

IBN SAUD DEPOSES KING ALI, APPOINTS ALISAIDAR PASHA EMIR OF MECCA

(Jewish Telegraphic Agency)

Jerusalem, Oct. 22.—Emir Ali, Commander in Chief of the Hedjaz army and newly elected King, after the abdication of his father, Hussein, is to share his father's fate because of the anti-Hashamite determination of Ibn Saud, victorious leader of the Wahabis.

Ibn Saud today appointed as Emir of Mecca, Sheriff Alisaidar Pasha, now Resident at Constantinople. Ibn Saud is expected to arrive in the Holy City with his suite today to make an inspection of the Moslem Holy Sites.

Well informed circles expect further dramatic developments in the Wahabi action against the Hashamite family. It is stated that after the deposing of King Ali, Ibn Saud will demand the abdication of Emir Feisul, King of Mesopotamia, and Emir Abdullah, ruler of Transjordan, the sons of Hussein.

RUSSIAN "COMMITTEE FOR SETTLING JEWS ON THE LAND" DECIDES TO INCREASE ALLOTMENTS FOR JEWISH COLONIZATION

Takes Up Question of Control; Outlines Plan of Organization, Including Representation of "Toiling Jewish Masses"

Moscow, Oct. 22.—Increased activities with regard to the settling of Jews on the land in Soviet Russia are outlined in the decisions of the official "Committee for Settling Jews on the Land". At the recent meeting of the Committee a resolution was adopted to immediately allot sufficient land in southern Ukraina for the settlement of 3,000 Jewish families during 1925.

For the purpose of having all available data on the subject the Committee has decided to ask the Agricultural Commissariats in Ukraina, Crimea and White Russia to present the exact figures during this month of the land available for allotment for Jewish colonization work.

The Committee has also decided to send several of its members to obtain a first hand knowledge of the soil allotted for Jewish colonization.

The meeting of the "Committee for Settling Jews on the Land" took up the question of organizing the Jewish colonization work in Soviet Russia and the criticism voiced against the previous methods of the work both in Russia and abroad. The Committee came to the conclusion that the best plan for the efficiency of the work would be to create separate Zeks (Central Executive Committees) and Gubispolkoms (Regional Executive Committees) in the respective Soviet republics. These should act as local committees, supervising and putting into effect the colonization plans, according to the directions of the Central Committee. As to the membership of these Committees and the representation of the various elements in them, the official "Committee for Settling Jews on the Land" decided that they should consist of representatives of the Agricultural Peoples Commissariat and of those Jewish social workers who are connected with the "Toiling Jewish Masses."

With regard to the question of the actual control of the colonization work which was before the official Committee for consideration, it has been decided that the local Committees should have no operative function, but their work should be limited to "regulating the transmigration and colonization."

GERMAN MONARCHISTS AND REPUBLICANS WILL MEET IN FINAL BATTLE AT APPROACHING ELECTIONS; JEWISH QUESTION, ISSUE OF CAMPAIGN

Hitler-Ludendorff Party Issues Anti-Semitic Campaign Manifesto.

Berlin, Oct. 22.—December 7 will be a great day in the history of Germany and may decide the future course of the German Republic. On that day the new elections for the Reichstag will take place, according to the decision of the Federal Cabinet. Elections to the Bavarian legislature, the Prussian legislature, and the municipal and provincial legislative bodies in Prussia, Bavaria, Thuringia and several other German states will also take place on the same day. There is even a possibility that if President Ebert resigns, the new presidential elections will also take place on that day.

After the acceptance of the Dawes plan, the general election in Germany will be fought on the cardinal question: What the German Reich is to be in the future, republican or monarchist. Republicans and monarchists alike are already very active preparing their party platforms and campaign slogans. From all indications, this fight will be carried to the greatest extremes. As always, since the collapse of the German Empire, it is stated here, the new elections bring a new wave of anti-Semitic propaganda and the Jewish question will be made one of the issues of the campaign.

In connection with the approaching election campaign, the Hitler-Ludendorff party issued a manifesto today in which it states that the party will fight for the liberation of Germany from the domination of Jewish and French capitalists.

SIR ERNEST DOWSON INVITED TO ADVISE ON COMPLETION OF LAND SURVEY

Jerusalem, Oct. 11.—The Palestine Government is taking steps for the speedy completion of the Cadastral Survey of Palestine which was begun in February, 1921, having as its main object the provision of large-scale maps showing property boundaries with sufficient accuracy to enable them to be used with a title to property.

