LORD BALFOUR RESENTS ACTION OF LEAGUE COUNCIL ON PALESTINE MANDATE REPORT

Says Jews in Palestine Have Done Marvelously
Well Since Declaration.
(Jewish Telegraphic Agency)

London, Dec. 13.-Lord Balfour, the author of the Declaration of November 2, 1917, was the first of the great world leaders to comment upon the attitude of the Council of the League of Nations in adopting the report of the Permanent Man-

in adopting the report of the Permanent Man-dates Commission regarding Palestine.

In an interview he granted today to Mr. Her-man Bernstein, well-known American Jewish journalist and editor of the New York "Jewish Tribune", he stated, "I wonder whether the gentle-men of the Council of the League of Nations have given thought to the question of what would be-come of the unfortunate Jews in Eastern Europe who were so dreadfully affected by the economic boycott and other persecutions, without a Jewish National Home in Palestine."

"Within the brief period since the Declaration, the Jews in Palestine have done marvelously well: A few years ago Palestine was a barren and neglected country. It was negligible both economically and industrially. Now the country is beginning to thrive with new industries and new life. I understand that Jewish manufacturers of Lodz, the center of the textile industry in Poland, are

about to establish a textile industry in Palestine" Lord Balfour stated.

tendency among American Jews to intermarry with Christians and to forsake the traditions of their race for modern American manners and customs is among the evils which are threatening the Jewish race today, Dr. Charles W. Eliot, mierty-year old president emeritus of Harvard, told the American Zionist Society here today.

"I have noticed with regret", said Dr. Eliot, "the increasing tendency of Jews to marry Christians. I have had a long observation of such intermarriage between people who are not kindred, and I have never known them to turn out well. I hope that you Jews will consider that."

In substantiating his theories, Dr. Eliot spoke of the immigration of the Irish to America, declaring that the Irish "have never been assimilated in America, anywhere," and that "it is not desirable that they should be

"Americans don't expect to assimilate any for-eign peoples, even the Jews. It seems that non-assimilation is better for the future of the nation. "During the last few years I have several times had occasion to visit New York. There I have noticed among young Jewish people a distinct falling away from the customs of their fathers and mothers. While attending a luncheon at Columha not long ago I saw six young Jewish persons, three men and three women, seize the table next to mine and order dishes which seemed to be selected for the sole purpose of showing that they were no longer conforming to Jewish methods of serving food. Pork was one of the dishes ordered,

as I remember.

"In addition, their conversation partook of the spirit of their orders, and showed an abandonment of the laws and customs of their ancestors. This tendency is unfortunate not only for Jewish This tendency is units tander and the people. It sets a bad example for all of us", Dr. Eliot said.

Dr. Eliot also said that the physical condition

of the Jewish race has become poor, largely be-cause through persecution they had not been allowed to take up what he termed "muscular occu-pations" in many countries.

In this connection, he indorsed the Zionist movement, and stated that he believed the Jewish race should have in Palestine at least one place where they can "put their backs against the wall and face all-comers, if comers there be—a place where they can recover some of the qualities which they have lost during their long years of suffering in many lands. It will give them an opportunity to practice the muscular trades, such as agriculture and carpentry, from which the Jews have been excluded for centuries."

The Jewish Artists in Vienna

(By Our Vienna Correspondent, M. Tenenblatt) Vienna, Dec. 1 .- The bad economic conditions

have become almost like a permanent feature in Austria. We are having what might be termed a chronic crisis here and there has even been created a considerable literature on this subject, We also have a literature on our indigence. musical pieces composed on this unfortunate eco-nomic state of ours. A popular song which one can hear in every cabaret and vaudeville now-adays runs something like this: "I have no money, you have no money and we're all broke!"
Under such terrible economic conditions there

are, naturally, no art collectors and connisseurs, so that to be an artist here is equivalent to starv-

The Jewish artists in Vienna are worse off than anybody else. Vienna is the city where one could always find Jewish artists of international reputation, and during the war they succeeded in getting their share of the prosperity which for some time prevailed here owing to the rise of the currency. There were many individual Jews who amassed considerable fortunes and of course when a Jew-ish "nouveau riche" buys works of art it is unavoidable, so to say, that a few Jewish motifs should creep in among the other canvasses. In those days, therefore, the Jewish artists did quite a little business. But today their condition is a little business. But today their continuous aworse than ever and valuable canvasses of Professor Yehuda Epstein, Lazar Krestin, Wilhelm Wachtel and others remain unsold. A few individual Jewish artists had earned enough before to make it possible for them to endure the present to make a possible for mean to endure the present state of poverty and will probably be in a position to tide over another few years in comparative security. But the majority of them are in bad straits and cannot extricate themselves from the unbearable situation.

You visit Krestin's or Wachtel's studies, for instance, and you are overwhelmed by the number and brilliance of their canvasses. All these are recent creations. Krestin's studies and portraits have enjoyed an international reputation for years now. His work multiplies rapidly for he is as energetic and industrious as a bee. But he subsists these days largely on the spiritual satisfaction of his varied and rich creations. He paints ten new canvasses before he succeeds in selling one. All the praise and commendation of the best critics is of no avail. There is a dearth of money in Vienna and there is nothing for it but to starve if one happens to be an artist.

