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CANADA TO ADMIT JEWISH DEPORTEES FROM U.S.

Canadian Immigration Authorities Accede To Plea For A Temporary Admission of Several Hundred Jewish Immigrants.

Ottawa, Canada, November 28 (Jewish Telegraphic Agency). The Canadian Government has consented to admit all of the several hundred Jewish immigrants ordered deported by the United States Immigration authorities because they came in excess of the Russian quota.

Acceding to the plea by Jewish representatives of Canada and of the United States, the Canadian Immigration authorities decided to admit the deportees as tourists until the opening of the new Russian quota in July, 1924.

United States Secretary of Labor Davis having agreed to permit the detained immigrants to go to Canada instead of being returned to the place whence they sailed for the United States, those of the immigrants still detained on Ellis Island and who were to be deported Saturday, will in all likelihood be detained long enough for arrangements to be made for the transportation to a Canadian port.

The appeal on behalf of the deportees was lodged by a Canadian delegation including Lyon Cohen, President of the United Jewish Organizations of Canada, S. W. Jacobs, member of Parliament and R. H. Wolofsky of Montreal.

The suggestion that Canada be asked to admit the deportees was made by Joseph Barondess, a member of the delegation of the American Jewish Congress following the delegation's visit to Secretary Davis pleading for the temporary admission of the immigrants. The American Jewish Congress later deputed Mr. Barondess to proceed to Canada, and he was in the delegation that waited on the Ministry of Immigration from whom the consent to admit the immigrants was obtained.

Hungarian Statesman Decries Attacks on Otto Kahn As Guest of Hungary Working To Help the Country.

ANTISEMITISM DYING DOWN IN HUNGARY, FINANCE MINISTER AIDE DECLARES

London, November 28 (Jewish Telegraphic Agency). Declaring that opposition in Hungary to the participation of Kuhn, Loeb & Company in the proposed international loan for Hungary was "insignificant", a prominent personage intimately connected with Finance Minister Kallay said it was impossible, even in a country like England, to prevent worthless journals from expressing opinions when patriotism demands silence.

Finance Minister Kallay is now in London conferring with the League of Nations Finance Commission which is considering the Hungarian loan.

The only paper to object to the part of the Jewish banking house in the proposed loan was SZOZAT, the Jewish Telegraphic Agency's informant declared. Anti-Semitism in general was fast disappearing and of official anti-Semitism he said there was but little trace. Of 300 deputies in the National Assembly only 7 are "really" anti-Semites. One of them, Deputy Ulan, has been imprisoned charged with high treason for the Fascisti plot.

The Hungarian Government, he said, is concerned in the consolidation of the country, realizing the benefits to be derived from all sections of the population, discriminating against none. The anti-Semitic feeling in Hungary followed the reaction against Bolshevism during the reign of which many Jews held high positions. The mass of the Jews he declared suffered from Bolshevism like the rest, adding that he personally knew Jews who had been executed by the Bolsheviks. It is unfortunate, he said, that anti-Bolshevist anger was vented against the Jews. But now, all this has died down and the anti-Semites have been left stranded since the great majority of the people ignore them.

MINISTER ROSENBAUM HEALS COUNCIL OF LITHUANIAN JEWS

Kowno, November 28 (Jewish Telegraphic Agency). Dr. Rosenbaum, Minister for Jewish affairs in the Lithuanian Cabinet, was elected President of the National Council of Lithuanian Jews at the Jewish National Assembly which just concluded its sessions here.

A vote of confidence in Dr. Rosenbaum was adopted as also in the actions of the Jewish deputies in the Lithuanian Sejm. The National Council's proposal for the participation of Lithuanian Jewry in the Jewish Agency for Palestine was approved.

JERUSALEM TO BE ELECTRIFIED.

Jerusalem, November 28 (Jewish Telegraphic Agency). Electricity for lighting and heating purposes will soon replace the rather primitive methods still in vogue in this ancient city. The current will come from the power station erected by the Engineer Rutenberg, under a special British Government concession, the LISAN ARAB, an Arab language ~~newspaper~~ newspaper says it learns.