Sir Ernst MacLeod Dowson, adviser to the Egyptian Ministry of Finance, and Director-General Survey of Egypt, has been invited by the Palestine Government, says an official statement, which has just been issued here, to advise the Government with regard to the completion of the survey.

SIR HERBERT SAMUEL CONFERS WITH MUSSOLINI AND CARDINAL GASPARRI

Rome, Oct. 22.—Sir Herbert Samuel, High Commissioner of Palestine arrived here today and conferred with Prime Minister Mussolini and Cardinal Gasparri, the Secretary of the Vatican.

Cardinal Gasparri expressed his satisfaction with Samuel's report on the situation of Catholic affairs in Palestine.

ICA CHARGED WITH RESPONSIBILITY FOR CANCELLATION OF CANADIAN GOVERNMENT'S AGREEMENT

Irregularities of Canadian Committee Member Reported; Government's Action Was Result of Canadian Steamship Agencies' Protest.

Grave charges against the Ica and one of its Canadian representatives in connection with the cancellation by the Canadian Government of its agreement to admit 5,000 Russian Jewish refugees into Canada are made by the Montreal correspondent of the "Jewish Morning Journal" today.

The correspondent asserts that Jewish leaders in Canada have been aware for some time of certain irregularities in connection with the selection and transportation of the refugees to be admitted into Canada. The matter, however, was suppressed because it was felt that any criticism voiced would prove harmful to the cause of the refugees.

It is asserted that after the Ica had aided a certain number of refugees on their way from Roumania to Canada, the organization found the enterprise too expensive and then decided to send to Canada only those refugees who could pay their way in full. There were, however, few refugees in Roumania who could finance their journey. One of the members of the Canadian Ica Committee left for Europe and entered into an agreement with the Holland-American Line, according to which this member was to receive \$25.00 for every ticket sold by the Steamship Company to the emigrants proceeding from Europe to Canada.

As the terms of the agreement between the Ica and the Canadian Government granted permission specifically to the Russian Jewish refugees in Roumania, it is alleged that irregularities were committed and refugees stranded in other European countries outside of Roumania were included.

It is further asserted by the correspondent that the matter was taken up by Canadian steamship lines, who resented the fact that the agreement for transportation of the refugees or emigrants was concluded with the Holland-American Line to the disadvantage of the Canadian steamship lines, such as the Canadian Pacific and the Canadian Steamship Line. This protest of the steamship agencies resulted in an order issued several weeks ago by the Canadian Minister of Immigration, stating that whereas permission was granted only to refugees, no more immigrants will be permitted to enter.

TRANSYLVANIA RABBI DIES IN JERUSALEM

DAILY DIGEST OF WORLD PUBLIC OPINION ON JEWISH MATTERS

Theoretical Anti-Semitism Worse Than Political

Discussing the attitude of the famous German philosopher and historian, Oswald Spangler, toward anti-Semitism, the Jewish Morning Journal of October 22, says editorially:

"The fact that Herr Spangler has come out openly against anti-Semitism will not surprise anyone. We assume that philosophers who devote themselves to historical researches cannot but oppose a movement which is not philosophical and which history shows is not justified.

"If, however, we read the book which has made Herr Spangler famous, 'The Demise of the Occident', we begin to doubt if we may consider Herr Spangler a friend of the Jews. He writes that Christianity and Mohamedanism are Arabian products and it is his conviction that the Jews have contributed nothing to the development of culture and civilization.

"While we fully appreciate Herr Spangler's outspoken attitude toward anti-Semitism, we nevertheless feel that one who denies the greatness of the Jewish past and belittles the contribution of the Jews to the civilization of the world can hardly be considered a real friend of the Jewish people."

Jewish Ideals Must Be Revived

The conclusion of the Jewish high-holiday season gives the editorial writer of The Day (Oct. 21) occasion to draw a parallel between three generations of Jews.

"Three generations rejoiced: The old—over the Torah, the middle-aged—over the business page in the newspaper, the young—over the sport page and its news of ball games and prize fights.

"This analogy may sound like a cartoon exaggeration, but in reality it is based on facts. We know that the old generation was always deeply absorbed in the Torah, always remembered the great Jewish heritage of learning and idealism, whereas the new generation absorbed in business and sports has become oblivious to those things.

