ANGLO-AMERICAN TREATY ON PALESTINE WILL NOT MENTION NATIONAL
HOMELAND

Washington, Sept. 9th (Jewish Telegraphic Agency) Hope of an early conclusion of the treaty between the United States and Great Britain, concerning the equality of rights of American citizens in Palestine, was expressed here to-day in official circles, confirming the London report that the proposed treaty is now under consideration by the British Foreign Office.

It could not be ascertained whether the proposed treaty will contain any reference with regard to the Jewish National Homeland in Palestine. It was stated that none of the provisions of the treaty can be disclosed at present. It is probable, however, that no such a motion will be made in the treaty. It is understood that the treaty will confine itself strictly to the question of American rights in Palestine and will not touch upon any outside political matters.

It is anticipated here that the conclusion of the treaty will be a favorable one and will aid the development of American business connections with the Holy Land. A similar treaty, regarding the Mandated territory of Syria with similar objects in view has already been concluded with France.

CHIEF RABBI OF MOSCOW, DR. MAZEH, SERIOUSLY ILL

Riga, Sept. 9th (Jewish Telegraphic Agency) The Chief Rabbi of Moscow, Dr. Mazeh, is in declining health and his condition is held as very grave, according to reports which reached here from Moscow.

Dr. Mazeh recently suffered several hemorrhages and the attending physicians have expressed the fear that another hemorrhage would cause death.

The sick Rabbi practically lost his sight a short time ago.

AMERICAN JEWESS LEAVES \$100,000 FOR POOR POLISH JEWSPolish Trustees, However, Claim There Are No Poor Jews

Warsaw, Sept. 9th (Jewish Telegraphic Agency) The sum of \$100,000, bequeathed in the will of an American Jewess for the benefit of "poor Jews in her Polish home town", cannot be used for that purpose, because of the assertion of the trustees that there are no poor Jews in the city.

The money was left by Mrs. Lena Cohen of Pennsylvania who died September 15th, 1921. According to the will the above mentioned sum had to be used for the benefit of poor Jews in the city of Bromberg, Province of Posen, which formerly belonged to Germany and is now a part of the Polish Republic. In her will, Mrs. Cohen appointed the Municipality of Bromberg as the trustees of that fund. She also left in the trust of the same Municipality, a gallery of pictures. The Municipality accepted the Art Gallery, but refused to accept the legacy, declaring that there are no poor Jews in Bromberg.

This decision of the Bromberg Municipality is however, in striking contradiction to the opinion held by the Jewish community in Bromberg. In spite of the large emigration of Jews from that city, owing to anti-Semitism, there are still many poor Jews there; according to the Kahillah officials. The Kahilla has now decided to send a delegation to America, headed by its President, Mr. Rudor, for the purpose of explaining the situation of the heirs of Mrs. Cohen.

LEAVE CLEVELAND CHESS CLUB ON ACCOUNT OF ANTI-SEMITISM

Cleveland, Sept. 9th (Jewish-Telegraphic Agency) All the Jewish members, as well as some non-Jewish members withdrew from the Cleveland Chess Club, for the purpose of forming a separate organization as protest against the flagrant anti-Semitic attitude manifested by the club's secretary.

The Secretary, during a membership drive, issued cards as follows: "Good luck to all who shun Jews. In the future, only those speaking the American language will be admitted. No more Jewish jabber in this club room."

NAHUM SOKOLOW, ZIONIST LEADER, TAKEN SERIOUSLY ILL IN BERLIN

Berlin, Sept. 9th (Jewish Telegraphic Agency) Nahum Sokolow, Chairman of the Executive of the World Zionist Organization, was taken seriously ill here. He is suffering from heart trouble and is now being taken care of in a sanitarium.

ROUMANIAN KING RECEIVES BLESSING FROM KLAUSENBERG RABBI

Klausenberg, Sept. 9th (Jewish Telegraphic Agency) A public scene of unusual interest took place yesterday in connection with the Roumanian National Holiday which was celebrated here.

The King and Queen of Roumania, who attended this celebration and received the representatives of all denominations, granted the request of the "National Union of Transilvanian Jews" to receive public blessing from the Chief Rabbi of Klausenberg. After the ceremony, the King thanked the Rabbi and expressed the hope of a happy co-operation with the Jews in Roumania.

FORM WORLD UNION OF JEWISH YOUTH ASSOCIATIONS

Danzig, Sept. 9th (Jewish Telegraphic Agency) The forming of a World Union of Jewish Youth Associations, was proclaimed here at what was termed "World Conference of Jewish Youth Associations" which was concluded here to-day.

