POLISH GOVERNMENT APPOINTS NEW CONSUL IN JERUSALEM

Warsaw, August 28th (jewish Telegraphic Agercy) The Pālisk Consul General in Jerusalem; Mr. Adamkiewicz, was recalled from his post. Mr. Hubicki, formerly Polish Corsul in Tokyo was appointed in his place.

"I WAS TOO MILD AN ANTI-SEMITE" DECLARES ADOLF HITLER

Berlin, August 28th(Jewish Telegraphic Agency) "I was too mild an Anti-Semite", declared Adolf Hitler, defeated lender of the Bevarian Beer Revolution, now imprisoned in Lindsberg, when he commented upon the information submitted to him of the reports circulated in the Jewish press that he had remounced Anti-Semitism. "It is ridiculous", he stated. "To the contrary, I was rather too mild an Anti-Semite. I am now engaged in writing a book which I consider to be the work of my life in which I will prove that only through a sharp campaign against the Jews, will the world be saved from the Jewish disease."

ANTI-SEMITIC BANK FAILS IN BERLIN

Berlin, August 28th (Jewish Telegraphic Agency) The Voelkische Bank, established and supported by the Anti-Semitic Voelkische Partei, collapsed. Deposits and valuables disappeared from the back's safes and thousands of patrictic and Anti-Semitic Germans who had placed their confidence in this institution, suffered enormous losses. The director of the bank, Herr Bruss disappeared.

MATILDA SCHECHTER, WIFE OF LATE PROFESSOR SOLOMON SCHECHTER DIES IN NEW YORK

New York, August 28th (Jewish Telegraphic A gercy) Matilda Schechter, wife of the late scholar and founder of the Jewish Theological Semirary, died here last right at the age of sixty-five, leaving two daughters and a son. The funeral took place today from The Jewish Theological Seminary. She was buried in Har Harmon Cemetery.

SUGGES: THAT MR. LOUIS MARSHALL PROCEED TO RUSSIA TO INVESTIGATE CONDITION OF RUSSIAN JEWS

New York, Aug. 28th (Jewish Telegraphic Agency) The suggestion that Mr. Louis Marshel, president of the American Jewish Relief Committee, proceed personally to Russia, heading a commission of the Joiht Distribution Committee for the purpose of investigating the situation of the Russian Jews and the possibility of extending effective help to them by American Jewry was made to-day by Mr. Jacob Fishman, in his daily column in the Jewish Morning Journal, discussing the replies of Mr. Marshall and Mr. Lehman to the criticism of Russian Jewish circles contained in the Saturday Riga Dispatch of the Jewish Telegraphic Agency.

"The positive statement of Mr. Marshall that the \$400,000 lately assigned by the Joint Distribution Committee for the purpose of helping Jewish Farmers in Russia will not be administered by the Idgeskon or "Yevsektzia" is naturally more important than his defense of the previous activities of the Foint Distribution Committee in Russia. Mr. Marshall says that he has great confidence in Dr. Joseph Rosen who will be in charge of the \$400,000 in Russia. This is very nice and correct. We have no doubt that Dr. Rosen, aswell as Dr. Bogen deserve the confidence as administrators of the funds.

"It is different, however, when the question of deciding the policy is considered. We may say frankly that the weak point of the Joint Distribution Committee's previous activities in Russia was the fact that the Joint Distribution Committee had relied entirely on Dr. Bogen in matters of policy, although there was in existence considerable opposition. This should not be repeated, if the Joint Distribution Committee intends to start a serious activity and not to remain satisfied with a mere donation.

"The question is important enough that Mr. Marshall himself should make the sacrifice and proceed to Russia at the head of a commission. This is not a question of distributing deckiff. Solley (\$400,000. It is a question of deciding a policy which is of the greatest importance for tens of thousands of Jews in Soviet Russia", the editorial concluded

ANTI-SEMITIC SCENES IN GERMAN PARLIAMENT VHILE REJECTING DAVES PLAN

Berlin, Aug. 28th (Jewish Telegraphic Agency) The wildest scenes ever witnessed in the Germum Partiament occurred yesterday through the provocation of the Voelkische Partei when they shouted "Out with the Jews'during the discussion on the Dawes plan, declared ex-Mirister Koch, speking in the house. The answer of the Voelkische Partei representatives to that accusation was "That's fit!"

JEWISH RELIEF CONFERENCE AT CARLSBAD DECIDES TO SEND DELEGATION TO AMERICA

Carlsbad, August 28th (Jewish Telegraphic Agendy) The Jewish World Relief Conference which is in session here has to-day adopted a resolution instructing the Executive Committee to send a special delegation to the United States for the purpose of bringing to the attention of American Jewry, the plight of the Jews in Russia and re-awaken the interest of the American Jews in the ortastrophic situation of large parts of the Jewish population in Emstern Europe.

The general session of the conference adopted to-day a resolution expressing confident and thanks to the former Executive Committee for its work. D-iscussion on various questions before the conference then ensued.