"This great estrangement between the two generations constitutes one of the most urgent problems in American Jewry. There is a chasm between the old generation and the new and this chasm must be bridged. We must implant again in the heart of the new generation the glorious Jewish ideals. The Jew of today must rediscover his spiritual position in the world."

ANTI-JEWISH DISTURBANCES AT BUDAPEST UNIVERSITY: SENATE INTERVENES WITH MINISTER OF EDUCATION

Budapest, Oct. 6.—The Senate of Budapest University visited today the Minister of Education, Count Klobelsberg and made representations to him against the attack last week on several Jewish students who were attending the lecture on anatomy.

The Minister of Education said that the demand made by the anti-Jewish students for the production of certificates by the students attending the lecture for the purpose of identifying which of them were Jewish, was quite illegal.

MARQUIS THEODOLI TO PRESIDE OVER MANDATES COMMISSION

Geneva, Oct. 22.—The Fifth Session of the Mandates Commission of the League of Nations which will consider the reports on Palestine tomorrow, will be presided over by Marquis Theodoli of Italy. Great Britain will be represented by Sir Frederick Lugard.

IMPRISONED ZIONISTS IN SOVIET RUSSIA DECLARE HUNGER STRIKE

Communist Persecutions Against Zionists and
Hebrew Language Gain in Severity.

Riga, Oct. 22.—A five-day strike has been declared by the Zionist-Socialists imprisoned in Odessa, as a protest against the severe treatment they are subjected to by the Communist prison authorities.

From almost every part of Russian come reports of further arrests of Zionists, their imprisonment and exile. Zionist-Socialists were deported from Winnitza. Among them is Petrakowsky, whose crime consisted in publicly protesting against the persecutions of Socialists by the Communist Government, pointing out the keen disappointment of the Russian revolutionists that the methods of the Czaristic government had been adopted by a government claiming to represent the working masses.

Others among those who have been deported are: Madam Basja, Lulka Weissmann, a physician, Treidmann, Starosta, Bell Lulka, Joseph Abraham and the brothers, Wigdorsohn. Especially tragic is the case of the Wigdorsohn family. Two brothers were deported some time ago as Zionist-Socialists and now their aged parents, with four sons in exile, are left alone, unable to provide for themselves, exposed to starvation. All appeals to the authorities to permit at least one of the sons to remain at home were denied.

Lubarsky, the leader of the Haschomer Hazoir has also been arrested. His arrest has caused great resentment in Zionist circles. The Haschomer Hazoir functions similarly to the Chalutz, a group of young Zionists who are preparing to assume in Palestine the task of Shomrim (watchmen) and agricultural workmen. The arrest caused surprise because the Soviet government had previously displayed appreciation and understanding of the Chalutz and the Haschomer Hazoir, whose aim of transforming the Jews into a productive, agricultural class conforms with Soviet principles.

Reports received from Russia confirm the impression that the persecutions of the Zionists continue unabated and have even gained in severity recently. A number of prominent officials in the Soviet Government have shown repeated readiness to recognize the peaceful character of the Zionist movement and have even been willing to concede the assertion that the Zionists have anti-revolutionary ideas as groundless. The Soviet Government has legalized the Chalutz, and some time ago gave permission to the Zionists to establish Hebrew courses, but every concession made by the Government has been blocked by the "Yevsektzia", who continue to instigate arrests of Zionists and even refuse the Zionists permission to carry on such activities as are officially legalized by the Soviet Government. Even an impartial and general organization like the "Jewish Self-Defense" was subjected to persecution by the Jewish Communists because it includes elements of a Jewish national tendency.

Especially disconcerting is the antagonism against Hebrew. The Soviet laws do not prohibit any language, but Hebrew has been excluded because of the contention of the "Yevsektzia" that the teaching of Hebrew constitutes religious instruction, which is prohibited by the government. After the Zionists persistently pointed out that the Hebrew courses established by them have no religious character and are even frowned upon by orthodox Jews for that reason, permission was granted by the Government, but the Jewish Communists, claiming they would be anti-revolutionary centers, have prevented the Hebrew courses.

The Zionists of Soviet Russia have reached a stage of utter despair.

