EXPULSIONS OF JEWS STOPPED BY JEWISH DEPUTIES

Kowno, January 15 (Jewish Telegraphic Agency). Because of the facts laid bare in a memorandum prepared by the Jewish deputies, the Minister of Interior Schalkanskas, has rescinded the orders expelling the Jewish aliens who were mentioned in this memorandum. The Jewish deputies made a thorough investigation of the circumstances surrounding the expulsion of Jewish aliens ordered last month by the Citizen Protective Department of the Ministry of Interior. This investigation showed that the majority of expulsions were ordered on the strength of false information supplied to the local authorities.

JEWISH UNIVERSITY FOUNDED IN VITEBSK

Moscow, January 15 (Jewish Telegraphic Agency). A Jewish Labor University has been founded at Vitebsk in White Russia, according to a report received today.

POGROM AGITATORS JAILED

Berlin, January 15 (Jewish Telegraphic Agency). Because of their agitation against the Jews and their attempt to incite pogroms in Neidenhof, a town in East Prussia, E. Deydel, a druggist and A. Ellest, a merchant, were found guilty of conspiring against the Peace, and were sentenced to three months imprisonment.

JEWS TO HOLD OLYMPIC MEET

Jerusalem, January 15 (Jewish Telegraphic Agency). Preparations have been commenced for the convocation of a world Jewish Olympic Sports meeting to be held in Jerusalem in 1925.

The decision was taken as a result of the visit of the Vienna Jewish Football Team, called the Hakoah.

LUCIEN INTERVENES IN BEHALF OF RUSSIAN JEWISH REFUGEES

Bucharest, January 15 (Jewish Telegraphic Agency). Lucien Wolf, Secretary of the Joint Foreign Committee of the Jewish Board of Deputies of England and the Anglo-Jewish Association, arrived here to intervene with the Government regarding Ukrainian refugees.

The Roumanian Government promised Mr. Wolf to cease further evacuations of Russian Jewish refugees in view of the inability of the refugees to proceed to the United States owing to the exhaustion of the Russian quota. The Government further promised Mr. Wolf to accord transportation facilities to those refugees who desire to leave the country and cannot obtain sufficient support from the Jewish organizations.

M. Duca, Minister for Foreign Affairs, gave a luncheon in honor of Mr. Wolf which was attended by many notables.

EXPULSION OF MONEY SPECULATORS DEMANDED BY JEWISH COMMUNISTS

Kiev, January 15 (Jewish Telegraphic Agency). The Jewish public was asked to support the authorities in their efforts to rid Kiev of money speculators, in an editorial which appeared today in the "Communist Fahn". The editorial calls upon the OGPU (the new Cheka) to follow the example of the Moscow "Ogpu" which recently expelled to Siberia over 300 traders, accused of illegal speculating and smuggling.

JEWISH M.P.'s TAKE OATH ACCORDING TO JEWISH RITUAL

London, January 15 (Jewish Telegraphic Agency). The newly elected Jewish members of Parliament were permitted to keep their heads covered while taking the oath of office. The Old Testament was used for the ceremony.

Major Brunel Cohen who lost both legs in the World War attracted particular attention as he sat in the front bench while signing the Roll.

Despite the large number of socialist members, none of the members professed being free-thinkers but took the oath, none exercising the right to affirm instead of swearing.

PRINCE OF CONNAUGHT GUEST OF SIR HERBERT SAMUEL

Jerusalem, January 15 (Jewish Telegraphic Agency). Sir Herbert Samuel, High Commissioner for Palestine, postponed his departure for Amman for next week. He is entertaining Prince Arthur of Connaught, the King's cousin, who will stay in Palestine for a whole month.

Sir Herbert Samuel will tonight give a reception in the Government House to Prince Arthur of Connaught who is returning to London after his retirement as Governor General in South Africa. Heads of all communities and many notables will attend.

Numerous delegations have already left Palestine for Amman to attend the Arab Conference there. King Hussein of Hejjas has arrived in Amman yesterday.

The Arab press which was so actively propagandizing the Caliphate for King Hussein has suddenly become reticent on the subject.

GERER RABBI PROCEEDING TO PALESTINE

Warsaw, January 15 (Jewish Telegraphic Agency). The Gerer Rabbi (one of the leaders of the Chassidic sect) has left, together with his son and a number of Jewish industrialists from Lodz, for Palestine where they intend to stay for two months.

Thousands of Chassidim and many orthodox delegations have arrived from all parts of the country in order to say farewell.

Special cordons of police were scheduled to guard the stations to see that order was maintained.

The party consisted of thirty persons who are travelling in a special train to Vienna and from there to Triest.

JEWISH STUDENTS PROHIBITED TO DISSECT CHRISTIAN CORPSES

Warsaw, January 15 (Jewish Telegraphic Agency) Jewish students of the University of Warsaw have asked today the intervention of the Kehillah for the obtaining of Jewish corpses.

Christian students do not admit their Jewish colleagues to the dissection rooms owing to their non-delivery of Jewish corpses.

RABBI GEFFEN DEAD

He was a member of the Executive of the Ukrainian Federation and other Jewish charitable institutions. He intended to proceed this week to Bessarabia in behalf of the Federation to investigate the conditions of the Jewish refugees there.

He was fifty years old. During the war he served as Chaplain in the army.

DEMAND EXPULSION OF JEWS FROM GERMAN UNIVERSITIES

Berlin, December 30 (J. T.A. correspondence) as already reported briefly by cable, a group of Aryan student bodies, including the Berlin Waffening, the Firkenschaft and the corporation of the High School King of Germanism, a section of the German students' organization "Guilelmia", have ~~xxxxx~~ put down the following resolution for consideration by the Executive of the Berlin Students' ~~Organization~~ and the Berlin Students' Parliament:-

In order to prevent the excessive growth in numbers of the Jewish students, the Executive of the students' bodies is instructed to take steps to provide that in future all candidates for admission to the University should be obliged to state whether they are of German origin and whether German is their mother tongue. They should also be obliged in all cases to state their religious belief. "The German middle-class", the resolution proceeds, "is unable at present to afford the luxury of allowing their sons to study at the Universities. We must therefore be on guard that the Jews should not take advantage of the situation to swamp the German Universities with an overwhelming percentage of Jewish students".

This resolution is regarded as a first step towards a numerus clausus agitation in Germany. Nationalist student circles declare that organized in the two-thirds of ~~Germany's population~~^{the German population} the Berlin Students are Aryan Nationalist student bodies, and that approximately the same ratio obtains in regard to the rest of the German Universities.

In the event of the resolution being adopted, the next step will be to submit it to the Prussian Ministry for Education. The "Vossische Zeitung" in reporting the resolution, draws the attention of the Minister for Education to the ordinance issued in July, 1922, declaring that there must be no discrimination against Jewish students. The "Vossische Zeitung" expresses the hope that the Minister for Education will know how to deal with the resolution when it is submitted to him, and points to the urgent necessity of nipping the numerous/ clausus agitation in the bud before it has grown to formidable proportions.

ORT TRAINS JEWISH WEAVERS

Lodz, December 30 (J. T.A. correspondence). The first graduation of the pupils of the weavers' tradeschool of the "Ort" took place in Lodz.

This trade-school was formed about a year ago with the purpose of teaching the Jewish workers, mainly adults, to work on a weaver-machine, as most of the Jewish workers are craftsmen and therefore are being kept out of the textile industries.

Out of 35 pupils who graduated from this school last year ²⁴ have already established themselves in the textile factories in Lodz and are making a fair living.
