FOREIGN LINES WILL REFUSE TO BOOK NON-EXEMPT IMMIGRANTS

Liverpool, January 10 (Jewish Telegraphic Agency) Immigrants who are not exempted under the quota system of the American Immigration restriction act will not, until further notice, be permitted to book passage to the United States, the North Atlantic Passenger Conference, which includes all the principal British and European steamship lines, has issued a circular to all its booking agents ordering them to discontinue the selling of steamship tickets for passages to the United States, where applicants are excluded under the provisions of the American Immigration Restriction Act.

The purpose of this circular is to alleviate the hardships caused to the immigrants by permitting them to make the fruitless trip to the United States only to be rejected at Ellis Island and to save the Steamship Company the expense of the return passages.

Bookings to Canada will in no wise be affected by this order.

----- KADOORIE BEQUEST CAUSES FRICTION BETWEEN JEWS AND GOVERNMENT

Jerusalem, January 10 (Jewish Telegraphic Agency). The Government has today announced the acceptance of the bequest of £100,000 made by the Chinese Jewish magnate Ellis Kadoorie, who in his last will made provision that this money be used by the Palestine Government for the promotion of cultural institutions.

A controversy has arisen between the Jewish representatives and the Government regarding the interpretation of Kadoorie's will. While the Government contends that Mr. Kadoorie's will does not justify the use of his money only for Jewish schools, the Vaad Hair (Association of Hebrew Teachers in Palestine) has publicly protested against this decision. In the memorandum which they presented today to the High Commissioner they claimed that Mr. Kadoorie has left this legacy for the development of Hebrew culture in Palestine.

These attacks have created a nervous feeling among the Jewish refugees.

PALESTINE MUST BE BUILT IN COOPERATION WITH ARABS AND CHRISTIANS
SAYS DR. WEIZMANN

Toronto, January 9 (Jewish Telegraphic Agency). The 19th convention of the Federation of Canadian Zionists opened with a mass meeting at Macy Hall, which was addressed by Dr. Chaim Weizmann, President of the World Zionist Organization, and A. J. Freiman, President of the Federation of Canadian Zionists.

Dr. Weizmann gave a detailed description of conditions in Palestine, declaring that the time had arrived when Palestine must be built in cooperation with the Arabs and Christians.

"It is ridiculous to talk of an exclusively Jewish Palestine", Dr. Weizmann said in the course of his address. "Palestine must be built on the basis of autonomy for all peoples composing the population of the country, as is the case in Switzerland, for example".

Replying to the criticism levelled against the Zionist Administration for not having gotten the Turkish Crown lands from the British Government, Dr. Weizmann declared that it was better to purchase good, arable land, than to take the Government lands which have no water and which are disease-infected.

A. H. Freiman, touched on Israel Zangwill's criticism of the Zionists, which he characterized as destructive criticism which brings no results.

The Convention was addressed by Premier Ferguson and Mayor Hiltz. The Toronto City Hall displayed a large electric shield bearing the inscription: "Welcome, Canadian Zionists". About 3,000 were present at the opening.

The Convention, in regular session assembled, decided to raise \$12,000 for the Hebrew University on the Mount of Olives.

It was decided to appoint a national organizer for the Canadian "Young Judaea", to extend the Zionist propaganda throughout the country, to increase the work for the Jewish National Fund, and to admit every organization paying a dollar a year for each member to membership in the Federation.

A. J. Freiman was re-elected President of the Federation of Canadian Zionists; Leon Cohen, Honorary Vice-president; Mark Workman, Honorary President.

REVEREND McDOWELL PLEADS CHRISTIAN ASSYRIANS BE ADMITTED

Washington, January 9 (J. T. A.) Reverent McDowell, a former missionary in Mesopotamia, came before the House Immigration Committee yesterday to plead the cause of the two hundred thousand Christian Assyrians, whom he declared, have been cruelly persecuted by the Mohammedans. He urged that these surviving Assyrians be taken out of the prohibited class of Asiatics, and that a special quota be instituted to permit all those Christian Assyrians who desire be permitted enter this country.

McDowell was interrupted by Congressman Free of California a member of the Committee, who remarked that he had lived among these Assyrians but preferred to live among rats, and he did not care if they ~~xxxx~~ were all exterminated, they should never be admitted to the United States.

JEWISH CONGREGATION CELEBRATES HUNDRETH ANNIVERSARY

Cincinnati, January 8 (J. T. A.) The one hundredth anniversary of the Bene Israel Congregation, the oldest Jewish Congregation west of the Atlantic seaboard, will be celebrated on January 18th and 19th.

The history of the congregation dates practically from the first coming of Jews to the territory west of the Alleghenies. The first Jewish settler was Joseph Jonas a native of Plymouth, England, who arrived in Cincinnati in March, 1817. The town at that time at that time had about six thousand inhabitants. Within the next two years several other Englishmen of the Jewish faith joined him and in the Fall of 1819 the first Jewish worship in this western territory was held on the High Holy days. Such services were held annually until the year 1824 when there were enough Jews in the town to organize a congregation. In memoir written in 1842 Joseph Jonas the pioneer stated that it was his constant prayer from the day of his arrival "that he might be a nucleus about which the first congregation might be formed to worship God in this great western territory". This prayer was fulfilled when on January 18, 1824, ten men organized the Bene Israel Congregation. These pioneers and founders were Joseph Jonas, David Israel Johnson, Morris Moses, Jonas Levy, Solomon Moses, Simeon Moses, Phineas Moses, Samuel Jonas, Solomon Buckingham and Morris Symonds. Joseph Jonas was elected Parnass and Phineas Moses and Jonas Levy Gabbain.

The congregation numbered many distinguished men in its membership. Two presidents of the Union of American Hebrew Congregations, namely Julius Freiberg and J. Walter Freiberg were members of the Congregation. The President of the Board of Governors of the Hebrew Union College Alfred M. Cohen and the President of the National Sisterhoods, Mrs. J. Walter Freiberg, are members:

NEGRO EDITORS OFFER WORKS OF NEGRO AUTHORS FOR JEWISH LIBRARY IN PALESTINE

New York, January 10, (Jewish Telegraphic Agency) A. Philip Pandolph and Chandler Owen, Editors of The Messenger, leading organ of negro opinion, in a letter addressed to Dr. Chaim Weizmann, President of the World Zionist Organization, offer to collect the works of representative negro authors for the Jewish Library in Palestine, to the end that a greater bond of friendship and understanding be promoted between the Jewish and Negro peoples of the world.

The letter, in part, follows:

"To the end of rendering available to the Jewish thinkers the works of Negro scholars, I want to suggest and request that a section of the Library be set aside for Negro literature by Negro writers, so that Negro life and culture by Negro authors may be presented authoritatively to the Jewish world.

"Now, in order that the collection of these works may not constitute a burden on you, permit me to offer my services in assembling the most notable works and presenting them as a gift to the library through the medium of The Messenger from the Negro Race. It may be considered as a gift from the race, since I shall solicit the works from individual Negroes and Negro institutions."
