MAURICE WINCHEVSKY INVITED BY SOVIET GOVERNMENT TO COME TO RUSSIA

Moscow, January 16 (Jewish Telegraphic Agency). The Russian Government has extended an invitation to Leopold Benedict, who is known by his pen name Maurice Winchevsky, to come to Russia. A monthly pension of 75 chervoniz approximating \$350. has been assigned to Mr. Winchevsky, according to a statement made public here today. Two hundred and fifty gold rubles will be given Mr. Winchevsky for travelling expenses if he decides to come to Russia.

Mr. Benedict, who lives at 555 W. 151st Street, New York City, is a well-known publicist and poet, the creator of Jewish socialist literature. He was born August 9, 1856, in Yenowa, Lithuania. He travelled extensively through Europe, lived for some time in Germany where he was arrested in the year 1878 when the anti-socialist law was promulgated, and later deported from Prussia. He went to Copenhagen where he was again arrested. From there he went to Paris and London where in the year 1884 he published the first Jewish socialist periodical. He migrated to the United States in 1894. In Boston he published "The Truth", a weekly family journal.

He contributed to many Jewish newspapers in the United States and created a reputation as publicist, poet, epigrammatist. He is considered the creator of Yiddish literature in the Anglo-speaking world and is the first Jewish proletarian poet.

SYRIAN HIGH COMMISSIONER TO CONFER WITH KING HUSSEIN

Arab Congress to be Held in Jerusalem or Amman Soon.

Jerusalem, January 16 (Jewish Telegraphic Agency). General Arnaud, French High Commissioner for Syria, is proceeding to Amman in order to confer with King Hussein.

The Arab Executive announces that an Arab Congress will be held during Hussein's visit, either in Jerusalem or in Amman. Delegations from all Arab countries will participate. The statement says further that the Anglo-Arab Treaty will be thoroughly discussed by the members at the Conference before King Hussein will sign it. Special attention will be devoted to the clauses regarding Palestine. The Arab Executive issued a manifesto urging all Arabs in Palestine to flock to Amman to show their solidarity with King Hussein.

Amirbey Iltamimi, the only member of the Arab Delegation who remained in London after the departure of the Delegation, has just returned to Palestine. The Arab prospects, according to an address he made today at a public meeting, are satisfactory.

PERLMAN TAKES STAND AGAINST RESTRICTIVE IMMIGRATION AT REPUBLICAN BREAKFAST

Washington, January 16 (Jewish Telegraphic Agency). Following a breakfast tendered by all the Republican Congressmen from New York State in honor of G. W. Morris, chairman of the New York State Republican Committee, Congressman Nathan D. Perlman, who was the only Jewish Congressman present at this event, held a private conference with Chairman Morris, Samuel Koenig, Chairman of the Republican Committee of New York County and several of the Congressmen regarding the immigration legislation situation in Congress.

Congressman Perlman spoke to these Republican leaders officially from the standpoint of the Republican Party policies and urged them to take steps to get the Republican New York Party Organization to serve notice on the National Administration that the Organization is opposed to the Johnson Bill based on two percent of the eighteen ninety census on the ground it is discriminatory against certain nationalities, unfair, and extremely offensive to foreign born citizens. From a strictly Party standpoint, Congressman Perlman stated to the New York leaders, it should be made clear by the Republicans that they do not foster discrimination of this kind against the foreign born citizens.

After this conference, Congressman Perlman stated to the Jewish Telegraphic Agency correspondent that Chairman Morris admitted the Johnson Bill is indeed discriminatory, that he personally is opposed to the bill, and that he recognized the importance of a positive stand by New York Republicans against this proposed legislation as urged by Congressman Perlman and promised he would grant Perlman another opportunity to discuss the situation with himself and other party leaders in New York of which invitation Perlman said he would avail himself in a few days when he expects to be in New York.

Congressman Perlman said both Chairmen Morris and Koenig as well as a number of the Congressmen were very sympathetic and that he was extremely hopeful of obtaining valuable influence against the extreme features of the John Bill from New York Republicans as a result of this conference which he said was very favorable.

It is also learned that Congressman Perlman has been active for some time in New York Republican circles in endeavoring to enlist aid against the extreme immigration restrictions, having recently interviewed among others, National Republican Committeeman Charles D. Hillis of New York, Mrs. Charles Sabin, President of the Women's National Republican Club, Miss Sarah Butler, daughter of Nicholas Murray Butler and Associate Chairman of the New York State Republican Committee.

Congressman Perlman stated as far as he knows this is the first time the subject has been taken up by a Jewish congressman from a purely party angle instead of by formal parliamentary procedure. He believes more can be accomplished through ~~xxxxxxxxxxxxxxxx~~ the former method. Congressman Perlman declared he will continue these efforts with vigor.

Among the guests present at the breakfast were Secretary Hughes and Assistant Secretary Roosevelt.

DR. ABRAMS, FOUNDER OF SCHOOL OF ELECTRONIC MEDICINE DIES

San Francisco, Jan. 15 (J. T. A.) Dr. Albert Abrams, internationally known physician and inventor of an apparatus which he claimed ~~xx~~ could diagnose a disease by testing a drop of blood, died at his home here late last night of pneumonia, aged 61.

The doctor had correctly predicted the exact date of his death by application of the electronic test, according to his friends. Dr. Abrams had gained prominence in medicine, aside from his electronic theory. He was born in San Francisco, December 8, 1863, and was a graduate of medicine from the University of Heidelberg in 1892. He took graduate courses in London, Berlin, Vienna and Paris.

Doctor Abrams was the author of several books on medicine and allied subjects. He was a Fellow of the Royal Medical Society of London and a member of the Authors' Club of London. He was honorary President of the American Association for the Study of Spondylothesapy, and President of the American Society of Psycho-Physical Research.

SPECIAL SESSION OF AMERICAN JEWISH CONGRESS MAY BE CALLED NEXT MONTH
Immigration Problem Will Be Chief Topic, According To Report.

New York, January 16 (J. T. A.) A special session of the American Jewish Congress may be held in Philadelphia February 10, for the purpose of determining action on the immigration problem, it is learned by the Jewish Telegraphic Agency from reliable sources.

Plans have already been made for a combined executive committee meeting; regional conference of delegates from Pennsylvania, Delaware and New Jersey, and a mass meeting in Philadelphia on the above mentioned date, and it has been suggested that the scope of this meeting be enlarged to include all of the delegates to the American Jewish Congress. There is a strong possibility that this suggestion will be favorably acted upon.

In connection with the activity of the American Jewish Congress with regard to the immigration question, circular letters have gone out from the Congress offices to delegates in all parts of the country, asking them to take some action in protest of the proposed immigration bill; the letters containing a summary of the clauses of the bill and the objections to it.

Such action has already been taken in many cities throughout the country, meetings having been called in St. Louis, where the Progressive ~~Order~~ of the West are cooperating most actively; Pittsburgh, Boston, Providence and Newark. Meetings are also being planned for Chicago, Washington, D. C. and Reading, Pa., as well as many other cities throughout the land.
