and other leading streets and attacked all Jewish passers-by. The attacks on the Jews continued throughout Saturday night and until the early hours of Sunday.

ROUMANIAN AMBASSADOR DENIES REPORT OF HUSI EXCESSES.

WASHINGTON, Oct. 9, (Jewish Telegraphic Agency) Prince Bibesco in a telephone conversation with the J.T.A. representative here officially denied the anti-Jewish excesses which were reported as occurring recently at Husi.

Bibesco claims the report to be pure fiction.

HAIFA RAILROAD GRIEF WOUNDED BY UNKNOWN ASSAILANT.

JERUSALEM, Oct. 9, (Jewish Telegraphic Agency) Tishbi Rani, senior official of Haifa railways was seriously wounded when attacked by an unknown assailant here. The latter escaped. No motive for the assault is known.

JEWISH EMIGRATION FROM PALESTINE.

JERUSALEM, Sept. 16, (J.T.A. Correspondence) A meeting of the Vaad Leumi was held here last night devoted to the problem of Jewish emigration from Palestine, which for the last few months, has assumed considerable proportions.

It was made clear, however, at this meeting, that the proportion of Jewish emigration is not as alarming as it was supposed. This morning the sitting was continued in conjunction with the Zionist Executive.

SAMUEL PROPOSED ARAB AGENCY, LONDON EXPRESS REPORTS.

LONDON, Oct. 9. (Jewish Telegraphic Agency) Sir Herbert Samuel summoned Arab notables for a conference this Thursday, at which he proposed a new Arab policy. The substance of the new policy was a provision for an Arab Agency for Palestine similar to the Jewish Agency.

A report to the above effect was printed in the London Daily Express. The paper further states that the Arabs rejected the Samuel offer and declared that the Arab delegation had already previously been tendered such a proposal in London and had rejected it.

ENGLISH OFFICIAL TO SUPERVISE PALESTINE EXHIBIT.

LONDON, Oct. 9. (Jewish Telegraphic Agency) The papers providing for Palestine's participation in the British Empire Exhibition have been signed by Walter Cohen, on behalf of Sir Herbert Samuel.

The manager of the Palestine Exhibit, it is learned, will be an English official.

HOMEL RABBI, WHO RESISTED SOVIETS, COMING HERE.

RIGA, Oct. 9. (Jewish Telegraphic Agency) The well known Rabbi Barashanski of Homel has arrived here from Russia. He will leave shortly for the United States.

The Homel Rabbi was imprisoned for eight months for resisting the Soviet move to confiscate the Homel synagogue.

BRISBANE COMMENTS ON VISIT OF ZANGWILL.

NEW YORK, Oct. 8. (Jewish Telegraphic Agency) The following comment is made by Arthur Brisbane relative to the arrival here of Israel Zangwill, in the syndicated column "Today":

"Zangwill is here to visit Nathan Straus and address the American Jewish Congress on "The Problem of the Jewish People". It's an old problem, far from settlement, as old as the problem of a cat with many dogs in the neighborhood.

"It takes much education to teach a dog that there is no good reason for biting a cat. It's hard to teach a cat that it does not pay to scratch a dog's face.

"Human beings hate each other like cats and dogs, because of slightly different characteristics, instead of realizing that a combination of all these characteristics have built the world and everything worth while in it.

"Zangwill attacks Hilaire Belloc's book, "The Jew". That's waste of energy, as foolish as that of the dog who chases a cat up a tree.

"Zangwill has genius, real intelligence; Belloc has neither. His book is a cheap performance, well included in Lloyd George's sufficient description of anti-Semitism as "extraordinarily stupid".

"Zangwill's intelligence shows in the fact that he sees and describes all sides of Jewish character not confining himself to exclusive praise."

ROUMANIAN MINISTER AT WASHINGTON DENIES ILL TREATMENT OF REFUGEES.**Suggests U.S. Jews Help Transport Refugees.**

NEW YORK, Oct. 8, (Jewish Telegraphic Agency) The charge that the expulsion of Jewish refugees from Roumania is being attended with unnecessary cruelty is denied in a letter from the Roumanian Ambassador at Washington to Dr. Stephen S. Wise.

