Arthur Henderson, Secretary of State for Home Affairs, last year signed the Labour Party declaration, favoring Zionism. Noel Buxton, Minister of Agriculture, is another friend of Zionism and an authority on the affairs of Eastern Europe. Josiah Wedgwood, member of the cabinet without a department, will, probably, be the British representative in the League of Nations.

over Palestine is an event of the greatest importance to the whole Jewish race. The whole world will now expect the Jews to face in a practical way the responsibilities thus placed on their shoulders. They must cooperate with the Government in removing all obstacles to a peaceful settlement to effect a concordat with the Arab population and to develop the resources of their own homeland in Palestine."

JEWISH PRESS IN POLAND ENTHUSIASTIC OVER LABOUR TRIUMPH

Warsaw, January 23 (Jewish Telegraphic Agency). Leading articles in the Jewish press sound an enthusiastic note over the triumph of the Labour Party in England. They express the conviction that the MacDonald Government will add strength to the Zionist Policy, opening up Jewish immigration to Palestine, and putting an end to what they term the irresolute policies of the Palestine government.

QUINN, LEGION COMMANDER, BEFORE HOUSE IMMIGRATION COMMITTEE

Washington, D. C., January 23 (Jewish Telegraphic Agency). John H. Quinn, National Commander of the American Legion, appeared before the House Immigration Committee on Tuesday and read into the record the resolutions passed at the convention of the Legion in San Francisco last fall, advocating a total suspension of immigration for a period of five years.

Commander Quinn confined himself to a reading of these resolutions, offering no additional comment. Opponents of the Johnson Bill have not hesitated to say that the personal appearance of Quinn before the Committee was an attempt to influence the committee with the name of the Legion, inasmuch as the resolutions could have been read into the record through the simple formality of having them forwarded to a member of the Committee. It is learned on good authority that although the Legion favors the more drastic expedient of a total stoppage to immigration, its officials are satisfied with the measures of the Johnson Bill in its present form.

Commissioner of Immigration, W. W. Husband, also appeared before the Committee on Tuesday and it is understood that he discussed some of the administrative features of the bill.

SEPHARDIC MEMORIAL SYNAGOGUE PLANNED FOR PARIS

Paris, January 23 (Jewish Telegraphic Agency). A big synagogue, dedicated to the memory of Sephardic Jews who fell in the World War, will shortly be erected in Paris, according to plans which have just been

announced. President Millerand, Premier Poincare and General Foch are patrons of the project.

The Spanish Senator Pulido, known for his endeavors to reestablish Judo-Spanish relations, has forwarded a substantial sum to M. Rouzanes, president of the Sephardic Kehillah, for this purpose.

ROSENBAUM TO PERFORM SOME DUTIES ROUMANIAN JEWISH MINISTRY

Berlin, January 23 (Jewish Telegraphic Agency). Dr. Rosenbaum, attending a meeting of the Berlin Lodge of the B'nai B'rith, announced that there will take place shortly the legalization of the Nationalrat in Lithuania. Although Dr. Rosenbaum resigned as Jewish Minister, he said that he will continue to perform some of the duties of the office at the request of government officials.

WEYGAND PROCEEDS TO AMMAN

Jerusalem, January 23, (Jewish Telegraphic Agency). General Weygand, French army chieftain, is on his way to Amman, where he is expected to confer with King Hussein of Hedjas concerning the position of Syria in the Pan-Arabic Confederation. Sir Herbert Samuel, British High Commissioner of Palestine, has returned to the capitol after a visit to Hussein.

All participants in the recent uprising against Sultan Edwan have been pardoned by King Hussein, who will proceed within the next few days to Shuna, the summer residence of his son, Emir Abdullah. The Palestine delegations will meet Hussein there to discuss the question of including Palestine in the Pan-Arabic Confederation.

Jerusalem, January 23 (Jewish Telegraphic Agency). It is learned here that the projected visit to Palestine of King Hussein of Hedjas is now improbable, and that High Commissioner Samuel will visit Hussein again within the next fortnight. King Hussein, in an interview today said, "We work for absolute independence of the Arab countries without a treaty."

