RUSSIANS IN CONSTANTINOPLE MUST ACCEPT SOVIET NATIONALITY

Choice Between Soviet Nationality and Expulsion Puts Jewish Refugees In Predicament.

Constantinople, November 2 (Jewish Telegraphic Agency). The Jewish refugees in Constantinople, said to number a few thousand, are in the predicament of other Russian refugees who are faced with the choice of either accepting Soviet Russian nationality or being expelled from Constantinople.

It is pointed out that if they accept the former, they are likely to be deported to Russia at the request of the Soviet authorities. If they accept expulsion there seems to be no place for them to go except to the United States where the Russian immigration quota is being rapidly exhausted.

The American Red Cross, the Bristol Disaster Relief Committee, an American relief organization at Constantinople, and an "American Society for the Relief of Russian Refugees" are facilitating the departure of the "pure" Russians. These are, for the most part, former soldiers and officers in the Wrangel army for whom deportation to Russia, it is thought, would mean death.

The work is being carried on under the auspices of the League of Nations' High Commissariat for Russian refugees who bear the transport expenses of the emigrants.

The Jewish refugees receive little or no help from these organizations, the other relief associations depending entirely on the Jewish Joint Distribution Committee and the Jewish Colonization Association. It is reported in these quarters that visas have been secured for a part of the Jewish refugees, and that the others are being assisted in settling down to live in Constantinople where they may apply for Turkish citizenship if they should waive the Soviet Russian nationality.

KLAN ADMITS ORGANIZATION IN MORMON STATE

Salt Lake City, Utah, Nov. 2 (J. T. A.). The Ku Klux Klan has, at last, admitted organization in Utah by announcing the establishment of a branch at Ogden, the second largest city in the State. An advertisement declares that the organization is a hundred percent American because it limited its membership to American-born persons and took pride in the fact that by eliminating Catholics and Jews it was 100 per cent Protestant.

ZANGWILL BRANDS AS UNTRUE LIPSKY'S STATEMENT ON PALESTINE RESOLUTION
Of
Israel Zangwill Submitting Copy/His Draft Resolution Shows Congress
Adopted It Almost In Full.

ZIONIST ORGANIZATION CHAIRMAN INSISTS AUTHOR'S VIEWS WERE REJECTED

New York, Nov. 2 (Jewish Telegraphic Agency). Israel Zangwill in a statement to the Jewish Telegraphic Agency has characterized as untrue the assertion by Louis Lipsky, Chairman of the Zionist Organization of America, that "nothing said by Mr. Zangwill in his address or in private was considered by either the Congress or any of its committees".

Mr. Lipsky in denying Mr. Zangwill's claim that the resolution of the American Jewish Congress expressed Mr. Zangwill's views on Palestine called attention to the fact that Mr. Zangwill's suggestion for a solution of the Arab question embodied in his Carnegie Hall speech and by him submitted to the Committee drafting the Palestine resolution were "specifically and unanimously rejected".

In support of his contention that the resolution as finally adopted by the Congress was his, Mr. Zangwill has furnished the Jewish Telegraphic Agency with a copy of the resolution as originally drafted by him. This resolution is the one adopted by the Jewish Congress, with a few exceptions. The last part of the second paragraph which Mr. Zangwill proposed, but the Committee rejected, reads as follows:

"And taking note finally of the address of Mr. Zangwill pointing out that by the conditions of the Balfour Declaration and Mandate, the Arabs of Palestine are justified in demanding a free parliamentary constitution, the only objection to which is that it might be used to nullify the primary purpose of the Balfour Declaration and the British Mandate which requires the mandatory to establish a Jewish National Homeland in Palestine."

The Congress resolution omits also another part of Mr. Zangwill's draft resolution asking to

"grant Palestine the parliamentary constitution desired by the Arabs, subject only to the veto of the British Governor upon all anti-immigration or any other legislation calculated to destroy the creation of the Jewish National Home".

The final clause of the resolution as adopted by the Jewish Congress is textually at variance with the one proposed by Mr. Zangwill, the resolution omitting Mr. Zangwill's proposed references to the Holy Land as the place where Jesus and Mary lived their earthly lives, as members of the Jewish people, and that Jews and Moslems revere in common the memory of Moses.

Mr. Zangwill challenges Mr. Lipsky or other members of the Committee to produce the original resolution prepared before he, Mr. Zangwill, joined the resolutions committee in its labors. Mr. Zangwill says he found the committee's draft to be "incompetent".

