EXPULSION OF EAST EUROPEAN JEWS HARMS BAVARIAN LABOR

Socialist Organ Deplores Dictator von Kahr's Order Expelling East European Jews.

Munich, October 26 (Jewish Telegraphic Agency). Dictator Von Kahr's order expelling East European Jews from Bavaria is proving "catastrophic" to workers employed by these residents, many of whom have lived in Bavaria for years, declares the Munich Post.

The operation of the expulsion order is indiscriminating, merchants, employers of many laborers, being among those that are sent out of the country.

Although officially the search of houses occupied by East European Jews was undertaken as a sort of hunt for valuta speculators, Jewish families whose houses are visited by the authorities are subjected to the most grilling inquiries. The origin and extent of their wardrobe, the papers they read and their political views - all form part of the searchers' quest for knowledge.

LITHUANIA LIQUIDATES JEWISH MINISTRY

Berlin, October 26 (Jewish Telegraphic Agency). The Lithuanian Government is gradually liquidating the de factor Jewish Ministry, it is learned on the basis of the estimates for 1924. In this budget the sum of 12,000 Lit, slightly above a thousand dollars, has been allocated for the Jewish Ministry for the coming year. This, it is pointed out, will suffice to pay the salary of only a second rate secretary, the ambitious Ministry thus being reduced to the skeleton of a secretariat. All departments attached to the Ministry are being closed, while the Jewish Minister himself remains a member of the Cabinet without a portfolio.

LEAGUE ENVOY STUDIES JEWS' POSITION IN ROUMANIA

Bucharest, October 26 (Jewish Telegraphic Agency). Count Saint Croix, delegate to the League of Nations, who is at present visiting Roumania, has conferred with two of the Jewish representatives to whom he put numerous questions as to the Jewish position in Roumania. The two representatives were Dr. Fielderman and Advocate Magdor.

Mme. Saint Croix in particular evinced an interest in the position of the Jewish women of Roumania.

DMOWSKI BECOMES POLAND'S FOREIGN MINISTER

Warsaw, October 25 (J. T.A.). Roman Dmowski, noted Polish statesman, has accepted the office of Foreign Minister in Premier Witos' Cabinet.

M. Dmowski's appointment to this post was by no means unexpected, the invitation having been extended some time back. He succeeds M. Seyda, whose resignation will have no effect on the other members of the Witos' Government.

Poland's chief spokesman at the Peace Conference, M. Dmowski is considered one of the outstanding Polish statesmen. His attitude on the Jewish question is pronouncedly hostile. In an interview a few days ago he denied the existence of a Jewish question in Poland, but insisted that the percentage norm against Jewish students in universities is purely a government measure.

JEW'S FLEEING GERMANY UNWELCOME IN FRANCE

Section of Press Attacks Government For Admitting Jews.

Paris, October 25 (J. T.A.). Among the 25,000 refugees in Germany who, it is understood, have been granted visas by the French authorities to leave Germany and enter France, there is a large body of Jews, mostly workers formerly employed in the Ruhr industries.

Although the majority of them have experienced no difficulty in finding employment on arrival in France, a section of the press attacks the government for facilitating their admission.

ARREST RABBI AND DAUGHTER IN WARSAW BOMB PLOT

Warsaw, Oct. 25 (J. T.A.) Rabbi Meir Lerner of Lubow, a township in the Ukraine, was arrested with his daughter, along with a number of other alleged suspects, in connection with the investigation being conducted into the explosion recently of the citadel of Warsaw.

The rabbi, who has been a resident in Poland for some time, is being held on the technical charge of failing to establish his right of domicile.

HUSSEIN TO PLACATE JEW AND ARAB, ENVOY SAYS

Jerusalem, October 25 (J. T.A.) King Hussein of the Hedjas, is about to submit a new clause for the Anglo-Arab Treaty with regard to Palestine, providing for a representative government in that country, according to Dr. Najj, the ruler's representative in London.

"I believe the new proposal meets the aspirations both of the Jews and Arabs", Dr. Najj declares.