Preparations for the erection of a power station similar to the one at Jaffa and the one contemplated for Haifa, are now under way, this paper asserts.

POALE ZIONISTS PERSECUTED IN POLAND

Warsaw, November 16 (J. T. A. by mail). According to reports from Poale Zion circles in Dublin, searches and arrests have been carried out at the homes of over thirty Polish and Jewish workers, most of them Executive members of Trades Unions and Workmen's cooperatives. The prisoners were confined in the local fortress Sank. In no case was anything suspicious found in their possession. Later, eleven of them, all Jews, including several members of the Borochoew Club, were removed in motor lorries under strong police escort, to the fortress of Luzk. Two days later the Jewish workers, together with thirty members of the pogromists bands of Bulak Balachewitch were transferred to Brest Litovsk.

In the prison of Brest Litovsk, the Jewish workers despite their protests, were placed together with the Balachewitch bands, in front of whom the police denounced the Jews as Bolsheviks.

A TOWN IN ALSACE EXCLUSIVELY JEWISH

Paris, November 18 (J. T. A. by mail). In the provinces of Alsace and Lorraine, there is no town or village, however small, without its church, Catholic or Protestant, except one town only, Foussemagne. Here the traveller is surprised to find not only no church, but not even a cross anywhere. On the other hand, there is a very fine synagogue. On inquiry, it is found that all the inhabitants of Foussemagne, 2,000 persons, are Jews.

APOSTATE TELLS CHRISTIAN AUDIENCE JEWS TRIED TO KILL HIM

London, November 18 (J. T. A. by mail). Mr. Wilkowsky, described as a Polish Hebrew, has been giving his experiences at Scarborough, under the auspices of the London Society for Promoting Christianity among the Jews. He was born, he says, in a little town in Poland. At the Jewish schools he was taught the Hebrew Bible and the Hebrew Prophets. When he reached the age of seventeen he felt he wanted something better. He wanted to see God as "Love"

not as "Revenge". The study of Socialism and Communism did not satisfy him and he went about as a broken spirit. One day, there came to the village a Lutheran priest whose teachings were different from those he had heard before.

Despite his caution the Jews became aware of his movements and one Christmas night his father turned him out of the house. He saw a band of Jews coming after him. "They will kill you", said his friend. Meanwhile his father had made inquiries as to his whereabouts. He came for him and said his heart was broken and he would be allowed to live as a Christian if he would come home. He went home, and then his father's attitude changed. He was closely watched, and among his experiences were 2 o'clock in the morning services. After his father's death, the Jews banded themselves together to kill him and he was only just rescued by Christian friends.

PROMOTE JEWISH LEAGUE OF NATIONS SOCIETIES

Paris, November 28 (J. T. A.) A net-work of Jewish associations throughout Europe to promote interest in the League of Nations is being established with the aid of the Committee of Jewish Delegations, says the Committee's report just issued.

A representative of the Committee recently visited Lithuania for this purpose and a Jewish Society of the League of Nations is expected to be formed. The Committee has also sent representatives to Czech-Slovakia, Austria, Bulgaria and other countries.

The plan to form a Jewish Federation of League of Nations is favored by Professor Ruyssen, General Secretary of the International Federation of the League of Nations Associations, who in conversation with Dr. Leo Motzkin recently said he thought it would be possible for the Jewish League Societies to join the World Federation.

URGE JEWISH WOMEN'S INTEREST IN POLITICS

Pittsburgh, November 28 (J. T. A.) Resolutions urging uniform marriage and divorce laws, entrance of the United States in the World Court, more active interest by Jewish women in Politics, and personal health examinations under state supervision were adopted at the closing session today of the annual state convention of the Pennsylvania Council of Jewish Women at Johnstown, Pa.

Mrs. Charles Lonn of Wilkesbarre, who was recently elected Chairman of Education of the Pennsylvania Federation of Women's Clubs, was elected president of the state organization to succeed Mrs. Eugene Springer of Philadelphia, who becomes honorary vice-president.
