MOND DEFEATED BY JEWISH LABORITE FOR PARLIAMENT

Hadenguest, also Laborite, Defeats E.A. Strauss, Liberal.

London, December 7 (Jewish Telegraphic Agency). Sir Alfred Mond, Liberal, was defeated for Parliament in Swancea by W. Samuel, Laborite. Another labor candidate, Dr. Hadenguest, defeated E. A. Strauss, a previous Liberal member for Southwark. Dr. Hadenguest is the son-in-law of the famous Colonel Julian Goldsmid, who was a friend of the late Dr. Herzl. Dr. Hadenguest is actively associated with the Jewish Sanitary Association, OZE.

Liberals elected include Percy A. Harris for Bethnal Green, Leonard Franklin, Major Hore Belisha. On the Conservative side Sir Walter Defreze was elected and Major J. Brunel Cohen, son-in-law of Sir Stuart Samuel, of Liverpool. Major Cohen was unopposed, as was also Sir Philip Sassoon, Conservative. Sir Philip had served as private secretary to Lloyd George during the latter's Premiership.

Other Jewish candidates whose fate is still in doubt are Samuel Samuel for Wandsworth, A. M. Samuel for Surrey, both Conservatives, Emanuel Shinwell, Laborite, of Scotland, R. B. Solomon Liberal, for Stepney, Councillor Sam Finberg, Conservative, and H. Lisser, Liberal. L. J. Stein, political secretary of the Zionist Organization who accompanied Dr. Weizmann as his secretary on the Zionist leader's first visit to America, is the Liberal candidate for Kensington, whose fate is still unknown.

Captain Foxcroft who had just returned from Palestine where he assured the Afab Executive that he would oppose Zionism even more strenuously in the new Parliament, has been defeated.

## TURKISH CONCESSION HINDERS RUTENBERG'S SCHEME IN PALESTINE

Jerusalem, Dec. 7 (Jewish Telegraphic Agency). The electrification scheme for Jerusalem contemplated under the concession obtained by Pinchus Rutenberg is being hindered because of an old concession granted in Turkish times to M. Nafromato, a Greek. The latter's concession includes the supply of electricity for light and tramways which is covered also in the Rutenberg project.

The Turkish concession has for some reason not yet been voided.

## SHEIKHS HELD AS HOSTAGES IN BEERSHEBA

Jerusalem, December 7 (Jewish Telegraphic Agency). Ten Sheikhs of the Beersheba district are under arrest for their failure to apprehend and surrender a band of brigands endangering the security of the district, it is announced. The Sheikhs are virtually hostages, the British authorities having informed them they will remain in custody until the brigands are surrendered.

## LEAD SEES ARABS BENEFITED BY JEWS

London, December 7 (Jewish Telegraphic Agency). Professor Elwood Lead of the University of California, declared at a luncheon tendered him by the Zionist Organization, that nothing can be of greater value to the Arabs of Palestine than the extension and success of the Jewish agricultural colonies.

Professor Lead is returning to America after a short visit to Palestine at the invitation of the Zionist Organization. Joseph Cowen of the Zionist Executive presided at the luncheon.

Professor Lead said he was interested in Palestine not only because of its agricultural problem but also because of the influence of Zionism upon the stability and political advancement of the country. Zionism, he said, was bound to restore Palestine to its ancient greatness, predicting that within a quarter of a century the far-sighted among the Arabs would cooperate with the Jews.

Before visiting Palestine Professor Lead spent some time in Australia where he was of assistance in planning a colonization project for ex-soldiers involving an expenditure of \$75,000,000.

## LODGE INTRODUCES JOHNSON BILL IN SENATE

Washington, December 7 (J. T.A.) A restriction immigration bill similar to that offered in the House by Chairman Johnson of the Immigration Committee, was introduced in the Senate by Senator Lodge of Massachusetts. The bill provides for the reduction of the immigration quota from 3% to 2%, the quota to be based on the nationality census of 1890.

Senator Spenser of Missouri introduced a bill calling, among other things, for the deportation of aliens guilty of violating the prohibition act.

Representative Graham of Illinois introduced a bill looking to the liberalization of the immigration law.

#### CELLER MOVES FOR GERMAN RELIEF DESPITE AGITATION

Washington, Dec. 7 (J. T.A.) A resolution calling for the relief of starving Germans has been introduced by Representative Celler of the Tenth District, New York.

Congressman Celler, a few days ago, said he was staying his hand from introducing such a bill upon opening of Congress because of the persecution of the German Jews.

"I have already introduced a resolution for the relief of starving Germans" Congressman Celler declared, "as I do not feel it just to visit the sins of the irresponsibles on the innocent and guiltless victims".

#### BOSTON TRANSCRIPT AGAIN RAPS JEWS

##### Sargeant's "Synagogue" A Lively Issue

Boston, Dec. 7 (J. T.A.) The Boston TRANSCRIPT seized another opportunity to attack the Jews for their alleged efforts to receive treatment different from the rest of the people.

The TRANSCRIPT finds fault with the Jews because of Sargeant's painting, the Synagogue, still hanging in the Public Library despite an order of the Legislature for its removal. The painting has caused a new controversy. The State Commissioner of Education, who has been authorized by the Legislature to use the picture for educational purposes yesterday stated that he cannot fulfill the mandate since the painting is objectionable and therefore unfit to be used in art schools.

Boston Jews are said to be determined to demand that the painting be removed in obedience to the law. The subject promises to be a lively issue for the next Legislature. Commenting on this question, the TRANSCRIPT today finds the present situation is "the direct and logical result of all efforts made by any racial or religious group in the country to receive treatment that marks it from the rest of the people".
