THREE JEWS DEAD IN CHONGRAD BOMB OUTRAGE.

Severely Wounded Include Many Prominent Jewish Residents.

Budapest, January 2. (Jewish Telegraphic Agency) All persons concerned in the bomb outrage at Chongrad several days ago, resulting in the death of three persons and the injury of scores of others, have been arrested, states an official report.

The report discloses the bomb was thrown by a 24 year old farmer named Sinko and that the organizer of the anti-Semitic conspiracy was Acting First Lieutenant Piroskau. Among Piroskau's accomplices from the ranks of the Awakening Magyars were Zubak, a teacher; Kastell, an engineer; and two farmers Sagi and Eorgo; the merchant Piroskau and Boelloenyi, without occupation.

A large store of explosives and cartridges has been found, the police announce.

According to an official report, one Jewish victim died instantly, and another died several days later as a result of the wounds. The seriously injured include Dr. Hermann Fuchs, a lawyer; his son and two daughters; a young Jew named Tobias, whose right arm was blown off; two daughters of Dr. Gross, also an advocate; the pharmacist Krizon and two women physicians, Drs. Veda and Stefania Feher.

The town and state of Chongrad are in turmoil, reports the special investigator of the Jewish Telegraphic Agency who arrived on the scene. His investigation discloses that there were 256 guests at the charity ball arranged by the Jewish Women's Society at the Hotel Koenig-von-Ungarn. Everything was going smoothly at the dance until suddenly at the stroke of midnight during the opening of the quadrille a hand grenade came flying through the window. The ballroom was torn up and the hotel practically collapsed.

Groups of persons were found lying in pools of blood when the panic subsided somewhat. Fortunately there were four uninjured women doctors who were able to render first aid. Imperative operations could not be performed because there was no hospital in Chongrad.

The victims of the explosion include several non-Jews, among them a member of the orchestra Parkas, and a servant girl named Julie Nagyares who was attending the ball with her employers.

Budapest, January 2. (Jewish Telegraphic Agency). The latest reports of the fatalities resulting from the bomb outrage at Chongrad say that a third person has died. The first and immediate casualty was a young girl. Those who died of wounds are Alexander Wolf, a Budapest official and Dr. Krizon, a local pharmacist.

LUZZATTI DEPLORES PERSECUTION OF MINORITIES IN POLAND.

Rome, January 2. (Jewish Telegraphic Agency). Luigi Luzzatti, the veteran statesman writing in the Corriere de la Sera complains of the persecutions against national minorities in the new European states. Long a protagonist of the small nations, especially of Poland, M. Luzzatti asserts that of the minorities the Jews are the chief sufferers, especially in Poland. "We demanded," he writes, "that the Powers deal justly with the small states. These havenow become oppressors and we have to demand from them the equality and justice which was accorded them."

Reviewing the events of 1923, the Corriere de la Sera takes a strong stand against the growth of anti-Semitism in the whole of Europe.

POPE CONCERNED ABOUT CATHOLICS IN PALESTINE.

Rome, January 2. (Jewish Telegraphic Agency). Some concern is felt in the Vatican over the conflicts in Jerusalem between Catholics and the copts, according to reports in the Catholic press. The Holy See resents that the British Mandate for Palestine has had the result of giving an insignificant community like the copts courage to attack the Catholics.

VENEZELISTS OPPOSE JEWS IN SALONIKA.

Salonika, January 2. (Jewish Telegraphic Agency). A section of the Venezelist Party has commenced a widespread anti-Semitic agitation because the Jews abstained from the elections to the Greek Assembly several weeks ago.

To combat this anti-Semitism a mixed Jewish and Greek committee has been formed which has been assured by the Governor-General that he will not permit anti-Semitic agitation and that he is convinced that Jewish abstention from the polls was not because of disloyalty to Greece but on account of dissatisfaction over the separate electoral sector for the Jewish voters.

COURNOS TO WED AMERICAN DIVORCEE.

London, January 2. (Jewish Telegraphic Agency). John Cournos, the Jewish novelist formerly of New York, has become engaged to marry Mrs. Helen Atwood, an American divorcee, according to an announcement.

AMERICAN ZIONISTS OPPOSED LONDON MEETING WITHOUT THEM.