Twenty-one associations from nine various countries with a general membership of 40,000 have joined this World Union which was reported at the conference.

CREATE "NATIONAL CENTERS" IN WHITE RUSSIA; YIDDISH TO BE OFFICIAL GOVERNMENT LANGUAGE

Riga, Sept. 9th (Jewish Telegraphic Agency) The creation of "National Centers" was announced by the Communistic White Russian Government in places where the national minorities formed the majority of the population. In many towns and villages of White Russia, the official government business will be conducted in the Yiddish language as a result of this decree. All government documents in this town will also be issued in Yiddish.

Another decree of the White Russian Government, issued to-day, calls for the re-organization of the school system. According to this decree, all instruction is to be given in the mother tongue of the children. The number of Jewish schools in White Russia will therefore, be greatly increased.

CONDEMN YEVSEKZIA FOR ANTI-SEMITIC PERSECUTIONS

Riga, Sept. 9th (Jewish Telegraphic Agency) Condemnation of the "Yevsekzia", the Jewish section of the Communist Party, was expressed in a leaflet issued and circulated illegally by the Zionist-Socialists in the district of Wolyn.

The leaflet strongly protested against the persecutions directed at the Hebrew language and the continuous arrests of Zionists by the "Yevsekzia."

KRASSIN, LITWINOW, AND MERESCHIN, MEMBERS OF JEWISH

LAND COMMITTEE

Riga, Sept. 9th (Jewish Telegraphic Agency) The forming of a special committee to settle Jews on the land was confirmed by the "Zik", the Central Executive Committee of the Communist Party.

Among the members of that committee are the well-known Communist leaders, Litwinow, Krassin, Mereschin and Dimantstein, formerly People's Commissar for Jewish Affairs.

J.W. DAVIS GREETES JEWS

Says There Is No Office In America To Which They May Not Aspire

New York, Sept. 9th (Jewish Telegraphic Agency) John W. Davis has sent greetings to the Jews on the occasion of the Jewish New Year, (Rosh Hashanah) through Isaac Rosengarten, Editor of the Jewish Forum. The letter says:

"I am glad to extend to the Jewish people on Rosh Hashanah my greetings", Mr. Davis wrote. "Washington in 1790 expressed a hope that the sons of Abraham might find in America a land in which they would find no man to molest them and make them afraid. And from that date to this, there is no office, however, lofty, to which a Jew may not aspire; no public duty, however humble, which the Jews of America are not willing to perform. America holds out to you the hand of fellowship, side by side with all our countrymen, animated by firm convictions and ideals of the future."

JEWISH WORKERS IN PALESTINE ELECT COUNCIL

Jerusalem, Sept. 9th (Jewish Telegraphic Agency) The elections to the Jewish Worker's Councils, was completed to-day in all Palestinian towns. The majority of elected members belong to the Jewish Labor Party, "Achduth Ha 'Avoda,"

Among the elected to the Jaffa Council is one Arab railway worker.

ABDUL AZUZ RACHMAN PROVEN INNOCENT ARAB REPORTS STATE

Jerusalem, Sept. 9th (Jewish Telegraphic Agency) Abdul Azuz Rachman, son of the Tul Keren Mayor, who is held under the charge of being the leader of a robber band, was proven to be innocent of this charge, as a result of the police investigation, according to a report published to-day in the Arab press.

MUROCK TO REMAIN SECRETARY OF PALESTINIAN GOVERNMENT

Jerusalem, Sept. 9th (Jewish Telegraphic Agency) Mr. Murock, first Assistant Secretary to Sir Herbert Samuels, who is replacing Sir Keith Roach, will remain in this position for another six months.

Sir Keith Roach is now head of the Palestinian Department in the British Colonial Office.

PROF. MAX L. MORGOLIES LECTURES IN JERUSALEM

Jerusalem, Sept. 9th -By Mail-(Jewish Telegraphic Agency) Although Jerusalem in its present status was not a purely Jewish city, there are features of the Jewish National Home such as the public observance of the sabbath by all Jews, the Hebrew language and the Hebrew educational system, declared Prof. Max L. Margolies of the Dropsie College, Philadelphia, temporarily Professor of the American School of Archaeology in Jerusalem, in a lecture which he delivered here last night.

The Professor expressed the hope that Jerusalem would become the center of Jewish and general culture.
