COOLIDGE REJECTS MARSHALL'S PLEA TO ADMIT DEPORTEES

President Declines to Issue Blanket Order, Repeats Promise to Consider Hardship Cases

Washington, November 22 (Jewish Telegraphic Agency). President Coolidge refused in his conference with Louis Marshall today to issue a blanket order admitting all immigrants detained on account of the exhausted Russian quota, but reitzrated the promise already made by Secretary of Labor Lavis to the American Jewish Congress delegation to admit extreme hardship cases, the Jewish Telegraphic Agency correspondent learned from a person authorized to speak for the President. Each case appealed to the Labor Repartment will be considered on its own merits.

Mr. Marshall conferred with President Coolidge twice. He spent a half hour about neon, and emerged hurriedly, apparently perturbed. He flatly refused to make any statement of his interview to newspapermen who tried to intercept him. He proceeded to the Labor Department where he was closeted with Assistant Secretary Carl White, having failed to find Secretary Davis in his office. Within a short time he returned to the White House in company of mr. White, both of whom were admitted to the President.

Upon emerging this time Mr. Marshall told reporters he had appealed to the President for the admission of 700 detained alies on bond for a sufficient period to enable Congress to pass legislation allowing them to remain permanently.

From surface appearances it seems Mr. Marshall's visit made a considerable impression and it is evident the Labor Department officials have been instructed to admit as many as consistency under law possibly allows.

Meanwhile, the policy regarding the hardship cases showed first results when about twenty cases at different ports were allowed to enter late today on nine months bond under an order by Assistant Secretary White, who approved the favorable recommendations of the appeal board.

SAYS JEWS THE CAUSE OF GERMANY'S RUIN

Berlin, November 23 (Jewish Telegraphic Agency). The timeworn accusation that the Jews are to blame for Germany's misfortunes was heard again at the night session of the Reichstag yesterday. Deputy Graefe, well-known anti-Semitic leader, insisted it was Jewish financial circles that ruled termany and that Jewish profiteers were causing the stervation of the German people.

Deputy Graefe recently led an attack on restaurants, in the course of which numerous Jewish guests were assaulted.

RESENTS"LIBEL" HE IS OF JEWISH DESCRIPT

Berlin, November 23 (Jewish Telegraphic Agency). Libel proceedings have been instituted against the "Berliner Tageblatt", by Herr Maretzky, leader of the Stinnes wing of the German People's Party because of a report in that paper that Maretzky is of Jewish decent. The plaintiff considers he had been libelled and is suing for damages AXXXXXX his reputation.

JEWS TO CONTINUE EXCAVATION OF THE CITY OF DAVID

Jerusalem, November 23 (Jewish Telegraphic Agency). Excavation aiming to unearth the ancient city of David is being continued by the Jewish expedition under Captain Raymond Weil of the Sorbonne despite the important discovery by Professor Robert Lacallister of the Palestine Exploration Fund who came across the Jebusite north wall of David's fortifications.

Captain Weil, who is director for oriental studies in the University of Paris told the Jewish Telegraphic agency that his expedition's excavations of the city of David financed by Baron deRothschild of Paris will continue until the Spring under the control of the Palestine Government.

Captain Weil is digging in the vicinity of Professor MacAllister's excavations, harmony and the closest cooperation existing between the two.

FIVE DIE TWO HURT IN JAFFA EXPLOSION

Jaffa, Palestine, November 23 (Jewish Telegraphic Agency, Five persons are dead, two are at the point of death having been scalded when the boil or at the Yeast factory here exploded.

The factory owned by a Mr. Salpeter, a recently arrived pioneer from Hungary, was completely demolished and one worker was killed outright. Salpeter, his wife and two employees, Herman and Fish, died of the wounds yesterday.

JOINT DISTRIBUTION COMMITTEE EXTENDS AID TO SINKING INSTITUTIONS IN GERMANY

Berlin, November 23 (Jewish Telegraphic Agency). The timely aid extended by the Jews of America, through the Joint Distribution Committee, to the sinking Jewish institutions of Germany will enable the institutions to continue their activities. About \$100,000 has been distributed by the combined Jewish communities of Germany among 54 hospitals, 37 homes for the aged, 66 juvenile homes, 24 nurses' schools and 94 other institutions.

Originally allocated for the annual budgets of the institutions concerned, the European representatives of the Joint Distribution Committee authorized the immediate application of the funds to current needs.

