FIRST PERCENTAGE NORM MOVE IN GERMANY

Berlin, December 31 (Jewish Telegraphic Agency). The first official move looking to the introduction of percentage norm, limiting the number of Jewish students in Germany's higher seats of learning, was taken yesterday when the student council of the trade-schools representing the majority of the students submitted a memorandum to the "Student Parliament" urging that steps be taken to restrict the number of Jews in universities.

CHONGRAD LONG THE HUNTER'S GROUND OF MAGYAR ANTISEMITES

Scene of Bomb Outrage Ending In The Killing Of One Jewess and the Wounding of Scores of Others Often Visited By Anti-Jewish leaders.

Budapest, December 31 (Jewish Telegraphic Agency). Little surprise is expressed in official circles over the bomb outrage in Chongrad which ended in the death of one girl and the injury of over forty others at a dance arranged by ~~the same woman~~ a Jewish women's society.

Deputy Schardel who is also Secretary of the Ministry of Agriculture told newspaper men here that Chongrad has long been the scene of anti-Semitic agitation.

Magyar leaders as Deputy Ulain, Lengvai, Melchior and others visited the town for anti-Semitic agitation. Recently the Government found it advisable to prohibit all assemblages in the city.

Further details of the bomb outrage show that the explosive was hurled while a charity ball arranged by the Union of Jewish Women was in progress. There were 300 guests present. The bomb which was thrown from the street exploded during a quadrille shortly after midnight. The explosion of the hand-grenade caused havoc, resulting in a panic among the guests who made a rush for the exits. One young girl was killed outright, thirteen were seriously injured and thirty received slight wounds.

Nine of the Awakening Magyars suspected of the crime were taken into custody.

## POLAND'S NEW FOREIGN MINISTER PROTESTS BAVARIAN EXPULSIONS

Warsaw, December 31 (Jewish Telegraphic Agency) Further intervention in behalf of the Polish Jews who have been ordered expelled from Bavaria has been promised by Foreign Minister Bertoni to Jewish deputies who submitted reports alleging the deportation of Jews had not stopped.

The Minister's attention was especially drawn to the expulsions of Jews from Nurenburg.

M. Bertoni declared he would cable the Polish consul at Munich to energetically intervene with Dictator Von Kahr of Bavaria.

M. Bertoni is following the line of action of his predecessor Roman Dmowski who sometime ago notified the Bavarian ~~authorities~~ authorities that Bavarians would be deported from Poland unless Polish citizens of the Jewish faith were allowed to remain in Bavaria unmolested.

## ORTHODOX AND SABBATH VIOLATORS FIGHT BATTLE ON WARSAW STREETS

Warsaw, December 31 (Jewish Telegraphic Agency). Hundreds of orthodox youths clashed with radical youths Saturday when the latter tried to sell the Volkszeitung, the Bundist organ, on the streets. The fighting was confined to the Nalewki and Grzybowska Streets.

The street fighting continued until there were injured on both sides and after the police made prisoners of some of the opposing factions. The orthodox youths included a number of young cheder boys.

The Volkszeitung is the only Jewish newspaper to be printed and offered for sale on the Sabbath. There have been protests for some time and recently the paper complained that Jewish workmen were obliged to rescue the newspaper carriers from the hands of orthodox Jews who resorted to physical violence in their attempt to stop the desecration of the Sabbath.

## BRITISH SEEM PUZZLED BY AMMAN PARLEY

Jerusalem, December 31 (Jewish Telegraphic Agency). British authorities here confessed to an uncertainty as to the real motive prompting King Hussein of the Hedjas to go from Mecca to Amman, the Transjordan capital for the conference opening today.

There are those who believe that the King is simply extending his trip to Amman from Koweit at the head of the Persian Gulf where he met with representatives of the chief Arab States to settle the boundaries of the Arab territories. Sultan Nejd, and

representatives of Transjordan and Irak were present at the conference under the Chairmanship of Colonel Knox, the political officer of the Persian Gulf.

Reports from Amman say that the city/decorated for the reception to the King who is expected there Monday, and the deputations from all quarters of the Middle East are proceeding to the Transjordan capital.

In addition to Sir Herbert Samuel, Sir Gilbert Clayton, his General Secretary, and Governor Storrs of Jerusalem are coming from Palestine.

