INEMPLOYED PLUNDER JEWISH SHOPS IN GALATZ.

Czernowitz, Romania, October 31. (Jewish Telegraphic Agency).
Most of the Jewish shops in Galatz, Roumania, were plundered Thursday
by crowds of unemployed, Jewish transients passing through Czernowitz
declare.

A menacing anti-Semitic wave is sweeping over that section of Roumania, it is declared.

Confirmation of this report from the supposed scene of disorder is entirely lacking, due perhaps to the censorship probably imposed by the Galatz authorities.

BETHLEN REASSERTS HUNGARY FOLLOWS "CHRISTIAN NATIONAL COURSE."

Budapest, October 31. (Jewish Telegraphic Agency). The present Hungarian Government in its administration of the country's affairs is consistently following along the lines of the "Christian National policy", Prime Minister Bethlen declared in Parliament yesterday.

The Premier at the conclusion of a long address cutlining the Government's policy said that there was a time when the Government was repreached for its alleged anti-Semitism. At present, however, he said, the Government is charged with pursuing a Jewish policy and of having sold itself to the bankers. "Neither of these assertions are true. The Government consistently strives to restore the country to the Christian National course, pursuing such policies, however, as appear to be necessary in view of the immediate requirements."

VON KAHR SUPPRESSES DAILY FOR PROTESTING EXPULSIONS.

Munich. October 31. (Jewish Telegraphic Agency). The Munich POST, Socialist, has been suppressed by order of Dictator Von Kahr in consequence of the publication of articles criticizing the Government for expelling the so-called foreign Jews.

The expulsion of the Jews, initiated last week, continues unabated, the deported "alien" Jews including Jewish families from Prussia and Baden who have resided in Munich many years.

REICH DEPUTIES HEAD MOB IN ANTI-JEW ATTACK.

Berlin, October 31. (Jewish Telegraphic Agency). Two members of the Reichstag, Deputies Graefe and Wille, placed themselves at the head of a miscellaneous crowd which yesterday invaded a number of restaurants and cafes frequented by Jews.

Shouting "Out, you Jewish loafers!" the mcb made for a caste cocupied by an invalid Jewish physicial and his friends, all of whom escaped from the cafe, bleeding profusely as a result of the encounter.

The Nationalists announce that this was but the beginning of a campaign to limit the number of Jewish guests in cafes.

TOMB OF MACCABEE PERIOD UNEARTHED NEAR JERUSALEM.

Jerusalem, October 31. (Jewish Telegraphic Agency). Arab laborers excavating near the River Kidron on the cutskirts of Jerusalem, unearthed a tomb containing four caskets which arehaeologists declare contain the remains of Jewish priests in the Maccabee or Hasmeniac period. The Mebrew inscriptions on the caskets were deciphered as Eliezer, Joshua, Simeon and Shalom-Zion.

Officials of the National Council of Palestine Jews and of the Chief Rabbinate are arranging official reinternment of the remains, simultaneously petitioning the Government to permit the removal of the caskets to the Jewish Archaeological Museum.

PROTEST PRAYERS BY ARABS ON BALFOUR DECLARATION DAY, REPORT.

London, October 31. (Jewish Telegraphic Agency). Special protest pervices will be held in all Palestine mosques on November 2nd, the 6th anniversary of the issuing of the Balfour Declaration establishing a national home for the Jewish people in Palestine, according to a Jerusalem report to the anti-Zionist BAILY EXPRESS here.

"Protest lithurgies" have been arranged for this occasion, during which the Moslem Arabs of Palestine will invoke the Prophet's aid against the British Government's Zionist project, the correspondent states.

The Arab Executive, it is reported, is calling a meeting in revisalem of Notables to induce them to resign from the Legislative runcil. The meeting is scheduled to be held Sunday.

U.S. FEARS FOR JEWS EXPELLED BY BAVARIA

New York, October 31 (J. T.A.) Administration officials at Washington are concerned over the expulsion of Jews from Bavaria and confiscation of their property, says a special Washington dispatch to the New York World today.

Reports of the expulsion were circulated exclusively by the Jewish Telegraphic Agency.

Administration officials indicated, the report continues, the United States could hardly intervene unless American citizens were among those expelled.

The State Department has no confirmation of the reports and no action is expected, it is added.

MASONIC COMMANDER OBLIGED TO QUIT FOR AIDING KLAN

Past Grand Commander Retired In Disgrace Following Disclosure Of Pro-Klan Articles In Masonic Paper.

Washington, October 31 (J. T.A.). That the Klu Klux Klan has spread its tentodes even to the highest places of the American Masonic Organization, which has been presumed at least semi-officially opposed to the Klan, was revealed here by the sensational forced resignation of Judge George Fleming Moore, past Grand Commander of the Supreme Council, thirty third and last degree of Scottish Rite Masonry, Southern Jurisdiction. This jurisdiction includes the entire South.

The resignation became known at the annual assembly of the Supreme Council, which has just concluded its sessions. It was brought to the attention of the body that since the last assembly a Masonic paper edited by Judge Moore, "The Fellowship Forum", published in Washington, has become a semi-official organ of the Klan, many articles having appeared there lauding the masked organization.