MOSCOVITCH WINS LIBEL ACTION

London, January 23 (Jewish Telegraphic Agency). The case of Maurice Moscovitch, Jewish actor and American citizen, brought to restrain a libel in a book just published, entitled "Letters of an Unsuccessful actor", has been settled. The publisher has agreed to insert a slip in all copies of the book correcting an allegation that Moscovitch is

a German named Rosen and that he had taken the name Moscovitch in order that it might appear that he is of Russian origin. The slip will state that the publisher regrets any inconvenience to Moscovitch. Reference in the Index will be blotted out and in future editions everything referring to Moscovitch will be omitted.

CELEBRATE RABBI'S BIRTHDAY

Budapest, January 23 (Jewish Telegraphic Agency). The Jewish Community of Budapest celebrated on January 20 the seventieth birthday of the Szegediner rabbi, Emmanuel Loew.

JAILED FOR ILL-TREATMENT OF IMMIGRANTS

Jassy, January 23 (Jewish Telegraphic Agency). General Popovicis and his adjutant, Captain Murdaric, have been sentenced each to a year's imprisonment for ill treating immigrants.

KAMENEFF BAPTISED JEW STATES ENGLISH PRESS

London, January 23 (Jewish Telegraphic Agency). The English newspapers forecast that Kameneff will be the successor to Lenin. Kameneff, according to published reports here, is a baptised Jew.

HIAS WILL AID JEWISH IMMIGRANTS IN MEXICO

New York, January 23 (Jewish Telegraphic Agency). HIAS has undertaken to aid the Jewish immigrants in Vera Cruz and other Mexican cities. The Jewish immigrants are reported to be suffering, all communication having been cut off since the revolution. HIAS has set aside \$1,000. for the aid of the Jewish immigrants in Mexico and offers to facilitate the delivery of letters and money to Jews in Mexico.

DR. GUTTMAN, JEWISH EDUCATOR, ARRIVES FROM BERLIN

New York City, January 23, (Jewish Telegraphic Agency). Dr. Julius Guttman of Berlin, has arrived in America to remain for about six months. During his stay here Dr. Guttman, who is a world-reknowned Jewish scholar and Professor of Jewish Knowledge in the Berlin Jewish High School, will be a member of the faculty of the Jewish Institute of Religion, the president of which is Dr. Stephen S. Wise, at whose invitation Dr. Guttman has come to America.

STERN ELECTED PRESIDENT OF BERLIN JEWISH COMMUNITY

Berlin, January 23, (Jewish Telegraphic Agency). The Berlin Jewish Community has elected Herr Stern (Liberal) as president; Dr. Alfred Lee (Zionist) and Herr Levinsky (Conservative), vice presidents.

HITLERITES SENTENCED TO PRISON FOR ATTACK ON JEW

Berlin, January 23 (Jewish Telegraphic Agency). The People's Court in Neunberger has sentenced to prison the National Socialists, Graf and Hofer, to two years and a year and a half, respectively. They were charged with having taken part in the attempted Hitler-Ludendorff putsch and with wounding and robbing a Jew, named Kaufmann.

PROFESSOR FREED OF ANTI-JEWISH CHARGES

Berlin, January 23 (Jewish Telegraphic Agency). The Disciplinary Board of the University of Jena has freed Professor of Zoology Ludwig Plate of charges lodged against him by Jewish students, who said that he had misused his office for anti-Jewish agitation.

SAY POGROM REPORTS ARE MONARCHIST INVENTIONS

Berlin, January 23 (Jewish Telegraphic Agency). The Soviet Representative in Berlin has received an official communication from Charkoff, stating that the reports in the Berlin Vorwaerts of pogroms in the Ukraine are inventions of the monarchist Russian press and have the purpose of weakening the good impression made by the Soviets in granting amnesty to imprisoned leaders of the Social Revolutionary Party.

BUTTENWIESER NEW FEDERATION PRESIDENT

New York, January 23 (Jewish Telegraphic Agency). Announcement is made of the election of Joseph L. Buttenwieser, prominent real estate operator, to the presidency of the Federation for the Support of Jewish Philanthropic Societies. Mr. Buttenwieser succeeds Arthur Lehman, banker, who has served as president of the Federation for the past three years.. The Federation, which is starting its eighth year of activity, last year distributed \$3,350,000. to the 91 institutions affiliated with it.