Laying the Foundation For A Mexican Jewish Community

Mexico City, Oct. 16.—The establishment of a B'nai B'rith house in Mexico City, under the direction of J. L. Weinberger, is the first step toward a systematic aid of the immigrants, who in large numbers, are coming constantly to Mexico. At present the Jewish population numbers over ten thousand, no exact census having been made, and a large majority of these are young men and boys who not only have no homes but who, literally, have no place to go and no one with whom to speak.

From the day of its opening the B'nai B'rith became a meeting place for the newcomers; for over a thousand young men and boys who belong to no Jewish organization whatsoever.

Work in aiding the immigrants is done through an agent in the port of Vera Cruz, who straightens out all landing difficulties, provides those who have nothing with a place to sleep, and aids them to reach the capital, where at first they are lodged in the B'nai B'rith house, if they have no money. The house has several large dormitories, small rooms, bathroom facilities, restaurant, clubroom, and the beginning of a gymnasium.

The most important branch is the employment agency, which is active in finding positions for the newcomers, preferably in industrial and professional fields. It is aimed to relieve the congestion in the fields of peddling and small dry goods establishments. While many of the immigrants were fitted, both by training and experience, for technical work, their ignorance of the language and customs made it practically impossible for them to obtain this sort of position. There is a nucleus of a school, classes have been opened in Spanish and commercial branches, as well as industrial. There is a large shoemaking class, which apprentices work through a co-operative system. Considering the future there is in Mexico for shoemaking branches, this class is a wise institution. It is taught by one of the Jewish manufacturers of the city. Many of the Beginners of Spanish are taught by students themselves, boys who have been in Mexico longer and who can make themselves understood, while the advanced Spanish classes are in charge of trained teachers.

It is expected that the B'nai B'rith House will become the center not only of social welfare for the immigrants, but the point from which the peopling of Mexico with Jews will spread, an idea that is not talk nor idle dreaming, but an actually occurring fact.

BALKAN QUESTION AGAIN

Berlin, Oct. 12.—The Jews of Germany are guaranteed the right by Paragraph III of the Constitution of the Republic to move freely in all parts of the German Republic, declared Deputy Dr. Badt in a speech in the Prussian Diet in the course of a debate on the Estimates of the Ministry of the Interior. He demanded that the Government should therefore immediately put a stop to the exclusion of Jews from the North Sea resort of Borkum, such exclusion being definitely in contravention of the Constitution. In defiance of the Government's prohibition, he said, the Municipal Board of Borkum is still playing at the close of each performance the so-called "Borkum Song" which declares that "No Jew may stand on Borkum's strand." The Constitution of Germany recognizes no distinction between German citizens who are Jews and citizens who are not Jews.

ROTHSCHILD FOUNDATION IN PARIS ISSUES REPORT

Paris, Oct. 7.—The Rothschild Foundation, comprising the Hospital in the Rue de Santerre, the Hospice in the Rue de Picpus and the Orphanage in the Rue Esmilardie, has just published its report for the year 1923. The total expenditure for the year for the three establishments amounts to 2,721,510 Francs.

No distinction of race is made and patients of every creed are treated under the auspices of the Rothschild Foundation.

41,200 patients were treated during the year (3,000 more than in 1922). Maternity cases numbered 11,194. 11,451 patients were given surgical treatment, 645 of them being admitted as in-patients. The death rate among the patients decreased to 3.2% from 4.6% in 1922. The number of "out-patients" consultations was 33,458, as against 32,766 in the previous year. There were 3,442 radiograph cases.

The Hospice provided accommodation on December 31st for 76 inmates. The Administrative Council states that the Hospice is in urgent need of enlargement to provide more accommodation. A section of the hospital has meanwhile been reserved for aged persons who cannot be admitted to the Hospice because of lack of space.

On December 31st the Orphanage gave accommodation to 147 children, 87 girls and 60 boys.

BREVITIES

Representative men of the Specialty shops, retail and department stores, of this city, met today at the Hotel Pennsylvania, at a luncheon given by Mr. Horace A. Saks to complete plans for raising \$50,000 their quota in the \$1,000,000 drive for the Federation for the Support of Jewish Philanthropic Societies, which will open October 26. At the same time another group of men, representing the Butter and Egg industry of the Business Men's Council of the Federation, with Herbert S. Martin as Councilor, pledged themselves to the extent of \$15,000.

