IFWISH AGENCY SUBMITS FIRST REPORT ON PALESTINE DEVELOPMENT TO LEAGUE OF NATIONS MANDATES COMMISSION

Most Unique Document in Jewish and International History Since Conquest of Palestine By Titus— Zionist Organization. Acting As Jewish Agency, Tells Story of First Stages of Palestine Up-Building Works—SZ7,000,000 Invested in Palestine Since British Occupation—Variation of Figures of Jewish Palestine Immigration Described—Has Continued Confidence in Mandatory Power and League of Nations, Jewish Agency Declares.

Geneva, Oct. 23.-From the time Palestine was first occupied by the British until today not less than \$27,000,000 were invested in the country by Jews, including the Zionist Organization, the Keren Hayesod, the Jewish National Fund and private Jewish investments, it was stated in the invace Jewish investments, it was stated in the first report submitted by the Zionist Organization acting under Article IV of the Mandate as to the Jewish Agency, to the Mandates Commission of the League of Nations in its Fifth Session here

today.

The report, which represents the most unique-document in Jewish as well as international history document in Jewish as wen as international hastory since the conquest of Palestine by Titus, begins with reference to Article IV of the Mandate of the League of Nations given to Great Britain under which the Zionist Organization is recognized. as the Jewish Agency. A picture of the Zionist movement and the position of the Jews in Palestine before the war and before the Balfour De-claration was issued is given in detail. The claration was issued is given in detail. The changes which have been brought about by the Mandate and its effect upon the political situa-tion of Palestine and how the Mandate works are described. A brief history of the Zionist movement and an outline of the Zionist Organization preceeds a detailed narrative of the efforts nade by the Zionist Organization to secure the co-operation of other Jewish bodies for the up-building of Palestine as the Jewish National Homeland and the forming of an enlarged Jewish Agency.

YOUNG ZIONISTS ISSUE PROTEST AGAINST SOVIET GOVERNMENT Complain of Anti-Semitic Tendencies in Ukrainian Government.-Communist Authorities Arrest Thousands for Spreading Anti-Soviet

Proclamations. (Jewish Telegraphic Agency)

Riga. Oct. 23 .- The Zeiri Zionists in Ukrainia have issued proclamations to the Jewish popula-tion of the Ukraine accusing the Soviet authorities of anti-Semitism and of depriving the Jews of Ukrainia of the last economic position they held in the country. The proclamations of the Zeir Zionists draw attention to the appalling misery which has been the fate of the Jewish masses since the Soviet rule was introduced. They bitterly attack the government, under which seven years after the Bolshevist revolution, freedom of speech and liberty in holding meetings are dracon-ically suppressed; the government has deprived thousands of Jews of their livelihood by re-introducing its old policy against private trade.

"The situation", the proclamations continue, "has

reached the stage where we cannot continue to suffer silently. The Soviet Government, which claims to know no differences of race and religion, has dismissed thousands of Jewish officials and under the mask of Sovietism, the most fanatic, nationalistic and chauvinistic Ukrainian policy is being conducted."

Following the issuance of these proclamations, the authorities have taken active measures to sup-press the activities of the Zeiri Zionists. Anyone, however slightly suspected, has been arrested. It is estimated that the number of arrests runs into thousands.

The courageous and fearless action of the Zeiri Zionists has strongly impressed the public. The Jewish Communist newspaper of Moscow, the "Emes" expresses in an editorial the fear that the Zeiri Zionists agitation will meet with response in view of the deplorable situation facing the Jewish artisans because of the dismissal of Jewish officials by the Ukrainian Soviet officials. The paper admits that these dismissals are the consequence of the Ukrainiazation of the administration, which the Zeiri Zionists stigmatize as anti-Semitism.

American Jews Only Hope of Refugees

Writing about the Jewish refugees who have been left stranded in various ports of Europe and in Cuba, owing to the decision of the Canadian government to bar further immigration of refugees to her shores, I. L. Dalidanski, in an article which appears in the Jewish Daily News of Oct.

22. \$49.5:
There are at the present time ten thousand Jewish refugees in various European ports and five thousand in Cuba who are affected by Canada's decision. These refugees were on their way to the United States, when the Johnson bill was adopted, closing the doors of this country to them. At the same time they are being allowed. in the various ports only temporarily fierance. Koumania has made several to remain and on sufferance. attempts to deport them and may carry her intenattempts to depot them and may carry me mention into effect any day; those refugees who are in the ports of England are being permitted to remain only on condition that they refrain from seeking employment, for England has a million and 300 thousand of her own unemployed who are in need of jobs. "And worst of all perhaps is the fact that nearly

all the refugees have been deprived of citizenship in the respective countries from where they originally emigrated. They cannot go anywhere, they

have no haven.

