COMMISSION PERMANENT MANDATES REPORT ON PALESTINE IN FINAL TEXT

DOES NOT DIFFER FROM DRAFT Deals At Greater Length With Immigration Prob-lem; Does Not Mention Jewish Achievement in len; Does Not Mention Jewish Achievement in Reconstruction Work, But Makes Reference to Petition of Arab Executive—Commission Sees No Necessity for League Action With Regard to Arab Complaints.

(Jewish Telegraphic Agency)

Geneva, Dec. 5.-The representative of the Jewish Telegraphic Agency again had occasion to see the text of the report of the Permanent Mandates Commission of the League of Nations in the final printed form in which it will be submitted to the League's Council at the meeting in Rome on December 8

The final text of the report differs very slightly, only in its wording and not in its substance, from ony in its wording and not in its substance, from the original draft which was published November 21 by the Jewish Telegraphic Agency. The report of the Permanent Mandates Commission makes no reference to the report of the Jewish Agency as submitted to it by Dr. Chaim Weizmann, nor does the final form of the report refer to the Lewish reconstruction work in Palestine. to the Jewish reconstruction work in Palestine and its achievements in the last seven years.

The final text places more emphasis than the original draft on the problem of immigration, which it describes as the dominant issue in the present situation of Palestine. The report contains the phrase used originally in the draft with regard to Jewish immigration into Palestine and says, "The stream of Jewish immigration from Eastern Furope provides Palestine with a new population which, however great their ardor, Zionist zeal and their desire to contribute toward the establishment of the Jewish National Home, they are as a general rule not prepared either by training or family tradition for manual work, especially agricultural work, of which Palestine is in greatest need at the present time."

A slight change was made in the final report in describing the conflict between the Jews and Arabs in Palestine. While the original draft described the situation as "a clash of interests which inevitably brings Zionism and the majority of the Arab element into conflict on the subject of imnigration, etc.", the final report reads as follows:
"The divergencies which bring Zionism and the

majority of the Arab element into conflict, etc." The report in its slightly changed form goes on to say, "If the discontent in Palestine and this state of affairs cannot be denied, the Commission wishes to state expressly that it is not attributable. to the representative of the mandatory power in Palestine, who faithfully discharges the two-fold duty which was imposed by the Mandate."

The final form of the Mandates Commission report on Palestine dwells at greater length on the immigration question and states that "immigraimmigration question and states that (Continued on Page 4)

(Jewish Telegraphic Agency) Jerusalem, Dec. 5.—The Palestine Government has informed the Executive of the Christian Moslem Association, in reply to a request on its part, that when the Council of the League of Nations report to the mandatory power is published, the Government will arrange for a complete translation of the report into Arabic and Hebrew. A copy of the report will be sent to the Arab Executive and to the press.

SENSATIONAL REVELATIONS IN STEIGER TRIAL WILL LEAD TO HIS VINDICATION Member of Ruthenian Secret Organization Reveals Bomb Conspirators.

(Jewish Telegraphic Agency)

Lemberg, Dec. 5.—The accusation against Stan-islaw Steiger which threatened to become the Drevfus affair of Poland, was finally proved to be without foundation, according to a report published to-day in the Polish liberal paper, "Wiek Nowy." The actual throwers of the bomb have been discovered, belonging, as was previously reported, to a Ruthenian military organization of Eastern Galicia.

Warsaw, Dec. 5 .- Sensational revelations with regard to the throwing of the bomb at the President of the Polish Republic, Mr. Wojciechowski, during his last visit to Lemberg, were made today by two Jewish deputies from Eastern Galicia before the

The revelations were based on the information of a Ruthanian who was formerly a member of the Ruthenian youth terroristic organization, the name of which is not known. He named as the perperator of the conspiracy a Ruthenian, Pantschischin. Members of the same Ruthenian terroristic organization were responsible for the ex-plosion at the University of Warsaw and in the Warsaw Citadel a year ago which caused great loss of life and property.