The issue between the two appears to be not Mr. Zangwill's authorship of the resolution, which Mr. Lipsky does not contest, but to what extent the resolution as finally adopted by the Congress expresses Mr. Zangwill's views.

Mr. Lipsky claims that in rejecting the concession to the Arabs the Congress rejected Mr. Zangwill's views, whereas Mr. Zangwill insists that in accepting all of his resolution, with the exception of the Arab clauses, the Congress showed it was won over to his views.

ZIONISTS FELICITATE BALFOUR, LLOYD GEORGE ON DECLARATION DAY

Sixth Anniversary of Balfour Declaration celebrated at Zion Commonwealth Luncheon.

New York, Nov. 2 (J. T. A.). The Sixth Anniversary of the publication ~~of the Balfour Declaration~~ of the Balfour Declaration on November 2, 1917, was celebrated this afternoon by leading Zionist workers, the guests at a luncheon at the Commodore Hotel tendered by the American Zion Commonwealth. A cable message to Lord Balfour and a resolution of gratitude to Mr. Lloyd George on the eve of his return to England, were sent off following toasts to both.

In addition to celebrating the Balfour Declaration anniversary, the gathering celebrated dedication by Sir Herbert Samuel of the Colony Balfouria founded by the Zion Commonwealth and named in honor of the author of the Declaration.

Bernard A. Rosenblatt, founder of the Commonwealth presided. Speakers included S. J. Weinstein, President of the Organization, Emanuel Neumann, Jacob Fishman, Miss Henrietta Szold, Rabbi Meyer Berlin, Leon Zolotkoff and Judge Aaron J. Levy.

The Cable Message to Lord Balfour is as follows:

AMERICAN ZIONISTS GATHERED TO CELEBRATE SIXTH BALFOUR DAY AND DEDICATION BY SIR HERBERT SAMUEL OR COLONY BALFOURIA IN GALILEE NALED IN YOUR HONOR SEND HEARTFELT GREEINGS TO AUTHOR OF IMMORTAL BALFOUR DECLARATION

The resolution to be presented to Lloyd George before his departure to England follows:

"This gathering of representatives of American Zionism assembled to celebrate the sixth anniversary of the Balfour Declaration and the dedication by Sir Herbert Samuel of the Colony Balfouria in Palestine named in honor of Lord Balfour rejoice in the fact that the same day marks the presence in our city of the peerless British statesman who was the head of the government which issued the Balfour Declaration, the Magna Carta of the revived Jewish Nation in Palestine. We join with particular pleasure in the enthusiastic welcome of which you are the recipient at the hands of all of our fellow citizens."

CATHOLIC SEES JEWISH CENTERS AS CRIME DETERRENT

Prominent Christian Lawyer-Gives Thousand Dollars to Jewish Community Center at Capital-Felix Warburg Contributes \$3,000.

Washington, Nov. 2 (J. T.A.) Guests at the dinner last night opening the Jewish Community Center campaign received something of a jolt from Frank Hogan, one of the speakers who is a prominent Catholic lawyer. He contributed a thousand dollars towards the building fund, in addition to what was accepted by most of the guests as sound advice.

Urging the Community Center as a best means of stemming the "dangerous tendency towards crime" among Jews, Mr. Hogan asserted there was a considerable increase of crime and delinquency among Jews. Thirty or forty years ago, he declared, there was scarcely a Jewish prisoner at the bar, no gangsters, delinquents or prostitutes. Today, he said, there is an alarming and ever-growing percentage of crime among Jews.

More than half of the quarter of the million dollar quota was raised at the dinner. Felix Warburg, banker and philanthropist, of New York, gave \$3,000. Mabel Boardman, founder of the Red Cross contributed \$500.

The emphasis placed by Mr. Hogan on the importance of a Jewish Community Center at the National Capital is believed by many to have largely assisted toward the success of the campaign.

TO LAUNCH SEMINARY DRIVE AT DINNER NOVEMBER 14

New York, Nov. 2 (J. T.A.) One thousand leading Jewish men and women of New York will be guests at a dinner at the Hotel Astor Wednesday November 14 of the committee organized to conduct a drive for a \$1,000,000 endowment fund for the Jewish Theological Seminary.

The committee is headed by Sol M. Stroock. Among the banquet hosts are Felix M. Warburg, Louis Marshall, Benjamin Altheimer, Justices Irving Lehman and Otto A. Rosalsky, Max D. Steuer and Cyrus L. Sulzberger. The campaign will be launched on Armistice Day, November 11.
