CHARGE KAISER PREVENTED DREYFUS VINESCATION

French Annoyed Because Proof of Dreyfus Innocence Held Back By Germany.

Berlin, December 28 (Jewish Telegraphic Agency), The German Foreign Secretary at the insistence of Kaiser Wilhelm prevented the German Ambassador from submitting proof of the innocence of Dreyfus to the French Cahinet, from disclosures of secret documents dealing with the Dreyfus affair revealed.

A collection of archives of the German Foreign Office published yesterday cortained dispatches from the German Ambassador to Paris during the Dreyfus trial, proving that the German secret service did not know Dreyfus whom they considered a victim or other German spies in the French General's staff. Ambassador, Count Muenster, offered to convey this information to the French Cabinet but was prohibited from doing so by the Foreign Secretary acting under instructions of the ex-Kaiser.

Jerusalem, December 28 (Jewish Telegraphic Agency). On the eve of the meeting with his two sons, King Hussein of the hedjas has issued an appeal to the British nation complaining that britain did not fulfill the obligations it had undertaken to help coment unity among the Arab peoples. Hussein deplores that the Arab people charge him with selling their interests to Great Britain and he therefore appeals to Britain to renew its prestige by helping establish a "united Arab nation ruling over all Arab lands

1 DDATO, 17 HURT AT "JEWISH" CHRISTMAS DANCE

Budapest, December 28 (Jewish Telegraphic Agency). A Chrismas dance arranged by a society of Jewish women at Chongrad ended disastrously in the death of one person and the injury of seventeen others.

The bomb is said to have been thrown by a gang of Awakening Magyars who resented a Jewish celebration of Christmas.

Of the seventeen that were hurt when the bomb exploded, seven are in a serious condition and the other ten have gotten off with light wounds.

200 LEAVE WARSAW FOR PALESTINE .

Warsaw, December 28 (Jewish Telegraphic Agency). Two hundred young Jews, mostly members of the Schomer Hazoir left Warsaw yesterday on their way to Palestine. They are going as pioneers of the "Young Guardian Organization".

An enormous crowd gave the pioneers an arousing send-of.

ZIONISTS REJECT SOLOWEITCHIK'S DEMAND

London, December 28 (Jewish Telegraphic agency). The demand for dismissal of Leonard Stein, political secretary of the Zionist Organization, which accompanied Dr. h. Soloweitchik's resignation from the Executive, has been found "not justified" according to a statement by the Zionist Executive Committee.

In a statement issued by the Executive it is declared that Dr. Scloweitchik's demand for Mr. Stein's dismissal was considered at two meetings. The demand was rejected, Dr. Soloweitchik alone voting for it.

The Executive adds it regrets Dr. Soloweitchik's action but declines to enter into public discussion of its statement because it has bearing on the Ziorist relation with the Government and other extrerhal bodies. The whole material relating to the resignation is being submitted to the Actions Committee, it is stated.

Dr. Soloweitchik resigned because he said he found it impossible to share further the responsibility for the constant "sabotage" of the decisions of the Zionist Congress and of the Actions Committee, the decisions of the Zionist Congress and of the Actions Committee, and in the "negligence of the movement". AUTHORITIES WILL NOT DEPORT EXCESS QUOTA IMMIGRANTS

Jewish Representatives Are Told By Commissioner Husband Deportation Is Not Contemplated For Humanitarian Reasons.

Washington, December 28 (Jewish Telegraphic Agency). The fate of approximately 2,400excess quota immigrants, a large proportion of whom are Jews who had been admitted prior to November and charged to subsequent monthly quotas, has been decided in the favor. Deportation was feared in the cases of most of these immigrants because of the ruling of Federal Judge Knox that it was illegal to admit immigrants arriving in excess of a given month's quota and charge them to a subsequent month.

Following Judge Knox's decision officers of the Department of Labor expressed the opinion they would be obliged to call upon these aliens to leave the country and donort them if they would not leave voluntarily. The immigration authorities, however, have decided that "for humanitarian reasons they will take no action whatever toward deportation in view of the traggic circumstances that might result if it were attempted there aliens had been admitted and established their domicile here.

This attitude of the immigration authorities towards these excess quota immigrants became known following a conference between M. D. kosenberg, Washington representative of the Bnai Brith and of the Board of Delegates of the Emerican Hebrew Congregations and Commissioner General of Immigration Husband.

Mr. Rosenberg has succeeded the late Simon Wolf as representative of these two bodies in Washington. He was accompanied by Rabbi Abreham Simon, a member of the Board of Delegates and President of the Central Conference of American Rabbis.

As it was explained this action was taken by ar. Rosenberg for the purpose of forestalling possible deportation action by the mepartment.

URGES BOYCOTT OF JEWS IN BUSINESS

Montreal, Dec. 28 (J. T. A.) A French newspaper publisher ... this city is doing its utmost to infect French-Canadian citizens with the rabies of Judeo-Phobia, declared the Canadian Jewish Chronicle in an editorial in a recent issue.

It carries anti-Jewish articles of the most virulent type and even goes so far as to advise its readers to boycott Jewish places of business. It attempts to show that prominent Jews have made money in business in this city, but forgets to add that every industry headed by a Jew has not only helped to bring prosperity into the country, but has also served to provide work for thousands of non-Jews who might otherwise have swelled the ranks. of the unemployed.

SAYS ANTISEMITISM IS "NON-EXISTENT" IN AMERICAN COLLEGES

"Zeta Beta Tau" Heac " Sees Increase of Jewish Student Activities.

Cleveland, December 28 (JEWISH TELEGRAPHIC AGENCY) The Ku Klux Klan will never be tolerated in American universities, declared Harold Riegelman of New York, National Executive of the Zeta Beta Tau fraternity in his annual report at the opening session of the twenty-fifth annual convention of the fraternity here.

Reviewing the history of the fraternity which was the first Jewish college society founded in America, Mr. Riegelman pointed to the large number of Jewish students taking part in college activities as proof of the fact that anti-Semitism! is "non-existent" in American university life and that it could never thrive there.

"On the whole the status of Jewish college man is decidedly on the up grade, he reported. "Throughout the country the participation of Jewish students in both athletic and non-athletic activities has increased perceptibly and the lengthening list of campus honors accorded these participants is sufficient answer to those who view with skepticism the tolerance and liberality of the American college.

"The University man has marked preferences and certain prejudices; But he has a level head and is neither a knave or a fcol. Consequently he has no stomach for the Ku Klux Klan or any of its implications,"

Representatives of the fraternity from all over/the country are attending its Silver Jubiles. Hon. Julius Kahn, Chairman of the House Military Committee, is Honorary President of the fraternity.

JEWISH CONGRESS TO ACT ON IMMIGRATION CUT AND ALIEN REGISTRY

New York, December 28 (J.T.A.) A special meeting of the Executive Committee of the American Jewish Congress has been called for Sunday afternoon, January 6, 1924. The meeting which will run ever into the evening of that day and possibly will require a third session Menday merning, has been called with a view toward third session menday merning, has been called with a view toward determining the action which should be taken with regards to the proposed changes in the Immigration Law and the proposed registration of aliens.

The meeting, which will be held in the Hotel Astor, New York City, will be attended by representatives of many organizations as well as by members of the Executive Committee.