## "LONDON TIMES" URGES PROHIBITION OF JEWISH IMMIGRATION INTO ENGLAND

(Jewish Telegraphic Agency)

London, Dec. 5.—The "London Times" published an article yesterday, urging that East European Jewish inmigrants be prohibited from entering England, giving as the reason that typhus, favus and trachoma are prevalent in Russia, the border states and in the East European ghettos.

The paper further cives a number of arcuments.

The paper further gives a number of arguments of an anti-Semitic nature and declares that another reason for this prohibition is the fact that tuberculosis is prevalent among the Jewish population in the East End of London. "Although the Jew is less susceptible to tuberculosis, he is, however, more exposed to this disease by reason of the special Jewish trades, particularly tailoring. The Jews suffer from nervous diseases and hysteria as evidenced in the London air raids during the war", the paper asserts.

## ARABS PROTEST AGAINST AFULEH INCIDENT (Jewish Telegraphic Agency)

Jerusalem, Dec. 5 .- A formal protest against the incident at Afuleh where Jews and Arabs clashed over the right of the Jewish workmen to plough land there, was submitted today to the Palestine Government by the Arab Executive. Arab members of Beisan are preparing to hold

a peaceful protest demonstration in connection with the incident.

## IBN SAUD'S MECCA CONFERENCE A

## FIND PALACE OF FIRST KINGS OF BABYLON

#### First Babylonian Rulers Were Not Semites But Sumerians, Prof. Langdon Asserts.

(Jewish Daily Bulletin Despatch) Chicago, Dec. 2.-The Field Museum-Oxford

Cincago, Dec. 2—The Pieta Aussemi-Oxford University expedition excavating the ruins of Kish has discovered what is believed to be the palace of the first Kings of Babylon, according to word received by D. C. Davies, director of the museum, from Prof. S. Langdon, Assyriologist, head of the expedition

Inasmuch as the palace has never been built over, it proved to be the oldest architectural structure ever found in the Near East, according to Langdon. It is in a remarkable state of pre-

servation.

The vast structure was built of the earliest known type of brick. After uncovering the outer walls the excavators found a magnificent brick stairway, flanked by a great wall and built into alcoves.

Near it was an equally imposing colonnade of brick pillars, running east and west before the throne room. Inscriptions showed that these throne formed the front of a court wherein the king or wise men of the palace decided disputes and legal

Around the throne room itself were many exquisitely worked plaques arranged in a great frieze, depicting expeditions of the first Kings to subdue foreign cities. They showed in clear detail the dress and laces of the kings, who are now conclusively proven to have been not Semites, but Sumerians, Langdon asserted.

Both kings and prisoners had round heads, and their lips and cheeks were shaven. The axis of the eye, moreover, was outward and downward, instead of norizontal as in the Semites.

Other plaques depicted cattle being brought home and milked. The quality of the inlaying and engraving revealed the Sumerians as masters of

those arts.

Near the throne itself was found the earliest bit of pictograph writing ever discovered, which was spoken of in earlier reports from Langdon. It contained drawings of heads and hands and, in effect, made up a list of slaves in the palace, with notes by scribes about those who were absent.

#### DAILY DIGEST OF PUBLIC OPINION ON JEWISH MATTERS

Christian Clergymen Becoming Aware of Anti-Semilism in America The "Day" of Dec. 4 writes editorially about

the fact that some Christian clergymen are wak-ing up to the fact that anti-Semitism has become a problem in the United States, as evidenced by some utterances at the fifth annual conference of the Federation of Churches which is being held at Atlanta.

"It would really be well for the clergymen who belong to the Federation of Churches to stop and give serious consideration to the growth of anti-Semitism in America, as they formulate it, and

to the methods for counteracting it.
They should also remember that they are them-

selves partly to blame for the growth of anti-Semitism. What is the Klan movement if not Protestant clericalism? Who has inspired the Klan if not the various Protestant ministers, especially in the small towns and cities? It is they who preach intolerance, who thunder against everything which is 'foreign'.
"We are glad to see that the American clergy

men are becoming aware of anti-Semitism in this ocuntry. But would it not be appropriate that they should invite to their conference a number of representative Jews? Would it not be highly interesting and instructive for the designment of the conference at the state of the conference of the co ish point of view and the Jewish proposals for solving this problem?"

