NEW YORK JEWISH EDUCATIONAL ASSOCIATION REPORTS PROGRESS; FURTHER EXTENSIVE EFFORT IS URGED

Additional 10,000 CHILDREN brought to Hebrew schools,
25,000 participate in contest for regularity of attendance.

New York, Oct. 7 (Jewish Telegraphic Agency) An additional 10,000 Jewish children were placed in Jewish religious schools and Talmud Torahs in the City of New York last year by the Jewish Educational Association, according to reports read at the annual meeting of the Association held last Sunday at the Astor Hotel, under the Presidency of Mr. Israel Unterberg. More than 70% of the new pupils paid their own tuition fee. The balance is being taken care of by a scholarship fund of the Association. Through the propaganda of the Association, not less than 26,000 children in New York were reached by special rallies. 10,000 parents were approached at special parents' meetings.

25,000 pupils participated in a contest for regularity of attendance at the Hebrew schools. 5,000 pupils were awarded prizes for regularity of attendance, in the form of medals and certificates; 130 out of this number were sent, at the expense of the Jewish Educational Association to a summer camp, where their religious education was continued.

The propaganda of the Association has resulted in stimulating local initiative and many new schools are now being opened in neighborhoods where such schools did not exist before.

Judge Otto A. Rosalsky, in a fervent plea on behalf of Jewish education in America, outlined the future plans of the Jewish Educational Association, pointing out that although results of the past activities are very encouraging, still the number of its supporters is not commensurate with the task to be accomplished. In the future, the Jewish Educational Association plans to consecrate its efforts on improving the physical conditions of the existing Hebrew and Jewish religious schools by increasing the facilities.

ELEVENTH GROUP OF ROUMANIAN REFUGEES LANDED IN CANADA

Montreal, Oct. 3 (Jewish Telegraphic Agency Mail Service) The eleventh and largest group of Jewish, stranded refugees who were granted permission by the Canadian government to enter Canada, landed at Halifax on the eve of Rosh Hashana on the S.S. "Fraga", after a journey of twenty-three days directly from Constanza.

The group, consisting of 400 persons, were extended a warm welcome by the Jewish community of Halifax and representatives of the Immigrant Aid Society. 160 of the group remained in Montreal; the other 240 left immediately for Central and Western Canada.

The group made a particularly lasting impression, owing to the fact that among them were many of high intellectual attainments and professional men, such as engineers, dentists students, Hebrew teachers, cantors and Shochetim.

SUCCESSFUL JEWISH GERMAN FINANCIER WINS PRAISE FOR PATRIOTIC WORK

Berlin, Sept. 23 (Jewish Telegraphic Agency Mail Service) The work of a young German Jewish successful financier who overshadows the late Hugo Stinnes, by his patriotic attitude and efforts to bring about a deflation of the German currency, is the topic of many articles in the financial sections of the metropolitan newspapers.

The writers contrast his activities with those of the late Hugo Stinnes and other German industrial and financial magnates, who enriched themselves enormously by the still further inflation of German currency.

The man is Jacob Michael, who is only thirty years of age. He was born in 1894 in Frankfort, the son of an orthodox well-to-do Jewish merchant. He, too, is a strictly observant Jew. Soon after the war, where he fought from the outbreak, he founded the firm of J.Michael & Company, which developed rapidly, and in 1923 owned thirty huge concerns and had international ramifications.

WAHABI FORCES WITHDRAW FROM MECCA TO TAIF FOLLOWING
CONCLUSION OF ARMISTICE

Jerusalem, Oct. 7 (Jewish Telegraphic Agency) The Wahabi forces, following the conclusion of the truce with Ali, newly proclaimed King of Hedjaz, have withdrawn from the district of Mecca, towards Taif.

Further details were made known today concerning the abdication and the succession to the throne of Emir Ali, eldest son of King Hussein and Commander in Chief of the Hedjaz army. The final cause which moved King Hussein to abdicate was the news that he received from London that Great Britain will not intervene in his favor in the fight against the Wahabis.

The Hedjaz Arab notables have demanded of King Hussein to renounce his throne in favor of Ali. Hussein agreed to do so for the sake of peace, he stated. Emir Ali at first refused to accept. On Saturday, he agreed, under the condition that he will not claim any rights to the Moslem caliphate and that peace negotiations be started immediately with the Wahabis.

The abdication of King Hussein was warmly welcomed by the Indian Moslems, according to word received here.

GERMAN ANTI-SEMITES THROW GAS BOMBS AT INTERNATIONAL
PEACE CONGRESS ON ACCOUNT OF JEWISH SPEAKER

Berlin, Oct. 7 (Jewish Telegraphic Agency) Last night's session of the Twenty-third World Peace Congress of International Peace Societies, which was at first totally ignored by the German Government, caused great excitement here. Bombs spreading gases of evil odor were thrown into the hall where the Congress is being held, and many thousands of Hakenkreutzler and Republicans marched in the streets of Berlin, the former in protest and the latter in defense of the Congress.