DMOWSKI WARNS BAVARIA

Warsaw, November 23 (Jewish Telegraphic Agency). For eign Minister Romen Dmowski of Poland has addressed a new note to Bavaria protesting the expulsions from Bavaria of Jews who are Polish citizens, it is stated.

The Foreign Minister calls attention of Bavarian authorities that the deportations are contrary to international law as well as the common principles of humanity. In conclusion, II. Dmowski threatens to order the deportation of German citizens on Polish soil if the expulsions of Polish citizens are continued.

BRITISH JEWS PAYING FOR PALESTINE PAVALION AT EMPIRE EXHIBIT

The Economic Board for Palestine Hears Optimistic Report.

London, November 23 (Jewish Telegraphic Agency). The Third annual meeting of the Economic Board for Palestine, wednesday evening, heard from Sir Robert Waley-Cohen who presided, that the economic situation of Palestine was better than the press represented it to be. Sir Robert presided in the absence of Sir Alfred Mond, the Chairman, who telegraphed he was unable to attend owing to the election campaign.

Palestine has suffered from the general wave of depression, Sir Alfred reported, the banks having found themselves unable to extend credit. This must have been due, he said, to the fact that no economic progress is possible without political stability. The situation, however, is better than the press represents it to be. The speaker mentioned a number of important enterprises such as the "Shemen Oil Company" and the "Grand Moulin" founded by Baron Rothschild af Haifa. Municipal loans were being given for water supply, which Sir Robert thought would be another paying enterprise.

At the request of the Palesine Government, the Economic Board undertook to guarantee the fund for the Palestine Pavilion at the

Empire Exhibition.

JEWISH ILPORTER OF HEW YORK INNOCENTLY HOLD IN RIGA

New York, November 23 (J. T. A.). Samuel Getmantky, a millinery importer of New York, arrived in Berlin following an extraordinary experience at Riga, where he was arrested ad held forseven days on the charge of having in his possession 2,700 in American Express Checks, says a Berlin despatch today.

After traveling in Germany, Russia and other countries, Lr. G etmansky was arrested in a hotel in Riga and two detectives were detailed to sleep in the same room he and Lrs. Getmansky occupied, merely because a representative of the express company there, Dr. H eyers, complained that somebody had been passing forged checks.

While he remained in confinement his wife frantically appealed to John P. H urley, United Status Consul, who is believed to have cabled to Washington. There were no results, however, until the New Yorker had been detained a week, when the Latvian police declared the charges false and released him. irr Getmansky was later informed that by the American Consul that her husband was not guilty of the charges.

ISADORA DUNCAN'S HUSBAND "DISCUSSES" JENS, LANDS IN LOSCOV JAIL .

New York, November 23(J. T. A.). serge Eggenin, peasant-poet husband of I madora Duncan is in fail in moscow with three ther poets, and likely to stay there a long time, because he "disturbed" Jews too freely while " only mightly drunk, "-according to a copyright wireless despatch to THE NEW YORK TIMES today.

"Hallo, old top," said a cheerio voice, "This is Essenin, and I'm here in Police Station 47 with three other fellows. We want you to tell them to let us out."

"Well, it? like thi?," Espenin tent on readily, "Werwere sitting in a beer saloon getting ready for the celebration, and the conversation turned on the Jew?, Jew? everywhere—even in literature, and so on. Then some chap at the next table butted in and there was a bitter argument, and the result was we got arrested."

"So, not so good," said Tlyedni..

"Not good at all," came the unabashed ruply, "when one blessed Jew ran can put four Russians in jail."

Whereat Tlyendi rang off, and after a mort talk with the Police CCaptain told the latter-perhaps man, in prudence then friend-phip-"I won't back up their rescals; the lam takes its course."

"It appears that Essenin and his friends did not make anti-S emitic remarks, but criticized the position of Jess in the Soviet Government, mentioning well known names. They resisted arrest until a squad of police arrived."

Belle Cohn, Chairman of the Committee.

The Jewish Scholarship Fund announcement follows the recent noming of an Italian Scholarship Fund by the Italian residents of this city, which was also placed at the disposal of the Loman's Medical College.

In honor of the late him Mather Baum, well known Jewish charity worker, who was widely interested in the Education of girls, the scholarship has been named "The Eather Baum Medical Scholarship", and is to be annually awarded to a Jewish weaken student who desired to study medicine.
