## OPINION THAT PLAN FOR JEWISH WORLD RELIEF FUND IS PREMATURE IS VOICED AT CARLSBAD CONFERENCE

### Join in International Movement For The Industrial Protection Of Children

Carlsbad, August 27th (Jewish Telegraphic Agency) The opinion that the plan for the creation of the Jewish World Relief Fund, in connection with a Jewish World Association for Social Service is premature, was voiced by Leon Chassanowitz, Dr. Silberfarb, Dr. Singalowski, Messrs. Kreinin and Gergel of the Ose (Russian Jewish Association for the protection of health amongst the Jewish population) during the discussion which followed reports on the plan submitted by Messrs. Motzkin and Eppoykin. Mme. Anita Mueller, the well known Jewish Social Worker of Austria partly agreed with this opinion.

While in principle there is a necessity for such an organization, the forming of it at present would be premature, they declared. On the other hand, many speakers among whom were Deputy Noe Prylutzki of Poland, Mr. Sliosberg of Russia, Mr. Berger, Dr. Hindes and Mr. Kraemer urged the adoption of this plan and criticized the representatives of the organization Ort and Ose for their separatistic tendencies. It is expected that a vote on this question will be taken tomorrow when the conference will close.

An interesting feature of the conference was the signing of the Geneva Declaration concerning the rights of children by all participating delegates. Two texts, one Hebrew and one in Yiddish, were prepared. These were read respectively by Mr. David Yellin of Jerusalem and Dr. Berthold Latzki. After the signatures were affixed, Mr. Motzkin, at the general session, handed them over to Monsieur Gheri, representative of the Union Internationale Secour Enfant. Monsieur Gheri thanked the Conference for joining the movement to protect children's rights in industry.

Mr. Aberson read a report in French concerning the relations between the Jewish World Relief Conference and the various international organizations, as the League of Nations and The Red Cross. He expressed his conviction that should, at some future date, the

an emergency arise, the Jewish World Relief Conference would be greatly assisted and strengthened by its friendly relations with the legitimate international bodies.

A heated discussion took place today at the meeting of the General Committee of the Conference when plans for the future executive were discussed. Representatives of the Societies Ort and Ose demanded that 50% of the membership of the Executive Committee should be allotted for certain existing organizations. This demand, however, was rejected by the majority of the committee and it was decided that the executive should be elected at the conference disregarding the now existing separate organizations.

#### UGANDA ONCE CONSIDERED SUBSTITUTE FOR PALESTINE FORMS ZIONIST ORGANIZATION

London, August 27th (Jewish Telegraphic Agency) Uganda, the country which was one time discussed in Zionist councils, as a possible substitute for Palestine for the building of the Jewish National Homeland, has now seen the founding of an organization whose aim is to support the Jewish National Homeland in Palestine.

At Nairobi, capital of Uganda, now known as British East Africa, a Zionist group was formed as a result of the interest of Dr. Alexander Goldstein. Many Jewish residents in Uganda have joined this organization.

The project of Uganda was discussed at the Sixth Zionist Congress and continued holding the attention of Zionist and Jewish Leaders for a long time as a possible place for a Jewish settlement.

#### JEWISH POLICE OFFICIAL IN POLAND GAINS DISTINCTION

Warsaw, August 27th (Jewish Telegraphic Agency) Herman Ozerwinski, a Jewish Polish police official in the capital of Poland, holds the distinction of being the first Jew in the resurrected Polish Republic to be granted the bronze cross for valuable work for the Polish State. He was decorated by the Minister of the Interior for his assistance in organizing the Investigation Department of the Polish Police.

#### ADOLF S. OCHS GRANTED HONORARY DEGREE OF COLUMBIA SCHOOL OF JOURNALISM

New York, August 27th (Jewish Telegraphic Agency) Adolf S. Ochs, editor and publisher of The New York Times was among the three members of the Advisory Board of the School of Journalism at Columbia University upon whom honorary degrees were conferred in connection with the closing of one year's activity at this school. The other two members who were granted a degree are Victor F. Lawson of the Chicago Daily News and Melville E. Stone of the Associated Press.

DR. JOS EPH ROSEN, DIRECTOR OF JEWISH COLONIZATION WORK  
DRAWS SAD PICTURE OF RUSSIAN-JEWISH SITUATION IN RUSSIA;  
AGRICULTURAL PURSUIT IS ONLY SALVATION.

