GERMAN ANTI-SEMITES PLANT RACE HATRED IN CEMETERIES

Erect Swastica Instead of Crosses on Graves. (Jewish Telegraphic Agency)

Frankfurt, Nov. 18.-The cross as a memorial to the departed is no longer popular with the German anti-Semites; instead of the symbol of Christianity, the swastica-two hooks crossing each other—the emblem of the anti-Semitic movement. is now being placed on the new graves in the Frankfurt cemetery, according to reports in the local press. ### LITHUANIAN JEWRY OFFERS FOR PREVENTION OF SUNDAY CLOSING BILL

Kovno, Nov. 18.—The call issued by the Kovno Rabbinate to the Jewish population of Lithuania's capital to observe yesterday as a day of fast, prayer and protest against the Sunday Closing Bill met with a ready response on the part of the Jewish population of Kovno.

All Jewish stores were closed. Thousands gathered in the synagogues and offered fervent prayers for the prevention of the bill which threatens their economic existence. The Rabbis delivered sermons on the subject. Open meetings were held near the synagogues.

Special police despatches were assigned to keep order; several arrests were made. Similar protests were held in the provincial towns

### JEWS IN MEXICO HOLD HIGH POSITIONS (Jewish Telegraphic Agency)

Mexico, Nov. 18.-The number of high posts held by Jews in all branches is surprising in comparison with the total number of Jews in the capital city. One of the labor leaders, Roberto Haberman, is a Roumanian Jew; the doctor of psychology who has been establishing a new system of mental testing in the government prisons is a Russian Jew, David Boder; the man who taught half of Mexico, recently dead, Francisco Rivas, was a Mexican Jew. There are Jewish musicians, Iewish actors, Iewish journalists, detectives, manufacturers, farmers, promoters, bankers.

That, although the immigration is a recent thing, it is a thorough one, is proved by a slightly more than superficial survey of the present status of the foreigners in Mexico. That it is not a commercial one can not be doubted in view of the fact that the overwhelming majority of the immigrant Jews are trained industrially or professionally.

According to figures made public today by the Department of State, 1,496 visas have already been granted to quota immigrants from Poland. There still remain 4,486 to fill Poland's quota. European and Asiatic Russia has received 698

### "SIR HERBERT SAMUEL QUARTER" TO BE BUILT IN HAIFA

Jerusalem, Oct. 27.—The "Sir Herbert Samuel Quarter Company" which was formed in 1919 by a number of Roumanian Jews has up to the pres-ent purchased 3,350 dunam of land to the south of Mount Carmel for the establishment of the quar-ter. Fifty houses will be built there.

### DAILY DIGEST OF WORLD PUBLIC OPINION ON JEWISH MATTERS

### Considers Reorganization of New York "Kehillah" Unnecessary

The reorganization of the defunct "Kehillah" of New York, according to a resolution adopted at a conference of Jewish organizations called to gether by the American Jewish Congress, would be a waste of energy, in the opinion of Mr. J. Fishman, who writes on the subject in the "Jewish Morning Journal" of Nov. 17.

"It must be born in mind that when it comes to charity New York has its Federation, and as regards religion, neither the orthodox nor the reform elements will permit themselves to be led by a few individuals who are active in the American Jewish Congress.

"Excluding charity and religion what is a 'Ke-hillah' needed for? Of course we could have a 'Kehillah' for 'resolutions', but it is not worth our while to waste our efforts to create an organization for such a purpose.'

### Blames Jewish Masses

Dr. K. Fornberg states his opinion, in an article which appears in the "Day" of Nov. 17, that the Jewish millionaires are not the only ones to be blamed for the failure of the "Ort" to collect up to date even half of the sum it set out to secure in this country for its work of reconstructing the Jewries of eastern Europe.

"The truth must be said," writes Dr. Fornberg "If the Jewish millionaires deserve to be criticized for remaining indifferent to the conditions which pervail among the Jewries of Eastern Europe, the masses, the so-called "democracy", together with their leaders and spokesmen, deserve not only criticism but chastisement. What has become of

triticism but chastrserient. What has become of the feeling, well-meaning, conscious Jewish masses in America?

