JEW ARRESTED FOR HURLING BOMB AT POLISH PRESIDENT

Thrown Of Bomb Does Not Belong to Any Jewish
Party; Jewish Community of Lemberg Extends
Warm Reception to President.

Lemberg; Sept. 6th (Jewish Telegraphic Agency) Stanislaw Steiger, a young Jewish student, was arrested here to-day in connection with the gas bomb hurled at President Stanislaw Wojciechowski, during a parade on the streets of the city.

The bomb which was filled with gas exploded but caused no harm, although a panic was created by the explosion. The arrested man does not belong to any of the Jewish parties. It is stated that he was mentally deranged.

Lemberg, September 6th (Jewish Telegraphic Agency) President Wojciechowski, during his visit to this city, attended several divine services in the Catholic and Ukrainian churches. While the Ukrainian Churches were half empty during the services arranged on the occasion of the President's arrival, the Synagogue, where similar services were rendered, was overcrowded.

Rabbi Goodman, welcomed the President. The Cantor and choir sang psalms. Rabbi Goodman handed over to the President the holy scrolls. The President was heartily moved by the welcome extended to him by the Jewish community. The Jewish quarter of Lemberg was decorated as it is on a holiday.

The incident of the throwing of the bomb was a most sudden surprise. Perfect order, was, however, maintained.

On Friday evening, a gala dinner was given by the Municipal authorities to which many Jewish representatives were invited. During this dinner, President Wojciechowski stated in his toast, that the Polish Government wishes the welfare of Polish citizens, disregarding all distinctions of nationality or religion. A banquet was also arranged in honor of the President by the Wojewoda where the Jewish members of the

Vienna, Sept. 8th (Jewish Telegraphic Agency) Stanislaw Steiger, who was arrested in Lemberg for throwing a gas bomb at President Wojciechowski, graduated from the Vienna University last February when he returned to Poland. Steiger was never active in the Zionist Movement and it is known that he was formerly an adherent of Ruthanian Independence. It is possible, therefore, that his act was prompted by his Ruthanian sympathies.

Another version current here is that Steiger intended to throw the harmless bomb at the president as a demonstration of resentment against the mistreatment of the Jewish academic youth in Poland who are compelled to go abroad to obtain an education on account of the practice of Numerous Clauses or the anti-Semitism of the professors in the Polish universities.

Vienna, Sept. 8th (Jewish Telegraphic Agency) Jewish members of the Polish Sejm, Drs. Reich, Reizes and Insler, called to-day on the Polish Minister here, Mr. Lasocki, expressing their regrets at the unpleasant incident which occurred during the visit of President Wojciechowski in Lemberg, as well as their satisfaction that the bomb which exploded caused no harm.

The Polish Minister thanked the Jewish representatives for their expressions of regret and promised to convey to the President their congratulations. The youth's act, the minister stated, was no doubt, the act of an insane person, inasmuch as the Jews of Lemberg have no reason for political conspiracies and secondly, political murder is a thing which is in contradiction to the teachings and ethics of Judaism.

Lemberg, September 8th (Jewish Telegraphic Agency) The throwing of the gas bomb at President Wojciechowski was an act of provocation, according to the local Polish Jewish Daily paper, "Chwila." Perfect order is maintained in the city.

POLISH GOVERNMENT OUSTS JEWISH WORKERS FROM TOBACCO INDUSTRY

Warsaw, Sept. 8th (Jewish Telegraphic Agency) Five hundred Jewish workers, until recently employed in the famous tobacco factory of Schereschewsky at Grodno, were ousted, as a result of the Polish Government action in taking over the monopoly of the tobacco industry.

As soon as the Schereschewsky manufacturing plant came under the administration of the Polish monopoly authorities, an order was issued to the Jewish workers, asking them either to work on Saturday or to leave. A delegation of the Jewish Kahillah here, left to-day for Warsaw to urge the government to withdraw the order.

AUSTRIAN PRESIDENT MAY LOSE ELECTIONS
BECAUSE OF JEWISH WIFE

Vienna, Sept. 8th (Jewish Telegraphic Agency) His Jewish sympathies and more so his Jewish wife, may be a great obstacle for Dr. Michael Hainisch, President of the Austrian Republic, at the Presidential Elections next October.

In nationalistic, Austrian circles, the question has been raised whether Hainische shall receive the support of the Party. The Nationalists object to Hainische on account of his Jewish sympathies and his Jewish wife. It has even been stated that Dr. Hainische, himself, is of Jewish descent. Both these allegations were denied from circles closely related to the President, but the Nationalistic propaganda, however, is still carried on, with the contention that the president is pro-Jewish.