The excitement centered around Professor Victor Dasch of the Sorbonne, noted French pacifist and well-known Zionist, who was to address the Congress last night. Professor Dasch, however, before coming to the Congress was notified by Von Zitzewitz, Chief of Police of Potsdam, that the meeting was prohibited by the police on the ground that they are unable to guarantee his safety. Von Zitzewitz threatened Professor Dasch with arrest if he attempts to enter the town. In reply, Professor Dasch stated that he would not mind being jailed in a similar manner to the great Fren-

chman, Voltaire, who was imprisoned in Berlin during the time of Frederick the Great, in 1752.

Feeling ran so high that the Prussian Minister of Interior, Herr Severing, found it necessary to send a special police despatch to the Congress and to personally supervise the enforcement of order.

Members of the anti-Semitic Hakenkreutzler Society, in the meantime, captured Professor Lasch's automobile, aiming thus to prevent him from addressing the Congress. This led to fights between the Hakenkreutzler and the German Republicans. Many were arrested by the police.

Professor Lasch, however, succeeded in reaching the Congress and delivering his address on International Peace, despite the bad odor caused by the gas bombs.

KARL ARNSTEIN, BUILDER OF THE ZR-3 REJECTED FROM
LECTURESHIP BECAUSE OF JEWISH FAITH

Berlin, Oct. 7 (Jewish Telegraphic Agency) The ZR-3, expected to leave on its trans-Atlantic voyage Saturday, October 11, was built under the direction of Engineer Karl Arnstein, according to information made known here.

Karl Arnstein, who holds the title of Doctor of Engineering of the University of Prague, is thirty-seven years of age. He was formerly assistant professor of the Department of Bridge Building in Prague University, Chief Engineer of the Strasbourg Zuegling Company, builders of the Langenwieser Railway Bridge, which was the subject of admiration and scientific discussion at the Berlin Shipbuilding Congress. In 1915 Arnstein was appointed a member of the staff of the Zeppelin works at Friedrichshafen, where he is now the chief engineer.

Mr. Arnstein was considered for a lectureship at the German Technicum in Prague in 1923. He was, however, rejected on account of his Jewish faith.

SYRIAN PARTIES DESIRE INDEPENDENT GOVERNMENT

Jerusalem, Sept. 23 (Jewish Telegraphic Agency Mail Service) Syria is in a state of anarchy, according to cables reported by the Arab paper "Al Carmel" to have been sent by the Union of Syrian Parties at Damascus to the French Government, King Hussein and Emir Ali. The cables suggest that the only way to bring about order is a proclamation of independence, establishing a Parliamentary Monarchy in Syria.

PALESTINE TELEGRAPHIC AGENCY DESPATCHESALI ELECTED KING; CONCLUDES TRUCE WITH IBN SAUD

Jerusalem, Oct. 6 (Jewish Telegraphic Agency) Emir Ali, eldest son of King Hussein, has concluded a truce with the Wahabis. According to the terms of the Truce, Ali, who was today elected King of Hedjaz, promises to abandon his claim to the caliphate and agrees to pay a yearly subsidy to the conquering power.

Ali, who is forty two, is a practical politician, and concluded the truce with despatch. According to the report, he is on good terms with Ibn Saud, victorious leader of the Wahabis, whom he will meet in Mecca on Friday.

It is reported that opposition against the dynasty now in power is noticeable.

Emir Ali is recalling the delegation of five members sent by King Hussein to Moscow to ask for help in his fight against the Wahabis.

Emir Ali will sign the Anglo-Hedjaz Treaty as proposed by the British Government, is the opinion expressed in Arab circles here. King Hussein had refused to attach his signature to this treaty on account of the clause recognizing the British Mandate of Palestine, for the realization of the Jewish National Homeland.

EMIR ZEID DENIES POLITICAL MISSION TO LONDON

Jerusalem, Oct. 6 (Jewish Telegraphic Agency) Emir Zeid, youngest son of King Hussein, when interviewed in Beiruth denied the rumor that he is proceeding to England on a political mission on behalf of his father. "I am going to England, where I will study at Cambridge University for one or two years", he stated.

CASE AGAINST MADAM SHOCHAT CANCELLED

Jerusalem, Oct. 7 (Jewish Telegraphic Agency) Madam Manya Shochat, (Wilbushinsky), well known in the Jewish labor movement, who was arrested in connection with the murder of Jacob Israel de Haan will not be tried on the charges made against her. After the investigation made by the police authorities, the case was dismissed.