"A dreadful apathy and callousness toward Jewish matters prevails in every class of American Jewry, from the wealthy element to the broad masses. This is an actual national disease, an epidemic which spares no class nor element of our people. It is well to take notice of this.

### Calls Ford "International Well-Poisoner"

"The Day" (Nov. 17) after asserting editorially that there are numerous evidences to prove that Henry Ford was directly or indirectly associated with the Mantchu murder in Roumania, the "Awakening Magyars" movement in Hungary, the Hitler organization in Bavaria and the Rosenbluth case in the United States, says:

"If Ford were a poor man he would have been made harmless long ago, but being a multi-millioraire he is allowed to pursue with impunity his ac-tivities as an international well-poisoner and inciter to pogroms. Ford is a blotch of disgrace on the name of America today."

#### CREATE ORGAN FOR ANTI-ZIONIST PROPAGANDA IN EGYPT

Brazilian Jews Threatened with Ruin By Revolution

(Br Our Brazilian Correspondent, Shinin Pester)

Rio de Janeiro, Oct. 27.-The recent developpents in the political and economic fields in Brazil have had their reaction on the condition of the less here. It is therefore worth while to glance as few outstanding facts.
Brazil is now undergoing

a severe economic Brail is now undergoing a severe economic mis; the exchange has dropped, government mests have been cut down and, in addition to this we have had a very hard winter which de-Alongstored a tremendous amount of crops. sayou a nemericular annount of crops. Along-ist of these things, the military revolt in Sao Palo has aggravated the economic depression to a unbarable degree.

With regard to the Sao Paulo revolt it must be winted out that this is not a political issue betreen the Left and Right, or an attempt of one if the parties in the struggle to gain the sympa-ties of the Brazilian masses. The conflict which igging on between the government and the revobinists is purely an economic one. The indusmilists aim to oust the agrarians from power. The epitalists wish to industrialize Brazil in order that it may be less dependent on foreign capitalis and to do this they find it necessary to secure complete control of the government. But it is not the interests of the agrarian class to let politics all into the hands of the industrialists because they are constantly in need of cheap labor, which the industrialists are taking away from them, and haides, it pays for them, in general, to control and must government. In the course of the past in years the agrarians have been in the seat of over and their unscrupulous policy has been such

that the country actually became impoverished.

These are the real causes for the conflict between the two parties. One party believes that the agrarians have filched enough money from the polic treasury and the other believes that the indistrialists should be kept away from control of politics in order to preserve the present convenient

state of affairs.

During the entire time that Sao Paulo was under segs, commercial and business activities in the apital were paralyzed. Conditions reached such actitical point that at one time, when an English timer made its appearance, it was greatly feared but there would be an intervention of foreign joners, owing to which the bankers of Brazil conented a secret sabotage against the government ad the latter was forced immediately after captring Sao Paulo to declare a moratorium.

# ANGLO-FRENCH LEGAL AGREEMENT TO BE APPLIED TO PALESTINE (Jewish Telegraphic Agency Mail Service)

Jerusalem, Nov. 3.—The application to Palestine of the Anglo-French Agreement respecting legal proceedings in civil and commercial matters was secured as a result of an exchange of notes be-

tween Great Britain and France.

By this Agreement communications from French Courts will be accompanied by translations in English, except when they issue from a court in a French Colony where the court employs Arabic, in which case they will be transmitted in that language.

The Agreement went into effect on March 22, 1923, but until further notice will not affect the existing arrangement between Palestine and Syria

regarding the same matters.

#### ARCHAEOLOGICAL DISCOVERIES MAD AT MACHANAIM

Jerusalem.—Ine works at Machanaim in the cave, in which an archaeological discovery winde recently, have been carried out by Mess I. Ben-Zvi and L. Sukenik, under the direction Professor Slousch, acting on behalf of the Jewi Archaeological Society, to which the works we delivered by the Government.

Three rooms have been discovered inside, as in them seven tombs with ossuaries, most of the untouched.
