

HAKENKREUZLER PLANNED ANTISEMITIC PUTSCH IN VIENNA

Vienna, Nov. 13 (Jewish Telegraphic Agency). That an anti-Semitic putsch in Vienna was planned to synchronize with the Hitler-Ludendorff putsch in Munich has been disclosed following the arrest here of several of the ringleaders involved in a general Fascisti plot aimed at the Governments of Austria and of Hungary as well as that of Berlin.

A few hours before the Hitler putsch, Hakenkreuzler at a meeting here decided at an anti-Semitic uprising in Vienna. The visit of the Hungarian deputy Ulan was timed accordingly. At this meeting, it is learned, Dr. Suschenwirth, the Chairman of the Vienna Hakenkreuzler, announced that whatever happens to the plot in general, the Jews of Vienna must be expelled.

VETERAN HAKOAH TEAM HARRASSED AT HOME

Vienna, November 13 (Jewish Telegraphic Agency). The glorious victories of the Hakoah football team in encounters with opposing teams at home and abroad notwithstanding, the Jewish football players had been forced to decide that they had better not hold any more matches with Christian teams. This action follows attacks delivered on the football players at every match. It is alleged that in addition to being reviled and hooted on the field the team is generally given unfair decisions. This situation may end in the liquidation of the football team.

MORE RIOTING IN JASSY, UNIVERSITY CLOSED

Jassy, Roumania, November 13 (Jewish Telegraphic Agency). Following attacks by anti-Semitic students during the lectures of Prince Contacuzino, Professor of jurisprudence, the authorities decided to close the university. The Prince has aroused the anti-Semitic students' hostility by his liberal attitude toward the Jewish student body.

ROUMANIAN CROWN PRINCE DENIES AID TO ANTISEMITES

Bucharest, Nov. 13 (Jewish Telegraphic Agency). The anti-Semites' boast that the Crown Prince had promised his assistance to the anti-Semitic students is denied in a semi-official statement just issued.

A deputation of anti-Jewish students waited on the Crown Prince to whom the latter is quoted to have said:

"I advise you to devote yourself to your studies. Your demands for restriction on the freedom of Jewish students are impossible, especially your demands regarding the institution of the numerus clausus. In return for your good behavior I shall

support you in the building of the students' home and in the solidation of your mutual aid organizations".

The Crown Prince is reported also to have denied the petition to release two of the leaders of the recent Fascist plot, Codreanu and Motzo. This was a matter over which the Minister of Justice had sole jurisdiction, the Prince is understood to have replied.

"MODERATE" ARABS' DEMANDS ARE EXTREME

Jerusalem, Nov. 13 (J. T. A.) Arab delegates from various parts of the country representing Moslem sentiment in Palestine are meeting in first conference, in opposition to the leadership of the Moslem-Christian Association. The element represented at this conference was thought to be moderate. It was believed to favor cooperation with the Palestine Government and friendly relations with the Jews. Leaders of this new Arab Party, known as the National Moslem Union, had parted company with the Executive Committee of the Moslem Christian Association because of the latter's unmitigated opposition to both the British and the Zionists.

It was for this reason that the approval by this conference of the program demanding the abolition of the Balfour Declaration and the British Mandate over Palestine and the establishment of a "representative Government for Palestine" came as a surprise to all. The demands are entirely like those put forward by the older party, from which the Moslems were said to have seceded.

SAYS PALESTINE ARABS ARE JEWS CONVERTED TO ISLAM

Dr. Arthur Rupin Says He Will Leave Organization If Zangwill's Views On Arabs Prevail.

Vienna, November 13 (Jewish Telegraphic Agency). Declaring he would leave the Zionist Organization if Israel Zangwill's alleged views on the expropriation of the Arabs from Palestine were to prevail, Dr. Arthur Rupin, the Zionist colonization expert, made the startling assertion that the Arabs of Palestine were descendants of old Palestine Jews who had been converted to Mohammedism.

Dr. Rupin was addressing the convention of Austrian Zionists here. He emphasized that the Arab question can be solved only economically, through cooperation between Jew and Arab in Palestine, and not through politics.

Rejecting Mr. Zangwill's suggestion that there was a time when the Arabs could have been made to trek to some other territory, Dr. Rupin said, "Remember the Palestine Arabs are descendants of the Jews of Old Palestine, converted to Islam".