Dr. Hainische was elected December 9th, 1920, for a term of four years. -----

GERMANS CONTEMPLATE SOLVING THEIR
MINORITY IN POLAND

Berlin, Sept. 8th (Jewish Telegraphic Agency) The plans for the demands and tactics of German Minority in Poland, were discussed here at the Polish-German Convention now taking place.

It is stated that according to the plans an agreement between the German Minority in Poland and the Polish Government, should be arrived at, so that the German Minority will leave the Bloc of the National Minorities in Poland.

CHICAGO RABBI DIES AT THE AGE OF 107

Chicago, Sept. 8th (Jewish Telegraphic Agency) Rabbi Solomon Milles, Chicago's oldest citizen, died early this morning at his home 1,142 South Halsted Street, aged 107 years.

Rabbi Milles is survived by his wife, Tillie, five sons, three daughters, twenty-two grandchildren and five great-grandchildren.

DR. NACHMAN SYRKIN, JEWISH ZIONIST-SOCIALIST
LEADER AND PUBLICIST PASSES AWAY

"Hear O Israel, The Lord Our God, The Lord Is One"
was his last expression.

New York, Sept. 8th, (Jewish Telegraphic Agency) Dr. Nachman Surkin, Jewish publicist and founder of the Zionist - Socialist Movement, known under the name of "Poalei Zion", died Saturday in the Mt. Sinai Hospital at the age of fifty-six, after a short illness. He suffered from Diabetes.

The funeral took place Sunday morning with the participation of a large number of his followers. Funeral eulogies were delivered by Dr. Stephen S. Wise, William Edlin, Editor of "The Day", Mr. Max Pine, Dr. Chaim Chernowitz, Mr. Morris Rothenberg and Dr. A. Corolnick.

Dr. Syrkin was born in M ohilev, Russia. He arrived in the United States in the year 1908, where he established the Zionist-Socialist Party, "Poalei Zion" of which he was the most noted theoretician in the United States. He was a frequent contributor to many Jewish newspapers in Yiddish, English and Hebrew.

Dr. Syrkin enjoyed an international reputation and had many followers in various countries. An interesting episode in the life of Dr. Syrkin was the conflict he had with the late Zionist leader, Dr. Max Nordau, during the 9th Zionist World Congress which took place in Hamburg, the year 1910.

Dr. Nordau, as Chairman of the Congress, despatched a message of greetings to the Kaiser. As a socialist, Dr. Syrkin protested violently against the Zionist Congress paying tribute to a Monarch. When Dr. Nordau in reply stated that Dr. Syrkin was a "political adventurer", Dr. Syrkin slapped Nordau's face, causing great excitement and commotion at the Congress.

During the last few months of the late Zionist-Socialist leader, he was dominated by a religious mood. On his sick bed, he repeatedly stated that the greatest achievement of the Jewish people was the imparting to the world, the idea of the Unity of God. It was reported from the sick room that a few minutes before he passed away, he said his prayers according to the Orthodox Jewish ritual and died with the expression "Hear, O Israel, The Lord Our God, The Lord is One."

COLONIAL OFFICE DOES NOT OPPOSE BUILDING OF HARBOR
AT TEL AVIV

Tel Aviv, Sept. 8th (Jewish Telegraphic Agency) The British Colonial Office does not oppose the plans to build a harbor at Tel Aviv, according to the report of Mayor Dizengoff which he submitted to-day to the Township Council of Tel Aviv.

Mayor Dizengoff visited London recently for the purpose of discussing with the Colonial Office, the possibilities of building the proposed harbor at Tel Aviv. The Colonial Office favors also the establishing of a Municipal Mortgage Bank.

DEMAND ABOLITION OF TITHE AS METHOD OF TAXATION

Jerusalem, Sept. 8th (Jewish Telegraphic Agency) The tithe, the Biblical form of taxation practiced in Palestine for many centuries by the Turkish Government, a method of taxation according to which one tenth of the crops is taken by the government in kind, be abolished and instead a modern system of taxation in cash introduced.

This demand was submitted by the Executive of the Palestine Arabs in a memorandum to the Palestinian Government.

DISCUSS RESTRICTIONS FOR TOURISTS IN PALESTINE

Jerusalem, Sept. 8th (Jewish Telegraphic Agency) Much discussion was aroused here in Jewish circles over the question of the difficulties being made for certain classes of tourists who wish to remain in the country. Until recently, tourists who remained in the country after three months were usually given permission to settle permanently. The Hebrew Weekly paper "Hator", published an editorial in which the government policy with this regard is strongly attacked.