"What is to be done about these unfortunate

"It is an awful problem and tremendously diffi-ult to solve. But this should not deter the cult to solve. American Jews from taking immediate action. A American Jews from taking immediate action. A start has already been made in collecting the funds necessary to keep the refugees from starving. This work should be hastened with the participation of all classes of Jews.

Russian Zionists Threatened with Exile to Siberia

"The lewish communists in Russia have taken the latest revolt against the Soviet Power in Georgia as an excuse to cause the arrest and imprisonment of hundreds of Zionists in Russia." writes the correspondent of the Jewish Daily News

from Moscow under date of Sept. 26.
"The chiefs of the Soviet government are well aware that the Zionists are not engaged in counter-revolutionary activity, but they have always had to yield to the Jewish communists who are forever exerting themselves to suppress the Zion-ist movement in Russia. In the past, however, the punishment meted out to the Zionists was not very severe. They were usually exiled to other countries and frequently direct to Palestine, which was not at all to their dislike.

"But now, on the occasion of the counter-revo-lutionary revolt in Georgia, hundreds of Zionists are apparently to be exiled to remote parts of Siberia far removed from civilization, which will be a punishment indeed.

"Punishment for what?

"The Zionists are not guilty of any transgression whatsoever. But the fact that they are the most active and self-conscious element in Russian Jewry and that they impede the process of assimilation is ground enough for the Jewish communists to persecute them.

"In 1920 when a large number of Zionists were 18 1920 when a large number of Zionists were arrested the American Jew. Fischer, interceded in their behalf and succeeded in having them liberated. If the Jews of America and other countries would let their voice be heard in Moscow now, it is not impossible that the imprisoned Zionists would be freed. After all the pressure of public opinion brings results."

CORPSE QUESTION AGAIN CAUSES ANTI-SEMITIC DISTURBANCES IN HUNGARIAN UNIVERSITIES

(Special Despatch to the Tewish Daily Bulletin) Budapest, Oct. 22 .- A strong anti-Semitic agitation has broken out in Hungarian universities, restime in the closing of one institution, the Col-lege of Forestry and Mine Engineering in Selm Ezzbanya. Students there demanded the expulsim of the only two Jewish students, and the rector, unable to reach an agreement with them, closed the college.

In Szigedin the students demanded that Jews be excluded from classes in anatomy until Jewish bodies were furnished for dissection. As a Jewish community assumed the responsibility of burying the unidentified Jewish dead no bodies of Jews came into the hands of the authorities

from the usual channels. In Parliament the Minister of the Interior said:

The students act unleavilly, but I sympathize with them. We cannot punish Hungarian youths for a few Jews."

Education Committee Bars Alien Children From Scholarship Competitions (Jewish Telegraphic Agency)

London, Oct. 23.—Children of aliens shall not be setmined to compete for scholarships in the schools of London, according to the decision of the Education Committee of the London County Council

The Palestine Government Loan The Jewish Agency Should Prepare to Protect Jewish

(By Our Palestine Correspondent, S. Schwartz)

Jerusalem. Oct. 1.-It seems certain now that the

Palestine government loan about which there has been a great deal of talk for a long time will be a fact in the very near future.

The regular annual budget with which the Palesin a regular annual bodger with which the Pales-tine government has had to work so far has been insufficient and has resulted in a deficit of one and a half million pounds. The only reason a loan has not been granted the Palestine government in the past was the unstable condition prevailing in Palestine. Today, however, Palestine is in a state of peace and order, the mandate has been ratified of peace and order, the mandate has been ratified by all the Powers and the relations between England and Palestine are much firmer than ever before. So there is no reason for the loan to be further delayed.

It is said the loan will amount to 3½ million pounds. Deducting the 1½ million pounds of debt will leave the government approximately 2 million pounds to continue the good work it has been doing in constructing bridges, highways, railroads,

It is vitally important that the Jews, through their official instrumentality, the Jewish Agency, should prepare in advance for the time when the loan is secured in order to be able to derive from it the full share of benefits to which they are entitled.

It is unfortunate that up till now the Jewish Agency has been centering its entire attention on political activity, ignoring every issue of a finan-cial or economic nature, for economic questions

are ever closely related to politics.

The Jewish Agency should alter its policy at care. The question of the Palestine government loan offers a good opportunity for such a change of attitude.

It is evident that the loan, when it is secured and put into operation will be used mainly for the following purposes:

The establishment of a farmers' credit bank. General improvements and public welfare.

The construction of public schools, bureaus,

Those familiar with the situation in Palestine know how necessary it is for the Jews to be on their guard lest they be slighted when the time arrives for realizing the projects just named out of the junds of the loan.

The Jews must demand that their interests be taken care of, that they get a square deal for the Jewish farmers when the credit bank begins to operate, that their schools receive sufficient financial help as compared to the Arab schools, that Jewish laborers and contractors, who are skilled and efficient, be given consideration when the contracts for new public works of all kinds will be handed out.