Mme. Rosa Helzer, member of the Polish Parliament, submitted a report on Children's Aid. Mr. Berthold Latzki reported on the immigration question. In connection with this, Mr. Leon Chasanowitz protested against the agreement concluded between the Immigration Directoriat of the Jewish World Relief Conference and the Ica concerning the relief work for the stranded refugees. Prof. Eisler, representing the Agudath Israel urged the conference to start relief action for the Jewish intellectual groups in Soviet Russia. He related the fact that a large number of Jewish students in Boviet Russia are in great misery and the entire Jewish intellectual classes in Soviet Russia face destruction

Deputy Oscar Kohn, well known member of the German Parliament reported on the plan to create employment facilities for Jewish sufferers. Dr. Klee submitted to the Conference a resolution on the necessity of reconstruction work instead of engaging in philanthropy.

Mr. Benjamin, representing the Hins in New York, praised the work of the Conference and assured, in the name of the organization he represents, that his organization would co-operate with the Jewish World Relief Conference. The Hins intends to extend its activity he declared, and particularly, will co-operate with the Zionist organization in helping to direct those stranded refugees who desire to proceed to Palestine.

JEWISH INTELLECTUALS IN SOVIET R USSIA FACE STARVATION

Carlshrd, August 28th (Jewish Telegraphic Agency) 700 Jewish students are doomed to strivation and face the actual danger of hunger-death as a result of their expulsion from the colleges by the Soviet authorities, according to information

which reached **Kère** from Soviet Russia. The students who were expelled from the Soviet colleges because they were of non-proletarian origin, cannot even wisit the kitchens which are maintained by the American Y.M.C.A. which is open only to college men. The suffering of this group is indescribable and an epidemic of suicides is a direct result. A week ago, a young student and his bride committed suicide owing to starvation.

Further orrests of Ziowists took place in various parts of the country, according to the report. Twenty-seven Ziomists were expelled from the Minsk district; one hundred fifty have been imprisoned in Winnitze; eighteen in Schmermitka. Five hundred teachers, Professors and literati face staryation in Kiev.

FRENCH SENATE RATIFIES LAUSANNE TREATY

Priis, Aug. 28th (Jewish Telegraphic Agercy) The Lausanne Trenty, including the Sam Remo decision with provisions for the establishing of the Jewish National Homeland in Palestine, was ratified dony by the French Secate with a majority of 270 votes against 20.

Senator Saintmaur protested against the bill calling for ratification of the trenty, because it gives recognition to the British Mandate over Palestive. France wasformerly pre-eminent power in the Neur-East and especially in Palestine, he declared. By the Lausanne Treaty, France was deprived of its right to protect all christians in the Neur-East. Senator Delichaye demonded that France separate from Great Britain in its Neur-East Policy. Replying to this criticism, Prime Minister, Herriot stated that France has retained all her rights in the Holy Land and will continue to defend the French Schools, Missions and the French influence in the Neur-East. The Alliance Israelite has recently obtained permission to continue the instruction of the French language in Turkey, the Frime Minister cited as an example of the continued French influence in that part of the world.

"ARABS HOPE TO BECOME MASTERS OF THEIR COUNTRIES" SAYS EMIR ABDULLAH

Jerusalem, Aug. 28th, (Jewish Telegriphic agercy) A call to stop the Arti-Brecch and Arti-British intrigues in the Arabic countries was issued to-day by Emin Abbullah, ruler of Tracs-Judaria, when he delivered a speech in Armaca, in the presence of his people and armaca.

"The Srabs hope to become finally the masters of their countries", the Emir declared, "but they are not to a position to oppose the foreign powers by armed forces." He therefore warned his countrymen against the Auti-French and Auti-British intriguers who soek shelter in Trape-Judania.

AGUDATH ISRAEL BUYS 4,000 DUNAL OF LAND IN EHEK JESRELL

Jerusalem, August 28th (Jewish Telegraphic Agevcy) A further strip of land in Emek Jesrell bame into Jewish possession to-day when the purchase of 4,000 duwim of land was completed by the Orthodox Agudath Israel. This is the first purchase of the Orthodox Jewish World Organization in that region.

PALESTINE GOVERNMENT DISCOVERS SHUGGLING OF FIREARIS INTO TRANSJORDANIA

Jerusalem, August 28th (Jewish Telegraphic Agecoy) The Palestive Government has discovered that extensive trafficking in firearms has been going or for some time from Hebror into Transjordania. Energetic steps are being taken by the Government to suppress the traffic.

CONSILIATORY ARAB PARTY OF FARMERS

"Mereat el Sherk" writes: "We are informed that a new agricultural association hashesn established in the Arnb village "Beit Jaber" in the vicinity of Ramleh. This new pirty recognizes the Mandatory Government of Great Britain and desires to safeguard the Moslem Wakffs, to help the farmers, and live pacefully with all the other inhabitants of Palestine. The Party renounces the Arab Executive.

ARAB EDITOR ASKS VAAD LEUHI TO ACT AS ARBITRATOR

Jerusalem, August 28th (Jewish Telegriphic Agercy) in. Zakka, editor of the Arch paper "Artofix" of Heiro, has asked the Vand Lewmi (National Council or Jews in Pilestine) to arbitrate in a dispute whichnes raises between him and several leading Jews in Hidda, The Vand Lewmi has agreed and has appointed Messrs. Ordetein, Pewster and Shewulli as arbitrators.
