SIR ALFRED HOND, ENGLISH LIBERAL AND ZIONIST
RE-ELECTED TO PARLIAMENT

London, August 16, 1924 (Jewish Telegraphic Agency). Sir Alfred Hond, English Liberal leader and Zionist, formerly Minister of Public Works in Lloyd George's Cabinet was elected to Parliament yesterday, Carmarthen constituency. Out of the general vote cast 12760 were given for Sir Alfred Hond, 8351 votes for the Labor candidate Rev. Owen and 7896 for the conservative candidate, Stevens.

Sir Albert Hond will succeed Griffith, who resigned for the purpose of giving Sir Alfred a possibility for reelection. It was stated that Sir Alfred will assume leadership of the Liberal party in the House of Commons.

JWS IN SOVIET RUSSIA ANXIOUS TO SETTLE ON LAND

London - August 16 (Jewish Telegraphic Agency). A great number of Jewish city dwellers in the Ukraine are expressing their desire to avail themselves of the opportunity to settle on the land. Since the Central Executive Committee (Zik) in the Ukraine has issued the decree concerning granting facilities for Jewish land settlers, many agricultural institutions are flooded with Jewish applicants. Measures are now being taken to prevent this Jewish "back to land" movement from assuming a disorganized character.

INDEPENDENT ORDER BRAJ BRITH INTERESTED
IN JEWISH IMMIGRATION TO MEXICO

Chicago, August 15, (Jewish Telegraphic Agency). Twenty thousand dollars has been appropriated by the Independent Order Braj Brith for the establishment of a branch office in Mexico City for the purpose of carrying on relief work among the Jewish immigrants in that city.

The Independent Order Braj Brith has been one of the first American Jewish organizations to interest itself in the situation in Mexico and the possibility which that country may afford for Jewish immigration.
