DIMENSIONS OF PALESTINE REBUILDING WORK MAKE IT DUTY OF ALL JEWRY, SAYS EINSTEIN

Vienna, Sept. 24 (Jewish Telegraphic Agency) "The increased dimensions which the work of rebuilding Palestine has now assumed, make the continuation and the extension of this work the concern of all Jewry", declared Professor Albert Einstein who visited here for the purpose of lecturing, in a statement issued to press representatives today.

"The most difficult work in laying the foundation of the Jewish National Homeland in Palestine has been accomplished by the Zionists. The Jews of the United States, Great Britain and Germany should now be prepared to cooperate with the Zionist organization. I expect from Zionism the rebirth of the Jewish people! My Zionism dates from before my visit to Palestine", Professor Einstein stated. "What I have seen in Palestine gives me an indestructible belief in the success of the Jewish colonization of the country. The present development has assumed overwhelming proportions.

"The Arab problem does not endanger the development of the Jewish National Home. The more the country will develop, the larger will be the possibilities of understanding between the Arabs and the Jews.

"Palestine, once rebuilt as a cultural center, will fortify the position of the Jews all over the world, both morally and politically", Professor Einstein concluded.

Professor Einstein gave a reception at his hotel to many of his friends. Among the guests invited were the well-known writers, Arthur Schnitzler, Felix Salten, the poet Deerhoffmann and others. Professor Einstein is leaving tomorrow for Innsbruck where he will attend the Congress of Natural Scientists.

GERMAN SOCIETY TO COMBAT ANTI-SEMITISM CONDEMNS RACE ANTAGONISM

ution condemning race antagonism, tracing its origin to French sources, was passed today at the Annual Convention of the "Society to Combat Anti-Semitism" which was held here. The resolution condemns particularly the recent propaganda of the German Anti-Semites and points out the high ethics propounded by the Talmud.

The Society consists in the main of German Christians. Among the executives newly elected by the Convention are former Minister Gothein and former Chancellor of the German Reich, Fehrenbach.

LOEB, JEWISH PRESIDENT OF THURINGIAN STATE BANK
ARRESTED AFTER RESIGNATION IN PROTEST OF ANTI-SEMITISM

Weimar, Sept. 24 (Jewish Telegraphic Agency) President Loeb of the Thuringian State Bank was arrested here today following his letter of resignation to the Thuringian Finance Minister.

The Right Party in the Thuringian Diet has started a political campaign against the President of the State Bank, because he is a Jew. The investigation ordered by the Government proved his administration of the Bank irreproachable and the government asked him to remain in office. He, however, declined, claiming that under such anti-Semitic pressure he was unable to carry on the work.

His arrest was made on the charge that he attempted to remove important state documents from the bank.

"JEWRY IN HOUR OF GREATEST NEED", SAYS BRITISH
CHIEF RABBI IN NEW YEAR MESSAGE

London, Sept. 24 (Jewish Telegraphic Agency) Jewry all over the world finds itself in an hour of greatest need, declared Dr. Hertz in his message issued on the occasion

of Rosh Ha'shona.

"Our emigrant brethren, fleeing from famine, racial hatred and religious fanaticism, find the doors of the United States closed to them. The masses of our brethren are again scattered to the four winds. Even in strange, distant lands, the Latin-American countries, the only countries open for our refugee brethren, grave religious dangers await the newcomers. In these countries there is no organized Jewish life, only Marranoism is to be found. Often, the earlier Jewish settlers have totally abandoned Judaism.

"The general outlook on the situation of the Jews sharpens our vision to the supreme task which faces our people," Rabbi Hertz concludes.

PLAN TO ERECT MONUMENT TO CHAIM SALOMON, FIRST JEWISH
IMMIGRANT FROM POLAND; HELPED IN STRUGGLE FOR AMERICAN
INDEPENDENCE

New York, Sept. 24 (Jewish Telegraphic Agency) A monument to the memory of Chaim Salomon, first Jewish immigrant from Poland, who participated in the American Revolution, helping to establish American Independence, is being advocated by the Union of Polish Jews in America. A resolution unanimously adopted at the last meeting of the Union of Polish Jews, in New York, requests the executive committee to take proper steps with the Art and Park Commissions of the City of New York for permission to erect a monument to Salomon in one of the city parks.