King Feisul of Mesopotamia is not coming to the conference it is reported, because of the troubles of Mesopotamia, but primarily because there is not much love lost between him and his father, and the continued hostility between himself and his brother Abdullah, the ruler of Transjordan.

It is rumored here that the French authorities in Syria are prepared to offer the Syrian throne to Emir Zeid, the youngest of Hussein's sons. Emir Feisul, the second son, the present King of Mesopotamia which is under British protection, sat upon that throne for three months in 1920, but was put to flight by the French when he asserted his complete independence of French domination.

London, December 31 (Jewish Telegraphic Agency). Commenting on King Hussein's visit to Amman today the Morning Post predicts there is a possibility of an agreement being reached with Sir Herbert Samuel looking toward the eventual establishment of a native government in Palestine. #### APCSTATES AND ANTISEMITES MAKE GOOD BED-FELLOWS

Berlin, December 31 (Jewish Telegraphic Agency). That Jews converted to Christianity make good bed-fellows with anti-Semites is the contention of the Staatsbuergerzeitung, the anti-Semitic organ, opposing the nationalists' snobbishness in excluding apostates from the ranks of Aryan anti-Semites. X-Jews make excellent Jew-baiters, the Staatsbuergerzeitung argues. The paper cites the instance of Israel deHaag, the ~~xxxx~~ Jewish poet and writer, who, having become estranged from the Palestine Jews became a spokesman for the Arabs and the Jerusalem correspondent of the anti-Zionist Daily Express.

## BARONESS MARSHALL PINE AND WISE AT IMMIGRATION HEARINGS

New York, Dec. 31 (J. T.A.) Steps to be taken to assure a liberal immigration policy in the United States and possible measures to prevent the passage of more restrictive immigration legislation were considered Sunday at the home of Louis Marshall by representatives of various important Jewish organizations. In particular, it is learned, the proper method of cooperation in presenting evidence before the Immigration Committee and the House of Representatives which is holding public hearings, was discussed. It is understood it was agreed that a joint committee representing the organizations participating in the conference go before the Immigration Committee Thursday or Friday, the Committee to consist of Louis Marshall, Dr. Stephen S. Wise, Max Pine and Joseph Baroness. These at the conference yesterday included Louis Marshall, President of the American Jewish Committee, Dr. Stephen S. Wise, President of the American Jewish Congress, Max Pine, Secretary of the Hebrew Trade Unions, Cyrus L. Sulzberger, Joseph Baroness, Bernard G. Richards, Arthur M. Lampert, George I. Fox, John L. Bernstein, Jacob Massel and a representative of the Independent Order Bnai Brith.

It was the consensus of opinion that the Jewish representatives cooperate with representatives of other nationalities and all others interested in liberal immigration.

#### CATHOLICS AND PROTESTANTS FOLLOW JEWS IN EDUCATION DRIVE

Roman Catholic, Protestant and Jews Unite in New Year Greeting Urging Religious Education For Youths.

New York, December 31 (J. T.A.) The example of the Jewish Education Association in driving home the necessity of religious education for New York's Jewish children has been followed by leaders in the Roman Catholic and Protestant churches. An appeal was issued yesterday to the citizens of New York of all creeds that all of New York's children have "the priceless boon of religious education." The appeal was in the form of a "New Year's greeting", and was signed by the Rev. Dr. D. de Sola Pool, Rabbi of the Spanish and Portuguese Synagogue, 99 Central Park West, of the Jewish Education Association, acting for the Jewish group; Mgr. Michael J. Lavelle, rector of St. Patrick's Cathedral, for the Catholic group, and Watson S. Moore, a Methodist layman, who is President of the New York Federation of Churches, for the Protestant group. It is the first time that these three faiths have ever united in a religious enterprise. ~~Excerpted~~ In making public the appeal, Mgr. Lavelle made the following statement:

"Our Jewish brethren have been giving extraordinary attention recently to the large number of New York's children who seem to be growing up without religious instruction of any kind. They have made strenuous efforts among the people of their own faith to arouse interest upon this subject. Next, they invited cooperation from the Protestants, through the Federation of Churches, and from the Catholics, through Archbishop Hayes."