New York, Aug. 27th (Jewish Telegraphic Agency)- "The offer of the Russian Government to grant land in the Ukraine, Crimea, and White Russia must be taken up to the fullest extent for the purpose of settling as many Jewish families as possible," declared Dr. Joseph Rosen, director of the Joint Distribution Reconstruction Work in Russia, before sailing again for Russia on the SS. Olympic, several days ago.

"With every family that settles on a farm, the crowded conditions in the towns are alleviated and the opportunity for finding work is increased for those who remain. We cannot imagine here," stated Dr. Rosen, "what a great curse was brought on the Jews and Soviet Russia by the spread of unemployment. Young, healthy men wander about in search of something to do, cannot find it, and resign themselves to an aimless life and starvation. In a village with a population of 300 or 400 Jewish families, only ten have a definite means of livelihood. If they are traders, they have nothing to sell, if they are artisans, they have no material or tools with which to work. 'Why don't Jews go into factories,' one would ask. The reason is simple. Industry in Soviet Russia has been reduced and those factories which are functioning employ their old workers amongst whom there seldom are Jews, because Jews were not previously represented in factory work to a larger extent.

"It must be understood that a people, 90% of whom are traders, is doomed to destruction in present-day Russia. The movement of the Russian Jews to settle on the land is not an idealistic movement as some may imagine, but it is a pressing necessity. In this respect, credit has to be given to the Ort Society which has helped the first 600 Jewish families to settle on the land. The regional offices of the Ort in Kiev and Charkoff did much to better conditions of the old existing colonies. Much benefit is also to be expected from the trade schools for the Jewish youth maintained by this society. To characterize the situation, it will suffice to quote a resolution which was adopted at recent Jewish gatherings in Kiev, Odessa and Moscow. These resolutions stated clearly that if Russian Jewry will not be helped to transform itself from traders and city dwellers into agriculturists and productive artisans and laborers, it is doomed to destruction", concluded Dr. Rosen.

FORD ENDORSES K K K

Montreal, Aug. 27th (Jewish Telegraphic Agency) "Were the truth to be known about the Klan, it would become obvious that this is a society of pure patriots", declared Henry Ford, who is now on a journey in Canada, after visiting President Coolidge in Plymouth, in an interview given to the "Star."

"The Klan is a victim of a mass of lying propaganda and that is the reason why the Klan is in some circles looked upon with dissatisfaction. The truth is that the Klan is an organization that has in its aim only the welfare and future of America."

A JEW, WARNED BY KLAN TO LEAVE, KIDNAPPED IN LONG ISLAND

Freeport, L.I. Sug. 27th (Jewish Telegraphic Agency) "Freeport is not large enough to hold you and the Klan", This was the warning given to Ernest D. Lewis, Jewish owner of a drug store on Bayview Avenue, Freeport, on August 14th, by ten men who appeared that day in the store. They urged him to leave the city within ten days.

Last Monday night when Mr. Lewis walked home together with his wife and daughter-in-law, five men surrounded him, put him in an automobile without lights and disappeared. Mrs. Lewis declared to the police that the leader of the kidnapping gang appeared to have been one of the men who visited the store ten days ago, sounding the Klan warning.

AMERICAN JEWISH PHYSICIANS TO PREPARE HEBREW MEDICAL TERMINOLOGY

New York, Aug. 27th (Jewish Telegraphic Agency) A voluminous work which is to contain a full exposition of modern medicine in Hebrew, which may possibly be used as a medical text book in the Hebrew University at Jerusalem, is the task which a group of American Jewish physicians have taken upon themselves. The first book of the proposed sixty volumes appeared recently under the name of "Rphuah", under the editorship of Drs. A. A. Golden, D.M. Herbert and A. Goldstein. The book which is the only one of its kind in modern Hebrew literature, is a scholarly and earnest attempt to create a purely Hebrew Medical Terminology.

A company which is incorporated under the name of "Rphuah"-American Medical Publications in Hebrew, was formed for the purpose of issuing this voluminous work. To the Executive Committee belong: Dr. D. De Wattoff, Chairman; Dr. A. Stolfoff, Treasurer; Dr. A. Goldenstein, Secretary, Dr. L. Golden and Dr. L. Herbert, Editors; Dr. N. Ratwoff, Dr. Bernstein, Dr. Keller and others; Mr. R. Brainin, Honorary Chairman. The publication has found hearty endorsement in many scholarly Hebrew circles.