Chaim Salomon, born at Lissa, Poland, in 1740, left his native country after the partition of 1722. He settled in New York and during the Revolution, identified himself with the American cause. He was arrested and imprisoned as a spy in September 1776, soon after the occupation of New York by the British.

A report of the United States Senate Committee made in 1850, says that Salomon "gave great assistance to the Government by loans of money, advancing liberally of his means to sustain the men engaged in the struggle for independence at a time when the sinews of war were essential to success."

The Union of Polish Jews, which has, it is stated, seventy constituent societies, intends to issue a public appeal for the necessary funds.

UNIFICATION OF JEWISH EMIGRATION ORGANIZATIONS.
TERMS OF AGREEMENT BETWEEN ICA AND UNITED JEWISH
EMIGRATION COMMITTEE

Warsaw, Sept. 9 (J.T.A. Mail Service) Under the terms of the preliminary agreement between the Ica and the United Jewish Emigration Committee, it is proposed to set up a new Emigration Executive Council of twenty-six persons, of whom thirteen will be appointed by the Ica and the other thirteen will be representatives of the United Jewish Emigration Committee and all the organizations affiliated with it. The Council will elect from among its members, two directors who will conduct the emigration activity of Europe. The agreement has already been endorsed by the United Jewish Emigration Committee and ratification by the Ica is now being awaited.

This statement was made today by Mr. Latski-Bertoldi, a member of the United Jewish Emigration Committee, in an address here to Jewish Pressmen.

Mr. Bertoldi spoke of conditions in the Argentine, where he visited recently. The immigration restrictions in the Argentine, he said, are as severe as in the United States. It was essential that all the Jewish organizations active in the field of emigration unite into one organization, in order to cope with the situation. Even this is insufficient. He suggests that an international body should be created, including not only Jewish emigration societies but those of all other nations suffering from the present immigration restrictions.

POLAND ENFORCES FIRMER POLICY TO PREVENT
WHITE SLAVE TRAFFICKING

Warsaw, Sept. 9 (J.T.A. Mail Service) The Ministry of the Interior has issued an order enforcing stricter supervision with regard to the issue to women and girls of passports for proceeding abroad. Women and girls who apply for passports will have to submit a written statement, signed by the parents or legal guardians, declaring their purpose in leaving the country. Proof will have to be produced from relatives or prospective employers in the country of immigration. If the girl is a minor, the Immigration Office will have to be satisfied as to the person under whose protection she is travelling. In the event of any suspicion as to the correctness of the statements and documents supplied, a secret, thorough investigation will be carried out. Strict supervision is to be exercised also with regard to women and girls arriving in any town in Poland and staying in hotels or furnished rooms.

PALESTINE TELEGRAPHIC AGENCY DESPATCHESWILL BUILD RAILWAY ON ARARAT WHERE NOAH'S ARK RESTED

Jerusalem, Sept. 24 (Jewish Telegraphic Agency) Mount Ararat, on the summit of which, according to Biblical tradition, Noah's Ark rested after the Flood, will be turned into a modern resort for tourists from all parts of the world. A railway is planned to the summit, which is 17,000 feet above sea level.

Ararat, located in eastern Armenia, lying between the lakes Van and Urmia, and the River Araxes, now forms the frontier between Turkey, Persia and Armenia.

Superstitious fear and natural obstacles have prevented the natives from attempting the ascent of the mountain. However, its summit has been repeatedly reached by Europeans and its geological peculiarities have been noted.

Its cone is the crater of an extinct volcano and because of its height, it is snowcapped throughout the year.

EMIR ALI STARTS DEFENSIVE ON WAHABI FORCES

Jerusalem, Sept. 24 (Jewish Telegraphic Agency) The war between Sultan Ibn Saoud, the leader of the Wahabis and the King of the Hedjas, Hussein, continues/ Hussein's troops, besieging the city of Taif, have not been able to recapture the city from the Wahabis.

A new offensive on the Wahabi forces is being organized under the leadership of Emir Ali, the eldest son of King Hussein and Commander of the Hedjas army.
