JEWISH COLONIZATION ASSOCIATION FULFILLED PLEDGE TO JEWISH RE-FUGEES AND CANADIAN GOVERNMENT, JEWISH ASSOCIATION PARIS ICA HEADQUARTERS DECLARES

Ica Officials Repudiate Accusations of Irregularities
(Jewish Telegraphic Agency)

Paris, Oct. 27.-The Jewish Colonization Association has fulfilled its pledge to the Russian Jew-ish refugees stranded in Roumania, to the Roumanian Government and to the Canadian Government, it was declared in a statement issued today by the headquarters of the Ica here to the repre-sentative of the Jewish Telegraphic Agency in reply to the accusations made in connection with the recent action of the Canadian Government.

"The information which was published concern-ing the admission of Jewish refugees into Canada ing the admission of Jewish religies into Canada is misleading", the statement says. "The facts are the following. In October, 1923, the Canadian Government granted a special privilege to the Jew-"The facts are ish Colonization Association, allowing it to select on its own responsibility and send to Canada those lewish refugees who were stranded in Roumania. The selection was made under the supervision of a special inspector from Paris who was, for twenty years, chief of the Ica's emigration department in Russia.

"All Jewish emigrants sent to Canada were bonafide refugees. Because of the delay in transportation, the Roumanian Government extended permission to the refugees to remain in the country. The Canadian Immigration office in Bucharest postponed its closing until the end of October owing to this delay.

"The last group of refugees sails from Trieste for Canada on November 3rd and consists of 300 to 400 persons. The Jewish Colonization Association has thus completed the removal of all re-fugees, fulfilling the terms of the agreement with

the Canadian Government.

"Roumain now being cleared of all refugees admissible under the agreement with Canada, the Jewish Colonization Association," the statement Continues, "endeavored to obtain permission to use the remainder of the visas, approximately 2,000, for stranded emigrants. (Continued on Page 4)

25 JEWISH COLONIES WILL BE ESTAB-LISHED DURING 1925 (Jewish Telegraphic Agency)

Moscow, Oct. 27.—During the year 1924-1925, not less than 25 new Jewish colonies, each consisting of 150 families, will be established in the districts to the statement of Mr. Sudarsky, Vice-President of the Central Council of the National Minorities in Ukrainia.

Only the inhabitants of the districts of Kieff, Podol, Tchernigoff and Poltava will be settled in the new colonies. The inhabitants of the other regions will have to await the next distribution of land.

A strip of 6,000 desiatin has been allotted in the district of Mozir for the organization of a number of smaller Jewish settlements.

JEWS IN ENGLAND VOTE NOT AS JEWS BUT AS ENGLISHMEN

Will Vote Against Anti-Semitic Candidates, Regarding Anti-Semitism Bad For the Country. (Jewish Telegraphic Agency)

London, Oct. 27 .- "The Jews of Great Britain as a community have no particular sympathy for any

of the political parties; they vote not as Jews, but as Englishmen", declared Mr. Henriques, President of the Board of Jewish Deputies at its monthly meeting.

In wishing success to the various members of the Board who are now seeking election to Parliament, President Henriques stated, "There is no occasion for a Jewish vote in Great Britain. The Jews of England have no particular grievances, enjoying absolute freedom and, having the franchise, it is their duty to use it for the general welfare of the country, as well as their own welfare.

"The best evidence that there is no particular

Jewish vote in the country is the fact that the Jewish candidates are distributed almost equally among the three political parties which represent

Answering the question as to what should be the attitude of the Jews in a constituency where the attitude of the Jews in a constituency where the candidate is anti-Semitic, President Henriques stated that if the voters regard anti-Semitism as bad for the country, they are entitled to vote against the candidate.

MEXICAN JEWISH ORGANIZATIONS WILL ISSUE STATEMENT ON IMMIGRATION POSSIBILITIES

Call Mass Meeting to Consider Problem (Special Despatch to the Jewish Daily Bulletin)

Mexico City, Oct. 27 .- Steps with regard to the spreading of correct information as to the possi-bilities for Jewish immigration into Mexico have been taken by a number of local Jewish organizations as a result of the fantastic rumors circulated in America and Europe.

That "it is necessary to inform Jews who plan That "it is necessary to inform fews who plan to emigrate to Mexico of the true conditions existing in this country" was the unanimous resolution adopted at the mass meeting of the principal organizations of Western Jews held here. The mass meeting elected a Committee consisting of two representatives of each organization. The Committee was charged with the task of preparing a statement of immigration possibilities to be published in the press of Europe and America. The draft of the statement is to be submitted to each

organization.

JEWISH DEPUTIES WILL SUBMIT STATE-MENT ON JEWISH QUESTION IN POLAND

ment that in its new attitude toward the National Minorities in the country, it would like to see the Jewish question settled, but is prevented from doing so because the Jewish representation in the Parliament is not united on the question.

CLEARING HOUSE NEEDED TO INVESTI-GATE BREACHES OF JEWISH "MINORI-TIES RIGHTS," SAYS JUDGE MACK Jewish Congress Discusses Problem of European Jews

"There is an absolute need of some central Jewish bureau at which complaints could be registered, -through which these complaints could be investigated and the necessary steps taken for their disposal,—a sort of clearing-house, particularly for the investigation and righting of alleged wrongs committed in connection with the Minority Rights Treaties", was the burden of Judge Mack's re-marks in reporting to the Executive Committee of the American Jewish Congress his observations of the last sessions of the Committee of Jewish Delegations held in Carlsbad.