JORDAN VALLEY ARABS WELCOME SAMUEL

Jerusalem, October 26 (J. T.A.). An enthusiastic reception was accorded the High Commissioner Sir Herbert Samuel on his arrival at Beisan in the Jordan Valley, whence a delegation recently waited upon him in Jerusalem to express their loyalty to the government and avow their friendship for the Jews. The High Commissioner's party was met at the outskirts of Beisan by 400 Arab horsemen who escorted him to the town.

POLISH ZIONISTS SCORE SAMUEL'S ARAB AGENCY PLAN

Warsaw, October 25 (J. T.A.). Leading Zionists of Poland including Deputy Gruenbaum, the head of the Zionist opposition at the Carlsbad Congress, are vehement in their denunciation of High Commissioner Samuel's plan for an Arab Agency in Palestine.

Declaring himself to be "categorically" against any such proposal, Deputy Gruenbaum said this offer to the Arabs renders opposition to the British Government "unavoidable".

Senator Thon characterized the proposal as "illogical, impracticable and inconsistent". Similarly, Dr. Reich and Rabbi Farbstein expressed themselves in principle against the proposal although they preferred to see what action the Zionist Executive would take.

The Zionist representatives have left for London to attend the meeting of the Greater Actions Committee there.

TRIBUTES PALESTINE PAVILLION AT MOSCOW EXPOSITION

Berlin, October 25 (J. T.A.).) The Palestine pavillion at the agricultural exposition held in Moscow impressed profoundly both Jew and non-Jew, reports D. Ben Gorien, representative of the Jewish labor organization of ~~xxx~~ Palestine who was the director of the pavillion.

Russian and Jewish peasants from all parts of the country expressed their astonishment at the products exhibited, declares Mr. Ben Gorien, adding that agricultural authorities asserted that some of the products were unequalled in any part of Europe. Many higher seats of learning carried away some of the products products for more careful study.

ZANGWILL SAYS LLOYD GEORGE'S JOB IS "SECOND RATE"

New York, October 26 (J. T.A.). "Diplomacy is only a second rate job. The job of a writer is to tell the truth".

That was the retort made yesterday by Israel Zangwill noted British novelist to the Jewish Telegraphic Agency report from Cleveland that former Premier David Lloyd George had said that Zangwill was a great writer but not a great diplomat. Mr. Lloyd George was commenting on Zangwill's speech before the recent session of the Jewish Congress that political Zionism was a failure.

Mr. Zangwill said he intended to tell America the truth in his lecture in the Town Hall November 7, adding:

"I anticipate the consequences. I have sent for Mrs. Zangwill so as to have one friendly person near to bury me and wind up my affairs."

RESIDENT BUYERS TO AID JEWISH FEDERATION DRIVE

New York, October 26 (J. T. A.). Eighteen resident buyers of New York have pledged themselves to raise before the end of the year at least \$5,000 each toward the \$700,000 needed by the Federation for the Support of Jewish Philanthropic Societies to complete its 1923 budget of \$3,500,000, it was announced yesterday by Arthur Lehman, president.

S. M. Goldberg, of 1225 Broadway, is chairman of the committee of buyers in the women's ready to wear Business Men's Council of Federation which is conducting the campaign. Associated with Mr. Goldberg are Frank Russek, S. W. Strickman, Max Berlinger, Louis J. Chamansky, Ben H. Sisholz and Sam Sakolow.

NATHAN J. MILLER SUCCEEDS HAYS AS CONGREGATION HEAD

New York, October 26, (J. T.A.) Announcement was made yesterday of the election of Nathan J. Miller, banker, trustee of Temple Emanu-El and prominent in Jewish civic circles, as chairman of the New York Executive Committee of the Union of American Hebrew Congregations. Mr. Daniel R. Hays, who has been chairman for many years, was elected honorary chairman. Morris Rothschild, Ludwig Vogelstein and Meier Steinbrink were named vice-chairmen; Lebbi Isaac Landman, secretary, and Ben Altheimer, treasurer.