London, January 2. (Jewish Telegraphic Agency). Following representations by the American Zionist Organization against important actions in the movement without their representation, a special meeting of the Zionist Actions Committee has been postponed. The meeting was called for January 3 and to it were invited only the praesidium of the Actions Committee and leaders of the various Zionist groups.

RAISE QUARTER MILLION DOLLARS IN VIENNA FOR RUTENBERG PLAN.

Vienna, January 2. (Jewish Telegraphic Agency). Fifty thousand pounds has been subscribed to the Rutenberg project for the electrification of Palestine by a small number of Vienna businessmen, it is announced. The subscribers to the Rutenberg Company stock include M. Kestranek, a Zionist sympathizer of long standing. M. Kestranek is participating in the establishment of a permanent office in Vienna to keep in close touch with the Rutenberg Company in Palestine.

LONDON TIMES LAUDS PROGRESS OF HEBREW.

London, January 2. (Jewish Telegraphic Agency). The first anniversary of the death of Eliezer ben Jehuda, Hebrew lexicographer and protagonist of Hebrew as a spoken language, was the occasion yesterday for a long article in the London Times, describing the wonderful progress of the Hebrew language. This progress is due to the life work of a single man, the writer says, comparing conditions fifty years ago with the present when theatricals, speeches, papers and schools in Palestine and elsewhere have Hebrew for their vehicle.

KING GEORGE HONORS BRITISH JEWS.

London, January 2. (Jewish Telegraphic Agency). New Year honors announced in behalf of the King include a new Jewish Lord and two knights. Col. Herbert Jessel, an important leader of the Conservative Party machine, has been raised to the peerage. Lord Jessel is the son of Sir George Jessel, the famous judge and first Jewish Master of Rolls. The two Jews to be knighted are Bachelor Storrs and Lewis Cohen, Lord Mayor of Adelaide, Australia.

ADERER, FRENCH JEWISH AUTHOR, DEAD.

Paris, January 2. (Jewish Telegraphic Agency). Adolphe Aderer, Jewish author of numerous novels and plays, is dead here in his 67th year. His latest play, just completed, had Count Tolstoy, the Russian author, for its hero. Some of M. Aderer's plays were performed at the Comedie Francaise. In addition to his more permanent works, M. Aderer was one of France's popular journalists. He was over twenty years dramatic critic of Les Temps and the musical critic of Le Petit Parisien.

SIMON JACOBSON APPOINTED U.S. CONSUL TO CHRISTIANIA.

Washington, January 2. (Jewish Telegraphic Agency). Simon B. Jacobson of Brooklyn has been appointed Consul General for Christiania, capital of Norway, a State Department announcement today says. Mr. Jacobson was born in New York of poor Russian Jewish parents, his father having been a Shochet. Mr. Jacobson possesses considerable consular experience. He was secretary to the American Commission to France in 1915, was Vice-Consul at Bordeaux in 1919, and served as Consul to Alexandria, Egypt, in 1922.

OPPOSITION TO BIBLE READING IN CANADIAN SCHOOL.

New York, Dec. 31, 1923. (Jewish Telegraphic Agency). The aid of the Union of American Hebrew Congregations has been elicited in the agitation that is now going on in the Province of British Columbia to prevent the introduction of the teaching of the Bible in the public-school. Mr. Landsberg of Victoria has been in correspondence with Mr. Charles Shohl, president of the Union, in which he asks for information which would help the Jews of Canada to fight the proposed practise. A resolution was passed at a recent convention of Trustees of the public-school in the province urging the inclusion of Bible teaching in the curriculum. Material furnished by the Union enabled Mr. Landsberg to convince the Minister of Education of the Province as well as members of the Provincial Legislature who have this matter in charge, to withhold the passage of the law which would make Bible reading in the schools compulsory. One of the Trustees of the public-school, Christian Sivertz, has already introduced a resolution attacking Bible reading in the schools on the grounds that this would be contrary to the provision of the School Act, that the school shall be non-sectarian. This resolution will come up for discussion at a later meeting.

PROFESSOR STEIN SEES COOLIDGE AND HOOVER.

Washington, Dec. 31. (Jewish Telegraphic Agency). Professor Ludwig Stein, Foreign Editor of the Vossische Zeitung of Berlin was one of the prominent callers on President Coolidge Saturday.