Judge Moore, it is understood, was severely denounced by members of the Supreme Council for lending the masonic Organization to furthering the aims of the Klan, and he found so little sympathy from his colleagues that he was obliged to submit his resignation, which was accepted, despite his previous exalted position in the Order. This virtually retired Judge moore in disgrace, an almost unparalelled incident in high Masonic circles, which are exceptionally free from internal dissension.

BARUCH AND MEYER MAY GO ON REPARATION CONFERENCE At least two

Washington, October 31 (J. T. A.). /Jews are prominently mentioned in all the conjectures now rife here with regard to the probable American appointees to the Reparations Inquiry Commission if the projected conference suggested by Secretary Hughes materializes. They are bernard Baruch, Industrial Expert under President Wilson, and Eugene Meyer Jr., Chairman of the War Finance Corporation.

COMMISSIONER HIRSHFIELD REBUKES AID FOR PART IN ZANGWILL-UNTERLYER FIGHT

New York, October 31 (J. T.A.) Commissioner of Accounts David Hirshfield "regrets very much" that Henry H. Klein, Deputy Commissioner of his, mixed in the controversy between Israel Zangwill and Samuel Untermyer.

"I regret very much", Commissioner Hirshfield said, "that Henry H. Klein, a deputy in my office, has seen fit to enter, under his official title, the controversy between Zangwill and Untermyer. Mr. Klein does not in any way represent views similar to mine. In my opinion, it is unfortunate for Zionism that in this controversy persons are injecting themselves who have never studied Jewish history, and never read the Old Test.ment. They have no interest in Judism and simply plunge into the controversy for whatever publicity they can get out of it".

JEWISH CANDIDATES ENDORSED BY CITIZENS UNION

New York, October 31 (J. T.A.) Forty-four of the sixty-two assembly candidates nominated by the Republicans and Democrats were held today by the Citizens' Union to be unworthy of the support of voters in Manhattan and the Bronx.

Assemblyman Steinberg, the only Republican member of the Rules Committee fromthis city in many years, was highly recommended by the Citizens' Union.

"He is a legislator, of courage and wide experience, who has just completed his most useful year at Albany, and who unquestionably deserves re-election on his excellent record".

On the Tammany side, Assemblyman bloch received the highest measure of praise.

Bight Republican and eight Democratic nominees were indorsed in Manhattan and only one of each party in the Bronz. The indorsed Republicans include: Sol Ullman, 6th; Victor R. Kaufman, 7th, Joseph Steinberg, 15th. Among the Democrats Frank A. Carlin, 5th; Samuel I. Posenman, 11th, Maurice Block, 16th, and Joseph A. Cacagan, 22nd. In the Bronx the Republicans approved Samuel Bruckheimer, 8th.

RUSSIAN-AMERICAN INDUSTRIAL CORPORATION PAYS FIRST DIVIDEND

New York, Oct. 31 (J. T.A.). A first dividend of 3% to be paid to the stockholders was announced yesterday by the Directors of the Russian-American Industrial Corporation at 31 UnionSquare. The dividend will apply on about \$300,000 subscribed by five and a half thousand stockholders of the company.

The dividend, it was stated by the corporation's directors vesterday, is paid out of the earnings of the operations of the corporation including their investment in the All-Russian Clothing Syndicate, in which the "R.A.I.C." is co-investor with the Russian Supreme Council of National Economy, the Moscow Experimental Factory, and the Government Clothing Trusts of seven Russian cities: Fetrograd, Moscow, Nizhni-Novgorod, Kazan, Kharkov, Tambov and Reorievsk.

The All-Russian Clothing Syndicate has a total capital of nine million gold roubles (approximately 34,500,000) and covers 25 factories employing 15,000 workers turning out every variety of men's and women's clothing goods, from caps and cloaks to knit goods and expensive fur coats for the Moscow and Petrograd trade.

JEWS' PART IN AMERICA DEPENDS ON HOLD ON IDEALS, WISCONSIN STATE TREASURER SAYS

Minneapolis, Minn, Oct. 30 (J. T.A.) That the Jewish people have a great contribution to make to america, but that that contribution can be made only if the Jews hold fast to the high ideals and traditions of their race, was the statement of Solomon Levi-tan, State Treasurer of Wisconsin, in an address before The Independent Order of Bnia Brith at Minneapolis, tonight. "High on the roll of men who have given great service to this country as Jewish-Americans", Mr. Levitan placed the names of Justice Brandeis, Dr. Simon Flexner, Julius Rosenwald. "These are names to conjure with", declared Mr. Levitan.

"I need to recall to you only a few names to prove that the Jews of today are making a great contribution to America. In the realm of music there is Leopold Auer, Jose h Hoffman, mischa Elman, Zimbalist, Heifitz, Levitski, Morini. On the stage there are belasco, Frohman, Gest, David Warfield, Schildkraut. In the film world there are Lasky, Zukor, Goldwin. In the field of art who has not heard of Jo Davidson, Henry Mosher, or Jules Brotensky.

"In medicine there is the noted Dr. Simon Flexner, there is Dr. Koller who discovered the use of cocaine in surgery; there is Dr. Harry Plotz who isolated the typhus germ.

"In journalism what name shines brighter than that of Adolph Ochs who placed the New York Times in the forefront of American dailies. Among jurists there are Justice brandeis and Louis Marshall to the pulpit there is Rabbi Stephen Wise, in the field of labor there is Samuel Compers: in business there is Julius Rosenwald, Felix Warburg, and Nathan Straus.