The new bill proposes to withdraw all concessions granted to private persons for the purpose of carrying on trade in monopolized articles in favor of Polish disabled war veterans.

During the discussions of the bill, the Jewish deputies proposed that instead of withdrawing the concessions, taxes be imposed on the concessionaires in favor of the disabled veterans. The motion was, however, rejected. The matter was the subject of discussion at a special meeting of the club of Jewish deputies, which decided to take up the matter with the Government.

## PERMANENT MANDATES COMMISSION REPORT ON PALESTINE IN FINAL TEXT DOES NOT DIFFER FROM DRAFT

tion into Palestine has been going on, not always in accordance with the proportion, the capacity and the country's possibilities for economic absorption. The immigrants have not always been allocated with regard to the agricultural, commercial and industrial needs of Palestine. The Commission, therefore, desires to receive in the next report of the Mandatory Power full information with regard to the number, race, vocations and places of origin of the immigrants and particularly figures which will show what occupations have been adopted by the immigrants of the preceding year."

A new feature in the final form of the Commis-A new reature in the limit form of the Commission's report on Palestine is its reference to the petition of the Executive of the Christian Moslem Association of Palestine, commonly called the Palestine Arab Executive. The petition of the Arab Executive is, in fact, the only petition mentioned in any report on the mandate countries which were examined at the last meeting of the Permanent

Mandates Commission.

With regard to this petition of the Arab Executive, the final report of the Permanent Mandates Commission states, "It contains two kinds of com-Commission states, it comeans two founds to complaints which it is necessary to saparate clearly. It alleges, first, a great number of facts, which, if found accurate, are abuses of the Palestine Administration. Secondly, the petition protests against the terms of the Palestine Mandate itself, which the Commission does not feel competent to discuss. Regarding the first category the Commission, after hearing the explanations of Sir Herbert Samuel, who contended that the facts in the Arab petition were inaccurate, is of the opinion that there is no need for it to recommend the League Council to take any action in the matter. If, however, the petitioners wish to raise any specific point the commission will be ready to consider it," the report concludes.

The representative of the Jewish Telegraphic Agency learns that the report of the Permanent Mandates Commission is not the final text of the report which will have to be received by the Mandatory Power. According to the arrangements of the mandates system, the Council of the League of Nations may make any alterations which it deems

The petition of the Arab Executive submitted to the Permanent Mandates Commission concluded

with the following:

"The Palestine Arabs met this oppressive policy with patience. Their opposition has been conducted on constitutional methods. But this attitude of theirs has been both misrepresented by the Government and misunderstood by the Mandatory. The daily slight irictions between Arab and Jew, whose ideas, principles, customs and modes of life take diametrically divergent lines cultivate and solidfy hatred between both communities, and there must come a time when it will accumulate to such a de-

mitted all data to the Minister of the Interior who instructed the Lemberg Chief of Police to start an investigation which led to important discoveries. Pantschischin was found in a Polish military hospital at Kalisz in the department for venereal diseases. He confirmed all the details of the revelaof the bomb at the Polish President. Pantschischin is now under arrest. The Minister of Justice, as a result of the investigation, instructed the Lemberg State Attorney to submit all documents on the Steiger case to Warsaw immediately.

The revelations and the subsequent development which will lead to the complete vindication of Steiger and the accusation against the Jews have aroused great interest. Further developments are expected.

As will be recalled the military court in Lemberg, while considering the Steiger trial, was compelled to withhold its verdict and transfer the case to the District Civil Court because of a communication of the secret Ruthenian military organization, published in the Jewish paper, "Schwila" on the day the verdict was to be rendered, that not Steiger but members of the Ruthenian organization were responsible for the throwing of the bomb.