When the loan is secured it should find the Jewish Agency prepared to protect the interests of the Jews in Palestine.

JEWISH AGENCY SUBMITS FIRST REPORT ON PALESTINE DEVELOPMENT TO LEAGUE OF NATIONS MANDATES COMMISSION

Article VI of the Mandare says that the Administration of Palestine shall "facilitate Jewish immigration under suitable conditions and shall encourage, in co-operation with the Jewish Agency, close sctitement by Jews on the land, including state lands and waste lands not required for public purposes." The report of the Jewish Agency in quoting this article of the Mandate makes it clear that in spite of this point of the Mandate, the Government of Palestine has not set aside any appreciable area for Jewish colonization during the period covered by the report. Particular reference is made in the report of

Particular reference is made in the report of the Jewish Agency concerning urban colonization in Falestine. The Zionist Organization has assisted and encouraged investments of Jewish capital in various Falestinian enterprises. Detailed labor organizations and the Hadassah, the American Jewish Women's Organization, in the field of medical relief and sanitation in Palestine.

Considerable space in the report is devoted to the Hebrev educational system maintained in Palestine by the Zionist Organization, at an annual cost of 87.474 Egyptian Pounds. The system includes 65 elementary schools, 38 kindergartens, 5 secondary schools, 3 teachers training colleges, 4 technical schools and 5 manual training schools.

Since 1917 the Zionist Organization has collected £3,000,000, nearly all of which was expended in Palestine. During the same period other Jewish bodies have invested £1,500,000 in Palestine.

The report of the Jewish Agency in conclusion directs the attention of the Mandates Commission of the League of Nations to the numerous obstacles the Zionist Organization has encountered in the initial stages of the work of upbuilding Palestine as the Jewish National Homeland. It declares that signs are now visible that Palestine is reentering a period of sustained and many-sided development which will enable the carrying out of a larger and more rapid colinization of the country by Jews. The Zionist Organization, acting as the Jewish Agency, asks the Mandates Commission of the Lesque of Nations that it be left free to embedoment reconstruction of Palestine and the stablishment of the Jewish National Homeland. The report expresses its confidence in the continued goodwill of the Mandatory Power and the League of Nations.

CESSATION OF IMMIGRATION PUTS PHOTOGRAPHERS OUT OF BUSINESS Galleries in Downtown New York, Harlem, the

It is stated that this business recruited its customers largely from newarrivals, pictures being the first thing the newcomer aspires to as the best means of conveying to his relatives abroad his changed economic status and improved appearance.

RABBI ROSENAU ELECTED FOR LIFE BY BALTIMORE TEMPLE

Baltimore, Oct. 20.—Dr. William Rosenau has been made rabbi for life of the Eutaw Place Temple. He already has served the Oheb Shalom Congregation for 32 years. In order to provide for the life tenure, the constitution, which requires that a rabbi he elected for terms of five years, was revised by the congregation at its annual meeting. October 21. This honor also was conferred on Dr. Rosenau's predecessor, the late Dr. Benjamin Szold.

Dr. Rosenau is the author of several Hebraic books and translator of the Book of Esther for the English edition of the Bible issued under the auspices of the Jewish Publication Society of America.

In 1900 Dr. Rosenau received the degree of dector of philosophy from the Johns Holpkins University for special studies in Semitic languages. Immediately after his graduation he was made an instructor at the university, in which he now holds the position of associate in post-Biblical Hebrew. Dr. Rosenau was born May 30, 1863, in Wollstein, Germany, where his father was the cantor of a congregation.

centrating its attacks on Russia and takes them to task for arousing the Jewish masses at this critical moment. It blames the Zeiri Zionists for being silent on all the benefits the Jews have enjoyed under the Soviet rule; the Zeiri Zionists make no mention of the Jewish colonization program which the Soviet Government tries to put into effect and also of the fact that national free-dom was granted to the Jews under Soviet rule. Jews now being allowed to move freely in Russia and not subjected to any exceptional laws as in the time of Czaristic Russia.

Other reports received from Russia further indicate that the process of Ukrainization which has been going on for more than a year has led to the dismissal of almost all Jews who were employed in the various branches of the Government. Even Jewish Communists have now been replaced by Ukrainians and, with the exception of the Cheka the army and civil authorities in Ukrainia have succeeded to free almost every office of Jewish officials. Even to the Jewish Communists this situation has created much consternation and it is in view of these circumstances that the "Emes" expressed its fear of the impression which the progaganda of the Zeiri Zionists is likely to make.

The Ukrainization has been made possible by the fact that Russia was transformed into a federation of states and a large autonomy was granted in the internal affairs to each republic, which is a part of the Sovict 'ederation, leaving in the hands of the Central authorities only the postal telegraph, the army and the Upp (the new political police which is replacing the old Cheka).