Wilhelm Wachtel is just as badly off as Krestin. Recently he spent several months in Palestine and the Orient where he gave free play to his phan-tasy and his pencil which resulted in a collection of two score or so of canvasses of wonderful vigor and originality; landscapes and portraits of the new Palestine which should be a treasured possession not only in private homes but likewise in art galleries and museums.

The creative spirit of the artists does not rest even though the wolf is knocking at their door. Some of them have gone to America in search of better luck. But have American Jews time to sit for portraits?

MOSLEM SUPREME COUNCIL ENDEAVORS TO PREVENT SALE OF LAND IN PALESTINE TO JEWS

Jerusalem, Nov. 24 .- The negotiations which have been going on recently regarding the sale of lands to Jews at Aglil and Al Haram have been suspended owing to the intervention of the Supreme Moslem Council, states the "Falastin," the official organ of the Palestine Arab Executive. organ or the Palestine Arab Executive. The sits-pension is due to the decision of the Supreme Moslem Council not to proceed with the settle-ment of the questions relating to the Walfe lands in the nighborhood, and until this matter is set-

The "Falastin" declares that the Al Amari family has already received from the Jews £3,000 in advance, on condition that if the land is not transadvance, on condition that it the land is not trans-ferred to the intending purchasers by the date fixed, the Al Amari family is to pay £15,000 in default. "As the sale has not been completed in time," the "Falastin" continues, "the Al Amari family will now have to pay the £15,000 forfeit money, which it is unable to do. This will mean the land coming up for auction, and as there are no purchasers in the market but the Jews, the land will fall to the Jews in any case."

GERMAN ANTI-SEMITISM ORIGINATES IN UNIVERSITIES, VISITOR SAYS

"German anti-Semitism is principally propagated by the German Universities", stated Mr. Jacques Sonneborn, who arrived in New York on a visit to this country from Hamburg, Germany. "Sev-enty-five per cent of the faculty and students of these universities are pursuing an anti-Semitic policy."

Mr. Sonneborn attributes this to the role played in German national life by the students of German universities, since it is from this body of young men that the officer class of the German Army is principally recruited. The policy of the German military authorities has been extremely anti-Semi-tic in its exclusion of Jews from the officer class of the German army.

FINAL CONSONANTS OF HEBREW ALPHA BET WILL BE DECLARED CONTRA-REVOLUTIONARIES

Moscow, Dec. 13.-The economic structure and the system of government were not the only pillars of society which were shaken by the Bolshevik revolution. In the course of their reign, the Balshevik reformists also touched the field of philology. The first victims of this reform were the six distinct letters of the old Slavic and Russian languages which have disappeared from Russaan nanguages which have disappeared from Russian spelling and pronunciation on the command of the Bolshevik rulers. The "tverdyi Znack", the "Miaghki Znack", the "Yath", the "Phita", the short e and the half e were banished from use in

Russian prints.
These discarded letters will soon find themselves in the excellent company of some of the aristoin the excellent company of some of the aristo-crats of the ancient Hebrew alphabet which will also be declared contra-revolutionary if the Jew-ish Philological Commission of Moscow has its

The Commission decided to eliminate the final letters, such as, final "Khoff", final "Mem", final "Nun", final "Phei" and final "Zadi", from the Hebrew alphabet.

STATE CHARITIES CHALLENGES LEGAL STATUS OF JEWISH ORPHANAGE

Charges that Justice Aaron J. Levy of the Superme Court is operating an orphan asylum without authority, from the State were made at the meeting of the State Board of Charities. Justice Levy is president of the Hebrew National Orphan House, which owns property

House, which owns property at 507 Tuckahoe Road, Yonkers, where 260 children are housed. Dr. Lee Frankel, vice-president of the Metropolitan Life Insurance Company, and chairman of the special committee of the State Board of Charities, reported that the charter under which Justice Levy's orphanage was being operated had been issued only to a religious organization for the purpose of holding religious services, and contained no permit to conduct an institution for the care of children.

The orphanage receives no public funds, but nine teachers from the New York City Board of Education are assigned to it, as an annex of Public School 7. The property is valued at about \$200,000.

The need for temporary shelters for children whose parents are ill is still felt, according to Mr. Frankel. It was intimated that Justice Levy might be permitted to transform his orphanage into such a temporary shelter. It was also sug-gested that he would join the Federation for the Support of Jewish Philanthropic Societies.

HEAD OF JEWISH INSURANCE COMPANY LEAVES FOR PALESTINE

Mr. Nathan Chasan, Nasi of the Order Sons of Zion, is leaving for Palestine to direct the Judea Insurance Company, Ltd., of Palestine, which has its headquarters in Jerusalem. Mr. Chasan will assume the directorship, representing the Judea Industrial Corporation which has organized the first Jewish Insurance Company.
Mr. Jacob Miller of Detroit is leaving with Mr.

Chasan. He will act as general manager for the company.