Following the reports of ill-treatment of the refugees, Rabbi Wise requested the Roumanian ministry to use his good offices in behalf of the refugees. The reply of the Roumanian Minister follows:

"Pursuant to my letter of October 1, I wish to inform you that I have just received the reply to the cable I sent two days ago to my government requesting information as to the alleged arrest and deportation of Ukrainian Jewish refugees in Roumania, in violation of an agreement reached by the Roumanian government and the Jewish associations.

"The reply states that I can absolutely deny the allegation that the refugees are being arrested and deported. On the contrary, the evacuation of these refugees is proceeding in accordance with the agreement reached with the Jewish organizations, and an extension of the period has even been granted on account of the slow progress being made with this work. The Roumanian government has obviously not the slightest desire, and still less any interest, in proceeding in a brutal manner towards these refugees instead of allowing them to depart freely under the terms of the agreement which was found to be satisfactory.

"If I may permit myself to make a personal suggestion, it will be that the Jewish organizations in America should reach an agreement with the interested organizations of Europe, with a view of providing additional facilities for the transportation of these refugees to the ports of embarkation, as I gather that the delays are principally due to insufficient means of transportation, an impediment which could only be removed by additional financial means to enable the authorities to improve the transportation facilities."

"ROZWOJ" HENCHMEN PICKET JEWISH BOOK STORES.

WARSAW, Oct. 6, (Jewish Telegraphic Agency) Many book stores conducted by Polish Jews are being picketed by the "Rozwoj" party agitators, threatening would-be purchasers in these stores.

In a large number of cases the pickets are students who, themselves, have books for sale. Many of those who ignore the pickets' warning against buying from Jewish book dealers are assailed. As a result the Jewish book stores are scenes of frequent fighting.

BUTCHER LOSES KOSHER PRIVILEGE FOR YOM KIPPUR SACRILEGE.

ELLENVILLE, N.Y., Benjamin Gehrlich, a Kosher butcher, is without his kosher privileges because he insisted on having a judgement satisfied on Yom Kippur. The Ellenville Hebrew Aid Society was so enraged at the sacrilege it voted to withdraw from Gehrlich the right to have his meat killed by the Rabbi.

ELY BERNAYS, PROMINENT GRAIN MERCHANT, DEAD.

Was Grandson of Gocham Isaac Bernays; Widow is Sister of Freud.

NEW YORK, Oct. 9, (Jewish Telegraphic Agency) Ely Bernays, retired grain merchant, for twenty five years a member of the Produce Exchange died Monday of complications following an appendicitis operation.

Bernays came of a very distinguished family. He was a grandson of the great Jewish scholar Isaac Bernays. His widow, Anna, is a sister of the world renowned psychologist Sigmund Freud.

For years Mr. Bernays was active in Jewish philanthropic work. He was for some time an officer of the Hebrew Sheltering Guardian Society.

UNITED HEBREW TRADES VOTES AGAINST DELEGATION TO PALESTINE.

NEW YORK, Oct. 9, (Jewish Telegraphic Agency) The United Hebrew Trades yesterday decided against sending a delegation at present to Palestine to consider means of cooperating with the organized labor of Palestine.

In the resolutions adopted, the U.H.T. expressed its willingness to aid Palestine cooperative bodies and its sympathy with the labor movement there, but declares that the time is not opportune for the sending of a delegation now.

This action of the United Hebrew Trades is in response to a recent invitation from the organized Jewish workmen of Palestine requesting that a delegation of American Jewish unionists be sent to Palestine in order to effect a closer bond between the two bodies.

REPORT CONVERSION OF SYNAGOGUES INTO RESIDENCES.

BERLIN, Oct. 9, (Jewish Telegraphic Agency) The Russian paper "Dni" reports that a group of workmen in a section of Moscow have requested the Moscow Soviet to permit the conversion of several Jewish synagogues into residences for workmen. The request is reported to have been granted by the Soviet.

CONFIRM SYNAGOGUE ACCIDENT IN WHICH 60 LOST LIVES.

RIGA, Oct. 9, (Jewish Telegraphic Agency) Copies of the "Izvestia" which have just reached here from Russia confirm the tragic accident which took place at a Kiev synagogue in which sixty were killed and more than a hundred seriously wounded.

According to the Moscow paper, the synagogue was crowded with 2,000 worshippers for the joyful festival "Synchas Torah" when a false cry of "fire" was raised which brought on the panic and the consequent catastrophe.