Judge Mack further asked that the American Jewish Congress obligate itself in addition to moral support and co-operation, to a subvention of

Preceding Judge Mack's report, Dr. Stephen S. Wise, President of the American Jewish Congress, who presided over the meeting, submitted a report of the Congress's activities during the past six months. Dr. Wise summarized his report by saying, "Our work in aiding in the securing of an asylum in Canada for five thousand of our homeless wandering brethren; our fight against the Klan which is finally beginning to bear fruit; our intervention with Prince Bibesco, the Roumanian Ambassador, against the Jewish excesses in that country; our efforts in ameliorating the Salonica Sunday discriminatory law; the placing on the pre-

erence quota list of the immigrants now stranded in the various European ports and concentration camps due to the enactment of the Johnson Bill; and, finally, our contribution towards initiating the call for the creation of the Emergency Com-mittee on Jewish Refugees, that has set as its task the solving of the whole tragic problem of Jewish immigration—present a record of accomplishments to which we can point with just pride."

The Refugees Must Be Taken to Palestine

Recurring again to the subject of the stranded refugees in the European ports which is occupying much space in the Yiddish press, the Day, of Oct. 24, says that an effort must be made to settle the refugees in Palestine.

"The question as to who is to be blamed for Canada's decision to bar further immigration of refugees to her shores does not interest the refugees. Whether the trouble was caused by the Ica or by the Jews of the U.S. or by the Government of Canada does not help to alleviate the situation. The refugees ask: What shall we do now?

"The only ones who can give an answer to this question are the Ica and the other organizations that assumed the responsibility for the refugees when the agreement with Canada was made.

"Canada has locked her doors to the refugees. Where can they go? There is at present only one hope for the Jews and that is, Palestine. The Jews have a right to demand that Palestine be kept wide open for the unfortunate refugees. "Undoubtedly the Palestine Government will not

shut the refugees out, even though her coloniza-tion policy is opposed to this. There are times when programs and policies of state must be ig-nored to make room for ordinary humanity.

The refugees must be taken to Palestine and settled there. The Jews of America must help to carry this through. It was partly the passive attitude of American Jewry that caused the closing of Canada's doors to the refugees. Now is the time for them to do their bounden duty."

PRESIDENT COOLIDGE PRAISES JEWIS PHILANTHROPY IN RADIO SPEECH TO **JEWISH** FEDERATION DINNER

\$500,000 Raised At Table to Cover Federation Deficit

"The Jewish people have always and everywhere been particularly devoted to the idea of taking care of their own,' declared President Calvin Coolidge, in his speech over the radio, addressing the \$100 dinners given by the Federation to Support Jewish Philanthropies in the City of New York at the Pennsylvania and Waldorf-Astoria

Hotels Sunday night.

"This federation is one of the monuments to their independence and self-reliance. They have sought to protect and preserve that wonderful inheritance of tradition, culture, literature and religion which has placed the world under so many obligations to them. In their efforts to serve their highest ideals they will always be helpful to the wider community of which they are a part. In the work of this federation they are rendering a service not only to their own people, but to the entire community. Along with that precious service they are settling up an example of successful, practical, helpful business administration which deserves all original dusiness administration which deserves an commendation. It may well be an inspiration to every charitable institution of the land.

"I want you to know that I feel that you are

making good citizens, that you are strengthening the Government, that you are demonstrating the supremacy of the spiritual life and helping establish the Kingdom of God on earth."

The cover charge for the dinner was \$100; every \$100 went intact into the treasury of the Federation, the expense of the dinner being defrayed entirely by an anonymous donator. The keynote speech was delivered by Mortimer

Amsterdam International Adopts Important Resolutions on Emigration and Immigration Problem (Cable letter from our Amsterdam Correspondent, B. de Vries)

Amsterdam, Oct. 27.-Important resolutions concerning immigration and emigration problems of workers were adopted by the Emigration Confer-ence of the National Federation of Trade Unions ence of the National receration of Irade Unions held recently at Prague. Thirty-seven delegates, representing Austria, Belgium, Czecho-Slovakia, Denmark, France, Germany, Holland, Hungary, Italy and Palestine, were present. Special attention was given to the emigration of Jewish work-The Conference adopted the following resolution:

The Conference instructs the Executive of the I. F. T. U. to continue its research into this ques-tion, in order that a final solution may be reached as soon as possible.

In the meantime, the Conference considers that

the following measures are necessary:

1. The organization of the international labor

market by regulating emigration and immigration. 2. Agreements between the various trade union national centres which are interested in the question, under the supervision of the I. F. T. U

The establishment of equality of treatment of all workers, without distinction of nationality.

4. The conclusion of mutual agreements between countries of immigration and countries of emigration, these agreements laying down the rights and duties of the workers' organizations in these countries.

Compulsory membership of immigrant workers in the organizations of the countries of immi-

6. The collection of the I. F. T. U. of all the material obtainable on this question, and the dis-

tribution of this material to the affiliated countries by the I. F. T. U. in its publications.

7. The establishment in every country of national and district joint bodies, which shall undertake to regulate the recruiting and enigrating of workers: labor delegates must be appointed on these bodies.

8. The creation of an international office for

Immigration and Emigration, which shall be competent to collect information and to give advice in all proposals for regulating emigration.

This international office should be connected

with the International Labor Office.

In view of the urgency of the problem, the Con-ference calls upon the Executive of the I. F. T. U. to use the utmost despatch in settling the ques-tion, so that the national federations may have an opportunity of expressing their views, and some future conference may be able :-

a) to lay down guiding principles for regulating

emigration and immigration;

b) to determine the constitution of the various bodies created to carry out the regulations."