"Whence this new theory"? some one in the audience asked.

"Release me of Zionist work for one year and I will prove this assertion to be historically correct", Dr. Rupin, who is a member of the Zionist Executive Committee, replied.

JEWS OWE NATIONAL HOME TO LEGION, SAYS PALESTINE SECRETARY

Jerusalem, November 12 (J. T.A.). Ex-service men of the Jewish Battalions which took part in the British campaign against the Turks have banded themselves together in the "Menorah Club". Ex-officers as well as soldiers are admitted into the club on an equal footing.

At the inauguration meeting last night J. Ben Zvi, a member of the Vaad Leumi and an ex-private in one of the Battalions, presided. Addresses were delivered by David Yellin, head of the Vaad Leumi, Governor Storrs of Jerusalem and Sir Gilbert Clayton, Civil Secretary to Palestine. A message was received from General Allenby, High Commissioner for Egypt, and former commander-in-chief of the Egyptian Expeditionary Force.

Jews owe their National Home to the Legionnaires, Sir Gilbert said. General Storrs declared the Government had named the street on which the Menorah Club house is situated in honor of the Club.

BNAI BRITH OF BOSTON DECRY RECEPTION TO HALLER

Protests To President, ~~Smoking~~ Governor, and Mayor Says Polish General Would Not Be Received If Blood-stained Record of His Troops Were Known.

Boston, Nov. 13 (J. T.A.). Regret over the invitation extended to General Haller of Poland to visit Boston is expressed in a resolution adopted by the Amos Lodge and auxiliary of the Independent Order Bnai Brith, with a membership of 1500 and composed of some of the leading Jews of Boston.

The resolution was arrived at the meeting last night by Robert Silverman who is Secretary of the Jewish Congress Committee of Boston. The resolution reads:

"The Amos Lodge expresses its regret that General Joseph Haller has been invited to Boston. We feel certain that had the blood-stained record of General Haller's troops been known the invitation to General Haller to represent Poland would never have been extended".

Copies of the resolution were sent to President Coolidge, Governor Cox and Mayor Curley of Boston. Only a few Jews opposed this action, from which it appears that the Jewish stand against Haller is not divided.

SUFFRAGE LEADER ALLOTS JEWS BIG PLACE IN PEACE

460 Women At Opening of Jewish Women's ~~XXXXXX~~ Triennial Convention in St. Louis.

St. Louis, Mo. Nov. 13 (J.T.A.). "Jewish men and women are going to have a tremendous place when peace comes to the world", Carrie Chapman Catt, famous woman suffrage leader, speaking on the subject of "War and Peace" told the 460 women gathered in the Tenth Triennial Convention of the Council of Jewish Women.

"It is five years since the armistice was signed and peace has not come yet, but when it does come Jewish men and women are going to have a tremendous place in that movement", said Mrs. Catt. "The question before the world today is how we may attain and maintain peace. The League of Nations has been engaged for sometime in gathering statistics concerning armies of the world. The world today wants peace but does not know how to get it. The fault lies neither with the Government nor with the political parties. The people must decide what they want, and then, and only then can world peace be attained."

The Triennial report of the President, Miss Rose Brenner, was read to the delegates. Miss Brenner praised the work of the Council's publications, notably the quarterly, THE JEWISH WOMAN. This publication, the only one in the world devoted solely to the interests of Jewish womanhood, has gone not only to our sections, but to public and college libraries everywhere, and is indeed a magazine worthy of any organization.

Miss Brenner also stated that the Council has spent over \$176,000 during the last triennial period, 1920-1923, in expanding the Council's work in its twenty-one fields of activity.

Mrs. Harry Sternberger, Executive Secretary of the Council, gave a detailed report of the work done in her office. In conclusion Mrs. Sternberger said:

"I regard this convention as a sacred temple, throughout whose daily ritual shall be expressed in new and richer symbolism and thought, the ideals of Jewish womanhood as they have been crystallized in the history and program of the Council. You have been charged, by your co-workers at home, with the sacred mission of bringing back to them the zeal, the inspiration and the burning enthusiasm that shall arouse them from their routine or lethargy and re-vitalize in them the strong emotion that first drew them to the Council."

The Convention opened with 460 women, including 27 national officers of the Council. Two Jewish women leaders from Europe were also present, Frau Sidone Werner of Berlin and Frau Pomerantz Melser of Poland.