Among those who pledged themselves to see that their groups get over the job, were Mr. Isaac Liberman, Mr. Samuel Brill, Mr. Edward Goodman, Mr. Morris Lieberman, Mr. Percy S. Straun, Mr. Samuel J. Bloomengdale, Mr. Bernard F. Gimbel, Mr. Frederick F. Lowenthal, and Mr. Benjamin Titman.

New headquarters for the National Deserter Bureau, which is maintained by the Federation for the Support of Jewish Philanthropic Societies, were opened at 724 Broadway.

The removal of the offices from the United Hebrew Charities Building, at 367 Second Avenue was necessary, due to the extension of the work of the Bureau which deals with cases of family desertion and domestic relations in general. Up to October 1st, 245 cases were handled by the Bureau which has, besides its offices in this city, branches in all the large cities of the country. Through these agencies information regarding deserters is obtained from relatives and friends. Publicity has proved one of the most effective methods of rounding up deserters. Photographs and stories published in the Yiddish and English press has led to the discovery of many men who have attempted to shirk family responsibilities by the simple expedient of disappearing.

The work among immigrants is extensive, one of the greatest problems being to force immigrant husbands to support families left in Europe.

A reception in honor of Dr. David Yellin, Palestine scholar, vice-Mayor of Jerusalem and President of the Vaad Ha'Amim, will take place on the evening of October 23 at the Hotel Astor.

The reception is being arranged by the Zionist Organization of America. Miss Henrietta Sack, acting chairman, will preside. Dr. Stephen S. Wise, Reubin Braun, Morris Rosenberg, and Dr. David Tannenbaum will welcome Dr. Yellin.

"My first job at Albany will be to put the legislature on record against the unjust opera law. I shall push a resolution, instructing Senators Mulwray and Cleveland to work and do the best for its repeal." Louis W. Fein, Republican candidate for Assembly in the Seventh District, Harlem, pledged himself last night at a meeting of the League of Foreign-Born Citizens.

Dr. Shmura Levin, well-known Zionist, left England today for Canada, where he will participate in the Keren Hayanoel campaign.

Mrs. Anna Moskowitz Kross, a Jewish attorney of this city, has been appointed trustee in charge of that part of J. P. Morgan's estate which he bequeathed to relatives, who are still minors. Mrs. Kross was born in Russia and came to this country when she was a little girl, receiving her education in New York public schools and her legal training in the Law School of New York University.

IBN SAUD SIGNED TREATY TO PREVENT CONSTRUCTING TRANSJORDANIA-MESO- POTAMIA RAILWAY

London, Oct. 10.—Major-General Sir Foster Newland of the Egyptian Expeditionary Force raises the question of British interests in Arabia in connection with the Wahabi invasion of the Hedjaz.

An agreement, he writes, has already been signed between Ibn Saud and Nouri Shahlam, the chief of the Roda tribes, in which, I have received information from a trustworthy source, there is an article that Nouri Shahlam and his tribes will always do their best to prevent the English from constructing a railroad from Transjordan to Mesopotamia. This gives some idea of their fanaticism and hatred to all modern enterprise and civilization and they are specially inimical to the English. It is contrary to our interests that Ibn Saud should gain the victory and establish a wide interest in the Arabic Peninsula.

King Hussein entered the war with us, General Newland continues, as our Ally when we were fighting the Turks, and by his action and loyalty in great difficulties saved what might have been a Jihad or Holy War. We have given every promise to King Hussein for the independence of his Arabic kingdom, none of which promises have we kept. Both justice and interest oblige us to fulfill our promises to King Hussein.

AUSTRALIAN JEWS PASS RESOLUTION AGAINST ACCEPTING PROSELYTES

Sydney, Aus.—The question of whether the Jewish community in Australia is to admit proselytes from among the local population, who are desirous of embracing Judaism, discussed for some time in the Australian Jewish communities, reached its culmination during the past High Holiday season.

The proselytizing question has held the attention of Jewish communal leaders, the Rabbis and the press in Sydney and Melbourne, where the proselytes usually apply for admission into the Jewish communities.

This practice will now end, because of the resolution adopted at the annual General Meeting held in the Great Synagogue of Sydney, where the question was decided today.

It was pointed out in the resolution that the admitting of large numbers of converts brings about confusion in the Jewish communities.
